Thank you for consulting w ith Scottish Water regarding the above activity.

Drinking Water Protected Areas

A review of our records indicates that the proposed activity falls w ithin a drinking w ater catchment w here a Scottish Water abstraction is located. Scottish Water abstractions are designated as Drinking Water Protected Areas (DWPA) under Article 7 of the Water Framework Directive. The River Tay supplies Perth Gow ans Terrace Water Treatment Works (WTW) and it is essential that w ater quality and w ater quantity in the area are protected. In the event of an incident occurring that could affect Scottish Water we should be notified w ithout delay using the Customer Helpline number **0800 0778 778**.

It is a relatively large catchment and the activity is sufficient distance from the intake that it is likely to be low risk, how ever care should be taken and w ater quality proection measures must be implemented

In addition to meeting the UK Forestry Standard (UKFS) and Forests and Water Guidelines, we would request that the "Guidance on Forestry Activities Near SW Assets" is taken into account. Scottish Water have also produced a list of precautions for a range of activities. This details protection measures to be taken w ithin a DWPA, the wider drinking w ater catchment and if there are assets in the area. Please note that site specific risks and mitigation measures w ill require to be assessed and implemented. These documents and other supporting information can be found on the activities w ithin our catchments page of our w ebsite at www.scottishwater.co.uk/slm.

Scottish Water Assets

A review of our records indicates that there are no Scottish Water assets (including w ater supply and sewer pipes, w ater and waste w ater treatment works, reservoirs, etc.) in the area. This should be confirmed how ever through obtaining plans from our Asset Plan Providers, listed in the SW list of precautions for assets, w hich can be found on the activities w ithin our catchments page of our w ebsite at www.scottishwater.co.uk/slm.

In the event that asset conflicts are identified then early contact should be made w ith the Highway Authorities and Utilities Committee (HAUC) at Hauc.diversions@scottishwater.co.uk.

It should be noted that the proposals w ill be required to comply w ith Sew ers for Scotland and Water for Scotland 4th Editions 2018, including provision of appropriate clearance distances from Scottish Water assets.

Hi John,

Many thanks for forwarding us the detailed Breeding Bird Survey (BBS) reports in relation to the proposed woodland creation scheme at South Logiealmond.

I'm aware that [REDACTED] has already stated our position based on a review of the data and current design in a previous email. The BBS report clearly highlights the importance of compartment LA03 for breeding waders other than curlew. From our perspective removing compartment LA03 remains essential. The report itself highlights the likely displacement of species from this high density breeding wader area if planted.

The report also identifies a number of a priority species for the RSPB and given the clear biodiversity importance of the site plus our serious concerns, would it be possible to speak further with you on this? Perhaps a site visit may be a good opportunity to do so?
