Thanks for the call yesterday, it was great to catch up. Thanks for explaining about your remit and that this is at an early stage of exploring the role and opportunity for PHS in ensuring a public health-led approach/advice as part of long-term condition policy development and implementation.

Chronic Pain

As discussed I think that in addition to your/PHS inputting and advising on relevant Actions set out in our Implementation Plan, there is also potentially a role as part of wider oversight and Governance structures. I'll discuss this with the team here ahead of our next Task Force (overall Governance group) meeting and get back to you with an update. We also discussed some potential priority areas for input including our proposed work on improved communication, healthcare professional education and third-sector offer as part of community-based support for people with chronic pain.
