A short note below of key points of the Cabinet Secretary's visit to Ferguson Marine today.

SG attendees: Cabinet Secretary for Finance and Economy, DG Economy, Director for Covid Business Resilience and Support, Deputy Director for Strategic Commercial Interventions Division, PS/Cab Sec F&E

The Cabinet Secretary undertook a visit of the Ferguson Marine site and the vessels, meeting with management and workforce representatives. Throughout the visit, the Cabinet Secretary communicated the following messages:

- SG is committed to the workforce, the yard, and its future.
- The vessels must be completed on budget.
- Successful delivery of the ferries is key to the future of the yard.
- Her belief in the skill and quality of the workforce.

Meeting with workforce representatives

Coordinated by **[REDACTED]** the Cabinet Secretary met with a number of workforce representatives. This was an open discussion. **[REDACTED]** noted the key role for the workforce in completion of the ferries and securing future for the yard. He welcomed new Chief Executive, who he noted was willing to listen and respectful of the workforce's skills and experience. He flagged efforts to mobilise the local community in the effort to secure a future pipeline of work for the yard.

Concerns expressed re business being top-heavy and this not aiding a nimble commercial approach. Planning was noted as a concern of workforce. Workforce representatives reflected that there were indications of change under the new leadership, but they are not yet convinced of the extent of this change or the pace.

It was proposed that union could have a role in liaising between workforce and management on the highlighting of issues identified and possible solutions.

Meetings with management

David Tydeman (CEO, 'DT') provided an overview of his delivery strategy for the ferries and his assessment of the challenges. There was discussion on progress towards delivery of the vessels, and a high level discussion re potential future work opportunities. The Cabinet Secretary met with a number of members of the management team on an introductory basis.

Grateful for confirmation that the Cabinet Secretary is content that this a fair reflection of her discussions.

The CEO will have members of the senior team available to talk through the differences in the programmes after you have seen the visible differences during the yard tour.

801 is 5 years since keel laid, it has been built out of sequence, with the CEO referring to it as a refit project more than a new build. 802 has also been assembled – structural blocks - in a sequence that didn't reflect good shipbuilding practice, however it is currently a relatively 'empty' steel hull and with good drawings and better planning. The CEO believes the 802 programme can now run in a more conventional shipbuilding way.

• Areas of programme risk

As you are aware the Chief Executive has developed a revised cost and schedule estimate of the new programme. There is programme risk in respect of both the schedule and the cost estimates.

With regards to schedule, the FMPG team, working closely and directly with CMAL representatives on site, has reconsidered the assumptions behind the commissioning programme and has concluded that given the risk of further 'unknown' legacy issues it will be prudent to make allowance to increase the commissioning period from 6 months to 8 months on 801 (The previous plan for a commissioning period of 6 months was predicated on working 24/7).

With regards to cost, the FMPG team are currently undertaking a detailed scrutiny of the assumptions underpinning the revised cost estimate in order to provide SG/Ministers with assurance that the cost is deliverable. This is a work in progress and is a top priority for the FMPG senior management team. Finance Business Partners are working closely with the FMPG team and with CMAL representatives on site to ensure appropriate scrutiny of the assurance process and the revised cost. Key areas of risk are in relation to manhour forecasts and the maturity of information relating to sub-contractor costs.

You may wish to ask for an update on the assurance work and the key areas of programme risk. You may also wish to reiterate the importance of

concluding this work as soon as possible to provide you with assurance over the revised programme and cost.



Note of Permanent Secretary's Visit to Yard

SG Attendees: Permanent Secretary, Director for Covid Business Resilience and Support, Director for Economic Development, Deputy Director Strategic Commercial Interventions Division, Finance Business Partner.

FMPG attendees: Chief Executive, Chief Financial Officer, Engineering Director, Operations Director, HR Director, Compliance Director. Number of other members of FMPG staff involved in facilitating yard and vessel tour.

