Shifty SNP hiding legal responsibility for steelworks clean up

Scottish Liberal Democrat economy spokesperson Willie Rennie has today branded Scottish Government ministers "shifty" after they yet again refused to clarify why the Scottish Government briefly took ownership of the Dalzell steelworks

In 2016, the Scottish Government facilitated the sale of Dalzell Steelworks in Motherwell, buying it off Tata Steel before almost immediately selling it on to current owners, Liberty Steel.

Under pressure from Mr Rennie to explain why it was necessary for the government to take ownership of the site, Business mini ster Ivan McKee claimed: "Tata Steel, Liberty House and the Scottish Government – were all aligned in agreeing a transaction that secured the earliest realisation of the commercial and wider economic benefits of the deal, and the selected structure was the best available means to deliver this" but refused to offer any explanation as to what benefits there were to Tata Steel and Liberty House of such an unusual arrangement.

The structure of the deal has prompted speculation that Scottish Government ministers promised to protect Tata from future costs of Dalzell, including the liability for environmental clean-up costs.

The parliamentary questions come on the heels of emails released under freedom of information legislation to the Scottish Liberal Democrats in which officials emphasised the need to clarify the situation as soon as possible because otherwise they will "compound the difficulties caused by rushed advice and decision in 2016."

Commenting, Willie Rennie said:

"We have known for some time that the Scottish Government was briefly the legal owners of the Dalzell steel works but shifty SNP ministers are still unable to give a straight answer about why this was necessary.

"If ministers have promised to protect Tata from the costs of cleaning up the Dalzell site then taxpayers could be on the hook for tens of millions of pounds.

"If this is not the case, then you would think ministers would be biting my arm off to tell me.

"Fundamentally the problem here is an untrustworthy SNP government which prefers to operate in the shadows than tell the truth about the deals they sign with taxpayers' money.

"Sooner or later these dealings are going to be dragged into the light. The choice for the SNP is whether this process is swift and transparent or slow and painful.

"Ministers should come to parliament and spell out just what benefits there were to all parties involved from the Scottish Government taking on ownership of the steelworks."



FOI shows First Minister was warned about "very significant" risks before Gupta deal

Scottish Liberal Democrat economy spokesperson Willie Rennie MSP has spoken in parliament today, labelling the SNP Government as "reckless" after a freedom of information (FOI) request showed ministers were warned by a top official that their 2016 steel deal with businessman Sanjeev Gupta risked "very significant political, financial, state aid and legal issues".

Mr Rennie raised the issues in the chamber of the Scottish Parliament in a debate on inward investment and trade.

The Gupta Family Group Alliance (GFG) is currently under investigation by the UK's Serious Fraud Office, with its auditors quitting last week claiming they were unable to complete long overdue accounts.

The new documents, published on the Scottish Government website, show the advice given by Director of Economic Development to ministers including Nicola Sturgeon and John Swinney before the back-to-back deal.

They reveal:

- The official told the First Minister that the specific deal carried "very significant political, financial, state aid and legal issues."
- SNP ministers were warned about due diligence amid "less and poorer quality information than would have wished to see" about Liberty, that their state aid position was "untested" and that they did not have a business case "that sets out a rationale for our intervention".
- The First Minister was told before signing in 2016 that the terms of the "untested", "novel" deal "carries significant state aid and financial risk", yet Ivan McKee told Parliament in 2021 that "it was not our intention to sign up to a contract clause which may not comply with state aid requirements".
- Ministers were warned that the government could become liable for the environmental clean-up costs at the steelworks in the "small theoretical risk" of

Liberty ever being liquidated, but the First Minister was told it could just "sit there unrestored for years" if necessary.

- TATA were reticent to sell the steelworks to Liberty directly because they did not know enough about Liberty or its business plan, and were already in discussions with another potential buyer.
- The price of TATA changing its mind about doing that deal with Greybull, who were said to be "now more positive" about reopening the sites, was for the Scottish Government to agree to the indemnity that meant taking on TATA's "past and future" liabilities.
- The First Minister, John Swinney, Fergus Ewing and the Lord Advocate were all personally asked to make a decision on the deal.

Mr Rennie said:

"The Scottish Government have been reckless, leaving the taxpayer on the hook for millions and throwing the interests of workers to the wind.

