# NATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS 2021: £400 ADDITIONAL ONE-OFF PAYMENT TO TEACHERS AND LECTURERS

Dear Principal,

As you will be aware, the Deputy First Minister announced on 8 December 2020, that an exceptional one-off payment would be paid to Scotland's teachers and lecturers in recognition of the additional workload involved in delivering the Alternative Certfication Model (ACM) for National Qualifications in 2020/21, in the absence of the examination diet during the COVID-19 pandemic.

I am writing to advise that the guidance to support delivery of this payment to college lecturers is now available: <u>https://www.gov.scot/publications/coronavirus-covid-19-college-lecturers-one-off-400-pounds-payment/</u>. My officials will also share a PDF version of the guidance with Colleges Scotland, which also includes a standard form of words for communicating with staff.

The payment is solely intended to recognise the additional responsibility that has been placed with teachers and lecturers this year to ensure learners receive their national qualifications, based on their professional judgement of demonstrated attainment – an unprecedented and significant role for teachers and lecturers.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support in fulfilling this important commitment the Scottish Government has made to college lecturers.

# Colleges Scotland feedback on the one-off payment to lecturers guidance – SG response

 Clause 1.2 (payment of National Insurance Contributions) – states 'Employer National Insurance contributions (NICs) on the payment will be paid'; assume this equals reimbursement of NICs (see 8.3 for confirmation of SG paying NICs at 13.8%). Perhaps 8.3 could be cross-referred in clause 1.2 to clarify?

## We have added relevant additional text at 1.2 in response to this feedback.

 Clause 1.3 (form submission) – states 'One form should be returned which captures all lecturers in the college sector eligible for this payment', so suggest the word 'sector' be removed to clarify college (or college region) return required. In addition, assuming for any colleges expecting early September requirement for additional lecturer work linked to ACM evidence extension, then, all eligible lecturers from last academic year and up to that date to be listed on one form for each college. This raises issues for multi-college RSBs expected to return one form for all colleges covered by the RSB (e.g., Glasgow Colleges Regional Board, UHI colleges), with possible delays inherent to this and the additional need for the RSB to create a cover sheet for totals and supporting addenda to tally each college using their own form.

We have amended the wording at 1.3 to reflect that one form should be returned for each college and that college regions can return forms for each college, alongside a summary sheet to ensure SG provide the correct total funding to the RSB.

The guidance sets out that for lecturers we are requesting only 1 return for all work undertaken to support the ACM this year, including any additional work lecturers who were required to carry out to support learners completing assessments within the extended discretionary period (by 3 September 2021). While the Guidance notes the deadline for submission of return forms, we appreciate that there may be circumstances outwith this (for example leavers who get in touch after this deadline). However, we would like these to be the exception and therefore would appreciate "substantive" claims by the deadline date but will pick up "unexpected" claims further to that date if they arise after the deadline and could not have reasonably been included within the initial return form.

- Clause 1.4 (submission date) currently 30 September 2021, but suggestion that guidance issue delay beyond 31 August 201 would necessitate flex of this submission date.
- Heading 3 (Timetable) Scottish Government advise it is an indicative timetable, so flex per the point directly above may be required.

What is a realistic timescale from the issuing of guidance to allow colleges to identify eligible lecturers and return forms? We would prefer to receive return forms as soon as possible to prevent any further delays of payments to lecturers, particularly given

# teachers will have started receiving payments, but also recognise the need for returns to be accurate.

- Clause 3.1 (staff contact) HR feedback requests removal of 'or retired' from the guidance, with option of rewording to '... those who have since left the employment of the college' in the final sentence.
- Clause 7.1 (leavers) as per 3.1 comments above, 'or retired' to be removed and alternative suggested text used.

