You may be aware that Crown Estate Scotland announced the outcome of lease option awards for the ScotWind leasing round for offshore wind energy earlier today. ScotWind is the first offshore wind leasing round in Scotland in a decade and the first devolved leasing round in Scottish Waters. The results show the huge opportunity that Scotland has to transform its energy system and move towards a net zero economy through the development of offshore wind energy.

Highlights include:

- 17 projects have been selected out of a total of 74 applications, and have now been offered option agreements which reserve the rights to specific areas of seabed.
- Around £700m will be paid by the successful applicants in option fees and passed to the Scottish Government for public spending.
- Initial indications suggest at least £1bn supply chain investment in Scotland for every 1GW of capacity proposed.
- The combined total ambition for offshore wind capacity generated from the successful projects is significant (25GW.) These are projects' currently stated aspirations and we will now commence the consenting process for these proposals, in line with the Scottish Government's sectoral marine planning process, which will ultimately determine the scale of development that can be permitted, starting with the planning assumptions outlined in the current iteration of the Sectoral Marine Plan.

The forthcoming pipeline of ScotWind projects presents a major opportunity for both Scotland and the UK to achieve our challenging net zero targets and further decarbonise our energy system. We also recognise that this will have implications for Scotland's rich marine natural resource and it

will be vitally important that we manage this transformative development in a way which maintains responsible stewardship of the marine environment, is nature positive and is consistent with the delivery of our commitments to protect and restore biodiversity.

I am therefore keen to meet with you as soon as possible to explain the ScotWind process and our approach to managing this major initiative as it rolls out over the next few years. This will no doubt be the first of many engagements as we are keen to maintain a constructive, collaborative and open dialogue with all interests throughout the delivery of the ScotWind projects.

To this end, I'd be delighted if you and any other SELink members who you think may have an interest were able to attend a Teams meeting on ScotWind with myself on [date and time.]
