Which new pressures in the Education and Skills portfolio resulted in this cut?

- What has been clear all along, all governments, particularly SG with the financial situation we are in, Government has to make tough choices and decisions. There is no shying away from that.
- We have invested more on public sector pay awards which is the right thing to do. We were asked to settle the teachers' pay deal. As set out by the previous Cabinet Secretary for Education and Skills to the Education Committee, meeting any new pressures on the portfolio since the 2023-24 budget announcement would result in difficult choices to be made.
- Government does not have a separate pot of money to fund emerging priorities, and therefore, we must reconsider and reprioritise the limited budget we have in the education and skills portfolio.

- There were demands to settle the teachers' pay deal and we have invested more on public sector pay awards, which is the right thing to do.
- At the time of reaching a fair pay deal with teachers, we flagged that identifying additional money for a pay settlement would increase the overall financial challenge.
- We were clear at the time that this would mean some programmes and projects would not go ahead as planned because more money was being diverted into a new deal.
- All parties agreed that this was a price worth paying to ensure teachers received a fair pay deal, and to mitigate disruption to Scotland's schools with industrial action. We are supporting this deal with an additional £320 million – and it will help us to both recruit and retain highly skilled professionals.
- However, as the First Minister has said before, this additional money was provided on the clear understanding that difficult decisions would have to be made elsewhere in order to balance our Budget.