KEY POINTS

Permanent Secretary met with Ferguson Marine Chief Executive and members of his senior management team. The conversation reflected on the following key points:

Delivery of the vessels

- Board deep dive scheduled for w/b 25 April, to consider lessons to be learned from process whereby management and Board recommitted to the previous delivery schedule in Dec 2021, yet in March 2022 stepped away from it so significantly.
- Looking across the history of the ferries contracts, cost increases have arisen as a result of original assumed base cost of labour being too low (at point of initial contract bid in 2015), increase in labour cost due to management choices throughout the projects (including poor sequencing), and the associated cumulative overheads over time.
- Improved data and metrics are a keen focus for the CEO. Current tracking approach is by system and by zone. Not presently as able to track overall progress as would like, but this is improving. CEO expects to provide credible assurance on extent to which delivery is on track at end May 2022.
- Permanent Secretary encouraged honesty over optimism.

Capacity and capability

- Challenges related to attracting and retaining the right skills, given the local competitors for these skills.
- New management and leadership ethos being instilled in the business, including encouragement for mutual challenge.
- Resource management in periods where skills might become under-utilised, including redeployment to yard upgrade projects, loans of staff to other companies, and undertaking work on behalf of other yards.

• CEO confirmed importance of increased rigour in planning and delivery, the value of improved relations with CMAL, and supporting senior team to work together as effectively as possible.

Future work and capital investment

- CEO outlined the yard's key future work interests, and the nature of its preferred markets which are shaped by the yard's skills, size, and options for configuration.
- ·[REDACTED]
- Improving the yard's competitiveness would require capital investment in upgrades.
- Officials confirmed the desirability of an independent assessment of the capital upgrade requirements and that work was progressing to allow for this assessment to commence as soon as process would allow.
- CEO flagged a window of opportunity to undertake yard upgrades in late summer/autumn 2022, and the need for approval and funding allocations for those upgrades to be confirmed in early course.

Yard and vessels tour

• Permanent Secretary toured the yard and vessel 801, meeting with key members of staff en route to: learn about the vessels, the challenges, and progress towards delivery; and to seek assurance on confidence level.

Next steps for SG

- 1. Officials to continue to work with FMPG management to progress and finalise programme and financial assurance work.
- 2. Officials to progress at pace necessary approvals for the consultancy work required to establish the nature and cost of the capital upgrades required to bring the yard to a position of competitiveness.

Schedule and Costs

The CEO has quantified the cost and timeline issues associated with this problem and have, in addition, reviewed the overall programme for both 801 and 802. The cabling issue itself has created a four-month delay to the start of the commissioning programme for vessel 801, which in turn, has a direct cascade impact on vessel 802 – also of four months. As a result, the start of commissioning for 801 has now moved to May 2022 and commissioning start for 802 is now planned for March 2023.

In parallel with this review the Ferguson Marine team, working closely and directly with CMAL representatives on site, has reconsidered the assumptions behind the commissioning programme and has concluded that given the risk of further as of now unknown legacy issues it will be prudent to make allowance to increase the commissioning period from 6 months to 8 months on 801. The previous plan for a commissioning period of 6 months was predicated on working 24/7. The challenges the yard have faced over the past year in recruiting the required labour to meet their resourcing needs means that this is not a realistic assumption and hence they have assumed a more realistic 8 months for commissioning 801.

Costs

Costs have increased from three factors – increases in labour hours, increases in materials and overhead recovery costs due to the extended timeline.

In terms of the increased cost that will be reported to Parliament, this will have 3 elements:

- Costs associated with the cabling issue £825k
- Costs associated with schedule extension £7.875m (£4m in overheads and £3.875m in labour and materials).
- The third cost element relates to the provision for previously unbudgeted warranties on warranty expired equipment and builder's warranty. This comes at a cost of £3.5m (based on 5% of £70m equipment cost).

The cost to complete the ferries will therefore increase from the £110.3m-£114.3m communicated to Parliament in December 2019 to £119m-£123m.

The total additional cost associated with the letter to Parliament is £122.5m-£126.5m.

Schedule Changes Since Nationalisation

Following the nationalisation of Ferguson Marine, the Turnaround Director was requested by the Scottish Government for a report on the conditions of the vessels, together with a revised programme and cost to complete the vessels.

The report was published in **December 2019** and set out the following programme for the vessels.

Vessel 801 delivery range – October to December 2021 Vessel 802 delivery range – July to October 2022

In August 2020 the Turnaround Director submitted another report updating the progress since the December 2019 report. This report summarised the actions taken Ferguson Marine during the COVID-19 lockdown, and to give an assessment of the impact of the lockdown on the project to deliver the ferries.