## We have updated the wording at 3.1 to reflect this feedback.

- Clause 3.2 (employee advice) states 'Staff ... advised to seek advice' but does not state from whom; should this read additionally 'e.g., DWP, Social Security Scotland', as colleges will not be qualified to give advice. HR feedback advises also limiting extent of the clause to read 'Staff who have concerns about the potential impact on their benefits are advised to seek advice. Employers are encouraged to work with these staff to consider options', the remainder of the current text to be removed and this will also remove the Admin burden and additional unnecessary data capture.
- Clause 8.4 (benefits advice) as per 3.2 above on whom the employee may wish to seek advice from.

We have updated the wording at 3.2 to reflect this feedback and signpost appropriately. Signposting is also provided within the letter to staff within the guidance. Whilst we appreciate there will be matters colleges are not able to advise staff on, we would expect colleges to support staff where they can.

The text requested to be removed has been included within the guidance to support employers and employees on what we think could reasonably be implemented to ensure employees receive the maximum sum possible and are not unfairly penalised due to being in receipt of benefits. From an equity perspective, it seems fair to maintain this wording within the guidance for the payment to lecturers to ensure they are treated in the same manner as their teacher counterparts. We have therefore maintained this wording within the guidance and, as is noted within the guidance, we would be happy to explore potential alternative approaches with colleges if circumstances require.

Clause 4.3 (employee eligibility) – HR feedback suggests this needs further consideration and legal advice should be taken – someone on maternity leave should also be eligible for the payment if they would have undertaken the work if they had not be on maternity leave. People on maternity leave are entitled to the pay and other benefits (including this type of payment) as if they were at work – it would be discriminatory to do otherwise and would leave the college, as the employer, open to a claim. The same concern exists about furlough – there is no legal entitlement to payments as if they had been at work but the MoU that Colleges signed with their unions mostly say that people on furlough will get 100% of pay during their absence and there is likely to be at least an implied obligation that anyone on furlough who would have done the eligible work should also get the payment. In addition, as per point made in 3.1 above, this could be

reworded to 'those who have left the employment of the College' as people who have retired are also in this group.

The purpose of the payment is to recognise the additional workload and responsibilities that rests with teachers and lecturers involved in the ACM. A fundamental element of the eligibility criteria is that an individual had a role in supporting the delivery of the ACM.

Lecturers will still be eligible if they were/are:

- shielding
- on sick leave
- on maternity or paternity leave
- adoption leave
- furloughed

<u>as long as</u> they had a role in supporting the delivery of the Alternative Certification Model.

- Clause 5.2 (contracted hours) HR feedback requests that we make it clear that this excludes casual/additional/overtime hours as this usually becomes an issue, and to say 'contractual' is not clear enough: all hours worked for the college can be seen as 'contractual' or at least open to debate, which some colleges already have opposition from unions on and do not want more scope for disagreement or challenge.
- Clause 5.4 (part-time eligibility) HR feedback advises that 'average contracted' is not a useful phrase for colleges and is worth rewording to 'contracted'. The section 'disproportionate effect on their workload in comparison to the average additional workload' is too vague and will be challenged. See suggestions against 5.5 for options.

Average hours should be based on contracted hours in the context of a lecturer on full-time contracted hours (during the time that the individual was working – not across the entire qualifying period if they were not employed during certain periods).

There is no minimum qualifying period for the payment. To be eligible, lecturers need to have been:

- employed between 1 January 2021 and 25 June 2021 for the initial window.
- employed between the start of the new academic year in August and 3 September 2021 (where applicable).
- Clause 5.5 (part-time example) referring to 5.2, note that 'judgement on the part
  of the Principal/Vice Principal of Curriculum/Director of HR/Director of Finance or
  similar role as deemed appropriate by the college' allows a range of staff to make
  this determination but 5.4 specifically says Principals, so better to change to
  same range as 5.2. In addition, HR and Finance feedback suggests that the
  wording 'required to spend a greater proportion of their time supporting delivery
  of the ACM when compared to the average full-time lecturer' makes the scheme
  even more divisive, so would suggest a couple of options: if you work 0.5 then
  you get £200 (although what about a full-time lecturer who did additional hours to

catch up on work they do not get more than £400); could it just be £400 per person, irrespective of FTE? That would be much easier for colleges to implement and there would be no scope for dispute. Currently, this section is too vague and will be subject to dispute/disagreement as a lecturer could be 0.5 FTE and worked additional hours to do the ACM work and would then be eligible for a higher proportion of the £400. Colleges would have to ask people how much of their work was ACM related, which is very difficult to determine or to verify.