"When I raised this with Ivan McKee today, he laughed and tried to silence my concerns. He dismissed those workers, he ignored those taxpayers and ran with an SNP spin machine that refuses to take responsibility for its carelessness.

"We now know that the government was warned about the major ramifications of the deal, from environmental clean-up costs to the uncertainty around state aid compliance. We now know that the government was warned that they did not have a clear rationale for intervening. Despite all of this the First Minister decided to go ahead.

"It smacks of a government which is willing to throw taxpayers and workers under the bus in negotiations with big business.

"Between the resignations, the Serious Fraud Office investigation and the unaudited accounts, you would expect the Scottish Government to be taking a close interest in what is going on.

"That is why I am calling for an urgent parliamentary statement on this specific issue so that the SNP Government can give clear answers about what they signed up to and the consequences. Millions of pounds, skilled jobs and the credibility of the Scottish Government's industrial strategy are at stake."

Gupta admits "serious concerns" over whether Lochaber smelter can continue

Scottish Liberal Democrat economy spokesperson Willie Rennie has today written to the Finance Secretary to ask what will happen to Scottish Government financial guarantees in the event that the Lochaber aluminium smelter ceases to be a going concern or is sold by financier Sanjeev Gupta and urge them to make a statement to parliament.

His letter follows the publication of Alvance British Aluminium's unaudited accounts, in which Mr Gupta outlines "material uncertainties that cast significant doubt on the company's ability to continue as a going concern." The accounts reveal that the firm lost £4m last year.

Mr Gupta acquired the Lochaber plant and its accompanying hydropower station in 2016. However, documents filed at Companies House reveal that while the Scottish Government provided guarantees of up to half a billion for the deal, Mr Gupta put just £5 towards it.

The metal magnate's business empire is currently under criminal investigation for suspected fraud and money laundering.

Mr Rennie said:

"These late and unaudited accounts are another worrying sign about the underlying health of the Lochaber smelter.

"Despite flashy promises of 2,000 jobs and a new billet plant nothing has materialised even though the SNP Government has provided hundreds of millions of pounds of financial guarantees. Given Mr Gupta's record it is looking more and more like the government were duped.

"There is now a significant risk that the firm is either sold or collapses as a result of the losses at Lochaber and the wider group's financial difficulties. The Scottish Government will need to set out what will happen to the financial guarantees that it has provided, what will happen to the workers at the plant and whether it will be taking an active role in securing new ownership and the future of the site.

"The SNP Government must finally be open about the financial agreements with Sanjeev Gupta and report to parliament with urgency."

Dear John,

I am writing to raise my concerns over the future of the Lochaber smelter, currently trading under the name Alvance British Aluminium.

Late and unaudited accounts published last week reveal that the firm lost £4m last year and note "material uncertainties that cast significant doubt on the company's ability to continue as a going concern."

Sanjeev Gupta, a significant financial partner of the Scottish Government, is sending a warning signal that the company may collapse as a result of the losses at Lochaber and the wider group's financial difficulties.

The Scottish Government provided hundreds of millions of pounds of financial guarantees in exchange for the promise of 2,000 jobs at the site. However a spokesperson for your government admitted last week that just 40 new jobs have been created since 2016.

There is now a significant risk that the firm is either sold or collapses so I am writing to ask you to to set out what will happen to those financial guarantees and whether your government will be taking an active role in securing new ownership and the future of the site.

I would like to urge you to deliver a statement to parliament on this matter at the earliest possible opportunity. This is a matter of significant public interest and one which should be properly scrutinised by parliament.

FOLLOW UP QUERIES

1) Where did the "trading profitably" come from. Latest accounts show pre-tax losses soared to £4.05m.

2) In return for the guarantees, the Scottish Government was supposed to receive an annual 'insurance' premium for the guarantee throughout the 25 years. It was valued at £21.4m at the time of the agreement, but as of 2020/21, it has been valued at 'nil'. Why is that?

SUGGESTED LINES

A Scottish Government spokesperson said:

"As a condition of the Lochaber guarantee the Scottish Government receives up-to-date management accounting information which is reviewed with Deloitte.

"The Scottish Government owes a duty of care to the business to protect its commercial information but the business has confirmed the smelter is benefitting from recent buoyant aluminium prices and is currently operating profitably.