Ferguson Marine closed for the lockdown on 24 March 2020 and remained closed until early June when, in line with Scottish Government guidelines and in close collaboration with the workforce, limited outdoor working was resumed under a pilot project to restart work at the yard. This pilot allowed around 10% of yard workers to return to work with the level gradually increased through July. In August, approximately 50% of the yard workers have returned to work, supported by a skeleton crew of supervision and technical staff.

65 Ferguson employees worked from home throughout the lockdown and, given the constraints, good progress was made on design, planning and other areas. The Design of the vessels reached a critical phase, requiring concentrated engineering effort to approve final designs. At the time with no immediate prospect of returning the engineers to their offices this had a direct impact on the timetable.

Overall, by **August 2020** the COVID lockdown had left the yard closed for 3 months and on severely restricted working for at least 3 further months.

The Turnaround Director therefore updated the programme for the vessels to the following:

Vessel 801 delivery range – April 2022 to June 2022 Vessel 802 delivery range – December 2022 to February 2023

On **24 June 2021** Ferguson Marine submitted a report to the Scottish Parliament's Net Zero, Energy and Transport Committee as part of regular quarterly updates on progress as requested by the committee in their report on ferry procurement. The report detailed the impact that COVID-19 and shortages of local skilled labour has had on delivery schedules and pandemic-related costs. This report was the second update to the programme to deliver Vessels 801 & 802 and should be considered alongside the previous reports described above.

The issues above at the time of writing created a total 15-week delay in the construction of both vessels.

As a result, the Turnaround Director updated the programme for the vessels to the following:

Vessel 801 delivery range – July 2022 and September 2022 Vessel 802 delivery range – April 2023 and July 2023.

At the time of writing the June 2021 report, the COVID-19 pandemic caused six months of disruption in 2020 and productivity continued to be impacted due to a further shutdown in January 2021 and the introduction of additional COVID-19 safety measures. The timeline impact of ongoing disruption was calculated at the time as seven weeks, with additional costs of **£1 million**, which reflects the update given to parliament in March 2021. It brought the total COVID-19 costs to **£4.3 million**, which is treated as an exceptional item and does not affect the overall project budget.

On **23 March 2022** the FMPG CEO wrote to the Net Zero, Energy and Transport Committee to update them on the further analysis undertaken in relation the legacy cabling issue and to provide an updated programme and costs to complete the vessels.

The updated the programme for the vessels is the following:

Vessel 801 delivery range – March 2023 and May 2023 Vessel 802 delivery range – October 2023 and December 2023.

Vessel Programme & MI Data

Differences in 801 and 802 programmes

The CEO will have the Senior Management team available to talk through the differences in the programmes after you have seen the visible differences during the yard tour.

801 is 5 years since keel laid, it has been built out of sequence, with the CEO referring to it as a refit project more than a new build. 802 has also been assembled – structural blocks - in a sequence that didn't reflect good shipbuilding practice, however it is currently a relatively 'empty' steel hull and with good drawings and better planning. Financial Assurance

Headlines

- Revised schedule submitted to Parliament has been developed with support from CMAL who have provided assurance that the revised dates are achievable.
- Work is underway to provide assurance on the additional identified costs and provide assurance on the revised cost to complete.
- The yard itself is still in the process of getting its own assurance on the new numbers, so it is unrealistic to expect SG to have this before they do.

There is still information outstanding and further work to be done around the materials and labour profile of workers/subcontractors. Work is underway to assess the appropriateness of the assumptions underpinning the labour and material profiles, including the norm performance assumed in the new cost estimate vs the norm performance achieved to date.

A key element that officials don't yet have is a profile of costs between now and delivery of 801/802 and how this ties to key milestones and the programme for delivery. This will be key for SG (and FMPG) to track progress of the vessels to ensure we are able to identify and highlight slippage and potential cost over-runs

REDACTED] early.

At this stage we are not able to provide sufficient assurance and confidence in the revised cost estimate. This assurance will take time as we assess the underlying assumptions underpinning the revised cost estimate with the yard's finance and project team. Officials do have the buy in from senior Ferguson Marine management, including CFO, George Crookston, and CEO David T, and ^[REDACTED] (CMAL Secondee). This buy-in will be critical in providing the Scottish Government with a level of assurance on the revised cost. Officials will continue to push forward with this over the course of the next few weeks.

- No decisions have been made regarding the future of the yard. This will depend upon a number of factors, including how its future order book evolves.

