Background and Context

- With the Cabinet Secretary's announcement of the Scheme Design, the programme has entered a Detail Design phase covering planning, legislation and scheme operation
- Key deliverables from this phase include specifications for major components of the scheme (including the transport logistics service, the underpinning ICT and the operational change definition for producers, retailers and other players)
- The programme currently has 16 work streams, including the 9 (with the recent addition of the Retail work package) identified at the last IAG meeting
- With the intent that the end state DRS operation is owned and run by industry it is
 essential that representatives contribute to the creation of these deliverables, within
 the overarching guidance and advice provided by the IAG. This approach will also
 facilitate the transition of ownership of the scheme build to industry.
- 2 methods of contribution are proposed:
 - Working Groups
 - Working Groups will be formed to deliver those work packages which have significant requirement for industry knowledge and expertise, and which are on the critical programme path. Working Groups will support specific work streams, which will be expected to be led by an industry representative
 - Specialist Support
 - Specialist Support covers a range of discrete contributions, including data and time from specialists, for those work packages where further scoping/definition is required and where Zero Waste Scotland can continue to lead in the short term. It is likely that Working Groups will need to be established for these work streams as the programme progresses

Working Group Assumptions

- Industry led
 - IAG members or member companies
 - Strategic/technical/sector split
 - Senior/Leader representatives with significant responsibility, and capable of leading working groups
 - Operations/ technical/ professional managers deep domain knowledge in their field of expertise
 - Sector/Domain broad knowledge across a specific sector or related domain (e.g., circular economy)
 - Member companies lead and may provide additional technical rigor
 - Augmented with contractors or research support if required
- Duration of working groups determined by nature of deliverables required
- Zero Waste Scotland project management and Secretariat support
- Report back to IAG and Programme Board (via existing work stream reporting)