"Account information that is not commercially sensitive will be in the public domain when the company publishes its next annual statutory accounts at Companies House.

"All guarantee fees due to the Scottish Government are up-to-date. For budget planning purposes, the Scottish Government takes a prudent approach to how future fee income is valued."

Gupta admits "serious concerns" over whether Lochaber smelter can continue

Scottish Liberal Democrat economy spokesperson Willie Rennie has today written to the Finance Secretary to ask what will happen to Scottish Government financial guarantees in the event that the Lochaber aluminium smelter is sold by financier Sanjeev Gupta and urge her to make a statement to parliament.

His letter follows the publication of Alvance British Aluminium's unaudited accounts, in which Mr Gupta outlines "material uncertainties that cast significant doubt on the company's ability to continue as a going concern." The accounts reveal that the firm lost £4m last year.

Mr Gupta acquired the Lochaber plant and its accompanying hydropower station in 2016. However, documents filed at Companies House reveal that while the Scottish Government provided guarantees of up to half a billion for the deal, Mr Gupta put just £5 towards it.

The metal magnate's business empire is currently under criminal investigation for suspected fraud and money laundering.

Mr Rennie said:

"These late and unaudited accounts are another worrying sign about the underlying health of the Lochaber smelter.

"Despite flashy promises of 2,000 jobs and a new billet plant nothing has materialised even though the SNP Government has provided hundreds of millions of pounds of financial guarantees. Given Mr Gupta's record it is looking more and more like the government were duped.

"There is now a significant risk that the firm is either sold or collapses as a result of the losses at Lochaber and the wider group's financial difficulties. The Scottish Government will need to set out what will happen to the financial guarantees that it has provided and whether it will be taking an active role in securing new ownership and the future of the site.

"The SNP Government must finally be open about the financial agreements with Sanjeev Gupta and report to parliament with urgency."

QUERY

I noticed a parliamentary question had been asked about meetings this year with GFG Alliance. In it, Ivan McKee states ministers met with officials from GFG Alliance three times in the first three months of the year but since then there have been no meetings. Obviously there have been concerns raised about GFG's involvement in the Lochaber smelter given the taxpayer-funded guarantee handed to the company by the SG in 2016 to purchase the plant and the business being under investigation for alleged fraud. It has also been claimed just 50 of the 2000 jobs promised at the facility have actually been created.

Given that, I wanted to know if further meetings had been held but not disclosed by the minister (and if so, what reasons there were for not disclosing these). If no further meetings had been held, I want to know why that is the case given the concerns surrounding GFG Alliance as noted above.

Comments from Monica Lennon

"The fact that SNP ministers haven't bothered to meet with GFG Alliance for five months will raise eyebrows, as this questionable financial deal could jeopardise millions of pounds of public money.

"Scottish taxpayers deserve to know that the Scottish Government is being open about its arrangements with GFG Alliance, after all, Sanjeev Gupta's business empire is being probed by the Serious Fraud Squad for suspected fraud and money laundering. It doesn't get much more serious than that.

It has also been claimed just 50 of the 2000 jobs promised at the facility have actually been created.

Given that, I wanted to know if further meetings had been held but not disclosed by the minister (and if so, what reasons there were for not disclosing these). If no further meetings had been held, I want to know why that is the case given the concerns surrounding GFG Alliance as noted above.



Scottish Liberal Democrat economy spokesperson Willie Rennie MSP has today condemned the Scottish Government for rushing the deal it made in 2016 with Dalzell steelworks, following a Scottish Liberal Democrat Freedom of Information request which showed the government admitting to the "rushed" deal between Tata and itself in a series of emails.

In response, the government provided an email in which an official described "picking through what transpired back in 2016...challenging to say the least."

In a further email to the Director General (Economy), another official emphasised the need to clarify the situation as soon as possible because otherwise they will "compound the difficulties caused by rushed advice and decision in 2016."

In 2016, the Scottish Government facilitated the sale of Dalzell Steelworks in Motherwell, buying it off Tata Steel before almost immediately selling it on to current owners, Liberty Steel.