Ferguson Marine will be able to bid for both major and small vessels in the coming years, including those delivered through the £580 million ferry investment programme announced in 2021. This will include up to seven new ships under phase one of the Small Vessel Replacement Programme. These vessels are expected to be within the target specification of Ferguson Marine but the timeline for their procurement is uncertain.

Capital Investment/Pathway to Productivity

Ferguson Marine have been clear for some time that in order to improve competitiveness and to deliver current contracts in the short term there is a need for capital investment in the yard.

Recently there has been the 'pathway to productivity' conversations where we agreed with the yard that FMI (marine engineering consultants who completed a benchmarking exercise in late 2020/early 2021) would be in a strong position to provide the necessary assessment of measures to improve the yard.

This work would ascertain the speed, cost, and efficiency improvements needed in order to make the yard competitive and efficient both for future contracts or in the interim to successfully deliver [REDACTED]

Mr Tydeman expressed concern around accepting figures without validation.

Ms Forbes shared his concern and noted that the assurance figures were required by the end of June. Looking to learn if there were any obvious mitigations available.

Mr Tydeman explained the costs for 801 were mainly due to contractor and essential equipment costs. Overheads and direct labour costs were under tight control.

He suggested, due to the new rebuild strategy, the two vessels should be disconnected. He also indicated that reduction of certain roles had been identified as a means to reduce costs without affecting the work of the yard.

Ms Forbes asked Mr Tydeman to work with the team in this connection-and asked for an update on contractors.

Mr Tydeman apologised for an error in the March figures and indicated there were issues he was looking to resolve. He advised there was an undertaking to the Board to provide a list of the key contractors and the quantum involved.

Ms Forbes asked about budget as she was not in a position to agree to increased costs.

Mr Tydeman expressed tentative optimism around vessel 802 but wanted to validate the figures. He hoped by tomorrow (31 May) to scope out the 20 items that make up the budget. Design review and changing policy with vessel 802 hoped to enable a targeted agreed budget.

Ms Forbes asked if he had any concerns about the timetable previously mentioned.

Mr Tydeman confirmed he didn't have concerns of a timetable of Spring 2023. He advised good progress was being made and the mechanical team was confident in the components.

Ms Forbes asked the if there were issues with new employees settling in.

Mr Tydeman expressed that the new Supply Chain Director had overseen considerable improvements at less cost and there was a good relationship with the shop steward

Ms Rooney flagged the change in the Engineering Director.

Mr Tydeman reassured the transition to the new Engineering Director had been good and there were no issues internally.

Mr McKee asked if the concerns regarding the contractors were due to extra claims on hourly rates.

Mr Tydeman indicated this was the case with some of the contractors.

Mr McKee asked about disposing of the Planning Team.

Mr Tydeman advised there were ongoing issues and a number of supervisors had returned to "the tools". He also indicated issues had been identified at managerial level.

Ms Forbes noted that the Report had identified several issues.

Mr Tydeman believed the two new Non- Executive Directors would bring additional strengths to the Board on both the legal and ship building side.

Ms Forbes asked about relations with other shipbuilders regarding innovation and collaboration.

Financial Assurance / update to Parliament

- I'm aware that the Board is concerned that there may be a significant increase in costs associated with the build of the vessels.

- To be very clear, there is no blank cheque for delivery of these ferries, and I expect you to work within your budget. As a Board, I expect you to be considering all possible options to manage within your allocated budget.

- An increase to the budget should not be the default option. I will want to understand what you can achieve within your current budget and why you can't achieve what you previously committed to deliver.

- As great a degree of certainty as possible in your numbers is very important.

- With regards to 801, there is a significant increase in manhours from the March 2022 update to the May 2022 update based on initial workings provided – does this change your confidence in the schedule for delivery of 801?

- With regards to 802, I note there is significant risk around the labour and sub-contractor costs. What confidence do we have in the delivery schedule for 802 if the financial assurance process is at an immature stage?

- The First Minister has requested advice on potential options for the yard's future. As part of this, I understand that officials are engaging with the yard to understand the resource profile as work on 801 and 802 tapers off.

- We anticipate the contract to be awarded by mid July 2022. The report should be finished in October 2022.

- We will need the yard's access and expertise to support this work and turn the outcomes of the report into a business case that Ministers can consider in the context of wider capital expenditure pressures.

