The new play area now contains 14 items which provide a good balance of play opportunities for children all ages 2 – 12 and all</p>

New provision also includes a picnic table and litter bin.</p> <p>Maxwellton Park, Paisley - £68,002.00, will be used at this location together with £41,998.00 of community raised funds, to completely renew the entire play area. The contract to renew this play area was awarded 22.12.21 and the work is scheduled to commence 11.04.22 and be complete by 13.05.22. The existing site contains 5 items of play equipment which are 20 to 30 years old and an old ash type surface which is a particular problem. The new play area will contain 7 items of equipment, one of which is a premium 4 tower multi playunit. Accessible paths will be provided through the site along with a new picnic table and litter bin.</p>