 Clause 5.6 (rationale) – as mentioned above, £400 per person, irrespective of FTE, would be much easier and fairer as the 'reward' is meant to be for the additional work for ACM; a flat payment to everyone eligible would be best, otherwise the premise is that those who work part time were not impacted as much, which is unlikely.

# We have updated the wording at 5.6 to include those who can apply judgement to reflect the same as is at 5.2.

An Equality Impact Assessment was undertaken in determining the pro-rata element of the payment, which is already in place for teachers. Discretion is provided to offer flexibility to ensure that part-time staff are not disadvantaged when compared to their full-time counterparts, where they may have undertaken the same/additional level of work. This type of judgement will require input from senior management within colleges overseeing the work of lecturers and it will be for colleges to satisfy themselves they can justify their application of the guidance, for audit purposes. We would however, ask that colleges apply an inclusive approach when considering this element of the guidance.

• Clause 5.8 (multiple employers) – HR feedback advises 'disregarded from that employer' should be amended to 'disregarded from one employer'.

## We have amended the wording of 5.8 to reflect this feedback.

Clause 5.9 (employer tasks) – HR and Finance feedback requests that this clause be deleted, as more Admin function is back on college HR teams (5.8 above puts the responsibility on staff but 5.9 returns that responsibility to the College); this will create significant additional work for HR teams and is unnecessary. While 5.7 and 5.8 are fine, 5.9 is felt to contradict those clauses. In addition, with the Admin burden, there is no recognition or support offered for the time spent on carrying out the task.

We would not intend for colleges to undertake additional checks of employees to ensure they are not likely to receive a duplicate payment if they have more than one employer, but where a college is *already aware* that an employee works for more than one institution which may lead to a potential duplicate payment, we would ask that colleges carry out a basic check for audit purposes. Ultimate responsibility for ensuring an individual does not receive a duplicate payment will rest with the employee.

The Scottish Government will reserve the right to carry out a cross-check if necessary and this is a required audit function.

• Clause 7.2 (dismissal) – HR feedback advises that the term 'instant dismissal' is considered illegal, so wording should be amended to 'dismissal for gross misconduct' within the brackets.

## We have amended the wording of 7.2 to reflect this feedback.

- Heading 9 (complaints) noted that colleges are not part of the Complaints process (colleges have existing Complaints handling processes), so against 9.2, if Scottish Government determine eligibility for payment per a direct complaint, it is assumed that instruction will be given to a college to pay the amount and then be reimbursed by Scottish Government under a separate Offer of Grant for that specific complainant.
- Clause 9.5 (SG Investigating Officer) while it is understood that this may be established process for Scottish Government's Complaints arrangements, investigating and ruling on – possibly overturning – a college decision appears counter-productive within the intent of this guidance.

In recognition that the guidance and eligibility criteria has been set by the Scottish Government, we have provided a complaints procedure where complaints cannot be resolved at a local level. If eligibility is determined at a later stage following such a complaint, we would look to make an additional grant payment to the college to allow payment to be made to the staff member.

 Clause 10.1 (evidence) – in agreeing that this is a new process, it would be better to establish what information is required at the beginning and ask for it at the start of the process, rather than add to the administrative burden for Scottish Government and colleges at an as yet to be unspecified date.

Once colleges send SG the return form, we will draft and provide an Offer of Grant letter to the college/RSB. Some additional information may be required to satisfy the grant process, but we wouldn't envisage this being a particular additional burden.