Headlines

- Ferguson Marine are working on a revised cost estimate for the programme to deliver 801 and 802. The yard has separated the two vessels in its internal reporting and is treating these as separate programmes at this stage.
- We have not yet been formally provided with an updated schedule and cost. However, we understand from workings and conversations with FMPG Senior Management that they expect significant cost increases.
- The yard has undertaken a detailed assurance exercise in respect of 801 and work to date suggests the revised costs for this vessel will increase from £59 million to £79 million. There may be small deductions against this however we expect an overall potential increase in the region of £18-20 million to be notified to us by the Board when the yard have full confidence and the Board have approved.
- The assurance work on 802 has not made significant progress and is still at an immature stage. It is anticipated that this work will take several weeks, if not months. The indications to date suggest that this will increase once the assurance work is complete.
- Work is underway to scrutinise the additional costs currently identified and this scope of work will be extended to cover any additional increases notified to us in the coming days. Officials do not currently have confidence that these numbers will not again shift in the coming days.
- We propose in your lines to take above that this meeting (23/6/22) with the Chair and CEO be used as an opportunity to reinforce the need for delivery within budget and the expectation that the Board will consider all options to do so.

801

The yard has undertaken an extensive assurance exercise in respect of the cost estimate for delivering 801. This has included a detailed review of labour manhours, sub-contractor costs and overheads. The result of this assurance process is expected to be an increase in the cost of delivering the vessel, increasing from £59 million in March 2022 to £79 million in May 2022. The increase in cost of c£20 million can be summarised as:

- Correcting misstated actual costs up to March 2022 £7 million
- Error in the March 2022 costs to complete spreadsheet £3 million

 Additional costs to complete resulting from assurance exercise - £10 million (£8m subcontractors, £2 million Labour/Overheads)

The estimated cost to complete 801 from 1 June 2022 is £19 million. There is still risk in these numbers, specifically around engineering change and management of subcontractors, however the yard has significantly greater assurance than it previously did. The yard and CMAL remain confident in the schedule for delivery of the vessel.

802

FMPG do not have assurance over the total cost to complete 802. The assurance work will take a number of weeks or months to obtain the same level of assurance to 801.

Assurance work is ongoing. The cost to complete 802 as stated in the March 2022 update was £36 million and this remains the estimated cost to complete.

Early work indicates there is **significant risk** that these costs will increase by a **significant amount**. There is considerable risk in the direct labour and sub-contractor cost lines.

There is also a risk that if no other work is secured all of the yard's overheads would be allocated to 802 which could push the 'programme cost' for 802 up **significantly**.

The yard remain confident in the schedule for delivery of the vessel, however the lack of assurance over labour hours and sub-contract scope of works would challenge this confidence.

We are unable to offer any assurance over the costs of 802 at this stage, given the relatively immature stage of the yard's own assurance process.

Cost and Schedule Background

Costs

In March 2022 the costs increased from three factors – increases in labour hours, increases in materials and overhead recovery costs due to the extended timeline.

The increased cost that was reported to Parliament, comprised 3 elements:

- Costs associated with the cabling issue £825k
- Costs associated with schedule extension £7.875m (£4m in overheads and £3.875m in labour and materials).
- The third cost element relates to the provision for previously unbudgeted warranties on warranty expired equipment and builder's warranty. This comes at a cost of £3.5m (based on 5% of £70m equipment cost).

The cost to complete the ferries increased from the £110.3m-£114.3m communicated to Parliament in December 2019 to £119m-£123m.

The total additional cost associated with the letter to Parliament inclusive of warranty is £122.5m-£126.5m.

Schedule Changes Since Nationalisation

Following the nationalisation of Ferguson Marine, the Turnaround Director was requested by the Scottish Government for a report on the conditions of the vessels, together with a revised programme and cost to complete the vessels.

The report was published in **December 2019** and set out the following programme for the vessels.

Vessel 801 delivery range – October to December 2021 Vessel 802 delivery range – July to October 2022

In August 2020 the Turnaround Director submitted another report updating the progress since the December 2019 report. This report summarised the actions taken Ferguson Marine during the COVID-19 lockdown, and to give an assessment of the impact of the lockdown on the project to deliver the ferries.

