- As a condition of the main agreement between CWCA and RZSS, a second and subsequently a third agreement were signed with the China Conservation and Research Centre for the Giant Panda (CCRCGP). Five thematic areas of research were outlined, alongside a mechanism through which CCRCGP and RZSS would deliver the research (both in China and Scotland). These are: Field ecology; Genetic management; Breeding and infant care: Veterinary management and research: Cognitive evolution and behavioural research.
- Agreement to extend the original 10-year deal for another 2 years (to December 2023). During that time, no attempt will be made to breed the pandas.
- The original 10-year deal involved annual donations of \$1m (about £750,000) to conservation efforts in China. In the final two years, the donation would be \$500,000 (about £375,000).

exactly where they will be settled in China. The zoo wants to ensure they go to the best facility suited to each panda and that the Edinburgh keepers can return with them to help them settle.

Yang Guang is an elderly panda who likes being around people and would probably be settled in the mountains where he could be exhibited. Tian Tian will probably retire to a similar setting but less likely to be exhibited (not a peoplepanda).

China Wildlife Conservation Association (CWCA) oversees two main panda nature reserves – Chengdu and Wolong nature reserve (South Sichuan). The Wolong panda base was devastated during 2008 earthquake, but rebuilt in a new location in Gengda within the Wolong nature reserve.