• Clause 11.1 (repayment) – upon whom will the burden be placed for repayment? For example, what about employee 'fraud' or error (i.e., making a claim twice) which could turn out to be inadvertent?

We would intend for such payments to be recovered in the normal manner, and in line with grant payment requirements. If this was as a result of fraud, this would follow due process and an investigation.

 Annex A – with regard to the signatory boxes, a signature as Principal (which is sufficient to claim SFC core grant) should be sufficient here as well and not require another staff member as countersignature. Separately, what is required for a RSB signatory and who will be expected to return the form for a multicollege region?

For audit purposes, we would look for return forms to be signed by the Principal and countersigned by another senior official within a college. Would there be any practical barriers to the countersigning officer being the Chair of the Board?

For RSBs, if the individual college forms being returned to the RSB are signed by the Principal and the Chair of the Board (or another person with authority to sign such a form) signs the summary form this would be sufficient.

## Purpose

1. Following a letter from [Redacted s38(1)(b)], the Minister asked officials to provide a consolidated update on progress with the one-off payment to college lecturers. This submission seeks to offer this update, as well as additional advice and proposed handling regarding the letter from [Redacted s38(1)(b)]

## Priority

2. Routine.

## Background

3. [Redacted – information not in scope] and that they are also seeking parity for their members who are not eligible to receive the one-off payment (as the eligibility criteria extends only to lecturers and not support staff). The EA have made clear they are unable to meet a request to provide a £400 one-off payment to support staff.

4. Following ministerial clearance, officials have since published guidance to support delivery of the one-off payment to college lecturers on 15 September 2021. You wrote to college Principals to advise of this and officials also shared a PDF version of the guidance to Colleges Scotland (CS).

## **One-off payment**

5. No returns have yet been received from colleges identifying eligible staff, but a closing date of 30 September has been set as per the guidance. Provided colleges return forms within the requested deadlines, the below timeline has been agreed. The Scottish Government has made no commitment as to when staff can expect to receive the payment, as this will be subject to local pay arrangements within colleges.

6. Following publication of the guidance, the Principal of [Redacted s38(1)(b)] raised concerns directly with officials regarding the requirement for a countersignature on the return form. Feedback in regards to this matter was provided by CS when officials were developing the guidance and we advised that this was a required audit function. This point was re-iterated to the Principal.

7. When determining the criteria for the one-off payment, a clear decision was reached by Ministers that only teachers and lecturers would be eligible to receive the payment; the payment was not to be extended to support staff.

8. UNISON wrote to both the Minister and the Cabinet Secretary for Education and Skills seeking the payment be extended to all education staff in July 2021. In responding to these letters, Ministers maintained the policy position that the oneoff payment was solely intended to recognise the additional responsibility that was placed with teachers and lecturers this year to ensure learners received their national qualifications, based on their professional judgement of demonstrated attainment.

13. As noted above, [Redacted s38(1)(b)] advises that support staff unions are seeking parity for their members by requesting that college management meet the cost of an additional £400 payment to support staff. The EA have advised they are unable to meet this cost. The Minister set out within his response to [Redacted s38(1)(b)] that any settlement reached between college management and trade unions needs to be affordable for both the college sector and the Scottish Government, as the principal funder of the college sector.

Now that our guidance has published, I am working on the grant letter so we have this in place for when we start receiving returns from colleges. Thank you for sharing your draft grant letter with us, it has provided a really helpful basis for ours.

We are using a different power to make payment to colleges and I assume we will need to clear our grant letter with our own Finance Business Partner and lawyers, as per the normal grant process. I just wanted to check if the draft you shared is the final cleared version and if it might be helpful to copy your finance colleagues and lawyers into my request of ours, in case they have any questions that have been addressed when developing your grant letter? I've only really made small changes to the draft you shared that reflects the slightly different position for lecturers.