Ferguson Marine closed for the lockdown on 24 March 2020 and remained closed until early June when, in line with Scottish Government guidelines and in close collaboration with the workforce, limited outdoor working was resumed under a pilot project to restart work at the yard. This pilot allowed around 10% of yard workers to return to work with the level gradually increased through July. In August, approximately 50% of the yard workers have returned to work, supported by a skeleton crew of supervision and technical staff.

65 Ferguson employees worked from home throughout the lockdown and, given the constraints, good progress was made on design, planning and other areas. The Design of the vessels reached a critical phase, requiring concentrated engineering effort to approve final designs. At the time with no immediate prospect of returning the engineers to their offices this had a direct impact on the timetable.

Overall, by **August 2020** the COVID lockdown had left the yard closed for 3 months and on severely restricted working for at least 3 further months.

The Turnaround Director therefore updated the programme for the vessels to the following:

Vessel 801 delivery range – April 2022 to June 2022 Vessel 802 delivery range – December 2022 to February 2023

On **24 June 2021** Ferguson Marine submitted a report to the Scottish Parliament's Net Zero, Energy and Transport Committee as part of regular quarterly updates on progress as requested by the committee in their report on ferry procurement. The report detailed the impact that COVID-19 and shortages of local skilled labour has had on delivery schedules and pandemic-related costs. This report was the second update to the programme to deliver Vessels 801 & 802 and should be considered alongside the previous reports described above.

The issues above at the time of writing created a total 15-week delay in the construction of both vessels.

As a result, the Turnaround Director updated the programme for the vessels to the following:

Vessel 801 delivery range – July 2022 and September 2022 Vessel 802 delivery range – April 2023 and July 2023.

At the time of writing the June 2021 report, the COVID-19 pandemic caused six months of disruption in 2020 and productivity continued to be impacted due to a further shutdown in January 2021 and the introduction of additional COVID-19 safety measures. The timeline impact of ongoing disruption was calculated at the time as seven weeks, with additional costs of **£1 million**, which reflects the update given to parliament in March 2021. It brought the total COVID-19 costs to **£4.3 million**, which is treated as an exceptional item and does not affect the overall project budget.

On **23 March 2022** the FMPG CEO wrote to the Net Zero, Energy and Transport Committee to update them on the further analysis undertaken in relation the legacy

cabling issue and to provide an updated programme and costs to complete the vessels.

The updated the programme for the vessels is the following:

Vessel 801 delivery range – March 2023 and May 2023 Vessel 802 delivery range – October 2023 and December 2023.

DT gave an update on the ongoing financial assurance work. FMPG finance have been reviewing the assumptions behind the revised cost and schedule and how spend aligns to the vessels delivery with SG finance colleagues.

The emerging outputs of the financial assurance exercise will be shared with the FMPG Board today. The Board will consider options in terms of next steps.

DT indicated that preliminary findings reveal; 240,000 hours are needed to complete 801, there are design gaps which require addressing, and there is an increase in costs relating to major contractors. As a result of this the budget on 801 could increase by an estimated £21m. This figure was shared as a preliminary indication of the cost uncertainty. DT reported that FMPG's understanding of the numbers had been, and continued to evolve. The final position was currently uncertain, with work still to be conducted to investigate further. The figure is also commercially sensitive and had not gone through a Board assurance process and so was provided in confidence at this stage.

The indicative increase is the result of accounting corrections, a spreadsheet error from the FMPG finance team, and accruals previously understated.

DT outlined the re-planning of the design and build strategy for 802. Re-planning allows for the opportunity to re-tender contract packages and forecast labour differently. DT suggested that until this re-planning is complete, it is difficult to confirm costs on 802.

Ms Forbes indicated that DT and the FMPG Board need to have full confidence in the internal accounting and internal budget management regarding the final figures relating to the financial assurance work. Ms Forbes also underlined the budget constraints and the challenges of any additional budget being forthcoming for potential further cost overruns.

DT agreed that more work was needed to have full confidence in the final figures, with estimates at this stage uncertain and requiring further scrutiny. RM confirmed the FMPG Board's priority is to scrutinise this financial assurance work and provide certainty.

Regarding future key dates, DT outlined that 801 will go into dry-dock on the 15 July, with dry-dock complete by 8 August. After dry-dock is completed DT stated he would have much more confidence in costs. Regarding 802, likewise, DT believes he will have more confidence on costs mid/late August. External design experts are coming on site to work on 802 in the coming weeks.

It was agreed that the September quarterly update to Parliament was a reasonable target to have full confidence in the financial assurance figures. DT estimated that the design re-work on 802 would take roughly 3 months, the result of which would be greater confidence in overall costs.

Ms Forbes recognised that DT has made a number of positive improvements relating to FMPG.

RA asked that DT keeps Scottish Government up to date as the cost analysis of 802 develops, this would be useful in helping develop ongoing value for money assessments.

DT went on to discuss opportunities **[REDACTED]**, relating to potential future work, with discussions ongoing.

The Cabinet Secretary noted that DT had advised her on their previous call on 23 June 22 of an anticipated increase in costs associated with the build of ferries 801 and 802 – these costs have not yet been confirmed or approved by the Fergusons Board.

DT indicated that, given the Board did not yet have confidence in the emerging costs position, it would not be possible to address this in any detail in his update letter to Parliament. The Cabinet Secretary agreed that it would not be appropriate to share numbers publicly until these had been fully assured and approved by the FMPG Board.

The Cabinet Secretary indicated that it was important that the financial assurance and costings work was robust, and the final figures were approved by the Board and provided to SG for consideration. She emphasised the need for options for Fergusons to deliver within their budget.

The Cabinet Secretary explored with DT the Board's role in the process and next steps. It was noted that the recruitment of a new, permanent Board Chair is ongoing. DT confirmed that the emerging costs issue had been the subject of a deep dive discussion by the Board members on 23 June 22. At this meeting the Board commissioned DT to undertake further work on the costs, noting SG's request for the consideration of options to deliver within budget.

The Cabinet Secretary asked that officials be kept updated on this work as it progresses.

DT stated that support from SG officials on site is adding value.

KF commented that she did not see the budget constraints being a reason for the Bank not being successful. The Bank has a key role in Scotland's growth.

SR was mindful of the challenges. Bank is acutely focused on value for money and continues to manage costs (most of the cost is staffing). RR commented that the Bank's income was dependent on a range of factors and could not be guaranteed and it was therefore important to maintain transparency with the Shareholder team / SG. **[REDACTED]**DR stressed that becoming self-sustainable is at the forefront of the Bank's mind. KF agreed that raising more income would also help with the Bank's autonomy.

Glasgow premises

SR explained this was about the Bank's ability to target the west coast and expand the staff talent pool. She emphasised this was more a 'try before we buy' and were looking for 12-15 desks and some meeting rooms. It was about building the identity and the brand. They had looked at vacant space in the SG estate but the FCA requirements need the staff space to be 'sealed off'. However, in the longer term they could revisit the SG estate portfolio if they decide to go for a more permanent premises in due course. DR emphasised the Bank was for the whole of Scotland and location in Glasgow would help address the place mission component.

KF was keen to see more on the case to be put forward.

Portfolio

SR commented that the Bank has committed to over £200m in investments, with 3 closing this week:

- 1 addressing the Net Zero and Place missions
- 1 tech investment
- 1 turbine / tidal deal in the marine energy space which will hopefully create a new market and make the sector commercially viable.

DR explained that a new Engagement Plan had been submitted to the Board which included wider engagement with the Enterprise networks and the public sector. The Board are supportive of this and the Bank is keen to draw on the expertise of the Board in this work.

DR also explained that the Bank is now drawing insights from its investments and developing its thought leadership. It is increasing relationships with think tanks and organisations such as the SCDI and shaping a more positive narrative. It is becoming more strategic and increasing its visibility and becoming more active now.

[REDACTED] The Bank is very much in line with the Scotland agenda and engaging with SG policy teams around commercial capital as opposed to grants.

Equality Strategy

The Bank were due to publish their equalities strategy this week, but have decided to pause it to reconsider where it may be possible for them to be more ambitious. This has largely been driven by the disappointing gender pay gap at the Bank, which is more than twice the Scotland average of 10.1% (at 23.1%). The Bank believe that this is caused by the need to recruit from a sector which has a high pay gap - the UK financial services as a whole has a pay gap of 32.2%. They also have a below average representation of disabled staff. While staffing is ultimately a matter for the Bank, we would nevertheless recommend pushing the Bank to set out what specific actions it will be taking to address the pay gap and any other equalities issues they have identified, and emphasise that you expect progress as they review the strategy over the next years.