As part of the deal, Scottish Government ministers seemingly promised to protect Tata from future costs of Dalzell, including the liability for environmental clean-up costs. A subsequent review concluded that this indemnity may have been a breach of state aid rules.

Commenting on the emails, Mr Rennie said:

"The SNP's handling of this entire affair almost leaves me speechless. It smacks of a government with no robust or informed industrial strategy, and one which is willing to throw the taxpayer under the bus in negotiations with big business.

"We knew that the government were working at what a source at the time called "breakneck speed," determined to get something done by the May 2016 parliament election. We also knew that Tata was determined to get something done, by passing on its exposure for clean-ups.

"In spite of this, Nicola Sturgeon had the audacity to boast that her deal showed "the art of the possible."

"The only "art" the government have mastered is to let cynical political interests fold to the pressures of big business. Now they're having to admit that.



Rennie: Ministers must end secrecy and explain Gupta links

Scottish Liberal Democrat economy spokesperson Willie Rennie MSP has today called on the Scottish Government to explain the deal it made with Sanjeev Gupta, chief executive of Liberty Steel, following reports that the metal tycoon contributed just £5 to his acquisition of the Lochaber smelting plant in the Highlands.

In 2016, Mr Gupta acquired the Lochaber plant, purchasing it for a total price of £330 million.

However, documents filed at Companies House reveal that while the Scottish Government provided guarantees of up to half a billion for the deal, Mr Gupta put just £5 towards it.

The metal magnate's business empire is currently under criminal investigation for suspected fraud and money laundering. The Scottish Government has provided hundreds of millions of pounds of financial guarantees to the GFG alliance at Lochaber and is exposed for clean-up costs at its Lanarkshire steel mills. However, it has refused to set out what steps it took to protect Scottish public finances.

Responding to the latest developments, Mr Rennie commented:


"The SNP government has been gullible once again. Two thousand jobs were promised by Gupta which have not been delivered. Hundreds of millions of pounds of financial backing were provided by the Scottish Government, but only £5 from Gupta.

LINES TO TAKE

A Scottish Government spokesperson said:

"It was absolutely right for the Scottish Government to provide the Lochaber guarantee to protect jobs in the region, underpin additional investment at the site, and promote industry in Scotland. Supporting the strategically important steel and aluminium sectors and the highlyskilled jobs they provide is a priority, while ensuring value for money to the public purse.

"We are unable to comment on a live investigation by the Serious Fraud Office. This relates to loans made under the UK Government's Coronavirus Large Business Interruption Loan Scheme administered by the British Business Bank.

"There has been no call on the Scottish Government guarantee, no debt is owed to the Scottish Government under the Lochaber guarantee, all guarantee fees are up-to-date and we hold a comprehensive suite of securities in respect of the Lochaber guarantee. If the guarantee were to be called on, the assets secured to the Scottish Government would more than cover the cost of the guarantee.

"The net present value of the remaining power purchase agreement revenue stream over the remaining 20 years is £284 million, while recent accounts valued the assets at Fort William at £438 million.

"The Lochaber guarantee is compliant with EU state aid rules and was approved by the Scottish Parliament's Finance and Constitution Committee, which has cross party representation, following appropriate due diligence. GFG is committed to investing in Lochaber to secure the future of the operations, creating new high quality employment."

As discussed, we're publishing a story tomorrow on the latest details around the Lochaber guarantee - specifically on the following aspects of it.

The main points of the story will state:

- It is understood the Scottish Government was advised that state aid rules may have been broken with the agreement around the Lochaber guarantee

- The total security the Scottish Government had in the initial agreement was at least £162m and at most £172m, compared to the exposure of £586m

- The fee for the guarantee was set by assuming Liberty House's credit rating provided by CARE India could be translated to a Moody's credit rating would be similar to Ba 3 (or BB-). My source says this is not a responsible way to assess credit-worthiness.

- The fee is worth c£1.1m per year and £26.8m over the 25 year period, at a rate of 3.05% cost of finance (according to the EY report)

- The smelter was only profitable if and when the alloy wheels plant was brought online, which never happened, raising further questions about whether GFG abided by the terms of the guarantee agreement



New information on 2016 steel rescue deal

Parliament informed of potential State aid issue.

A Scottish Government review of the 2016 rescue deal which saved more than 100 jobs and retained steel plate production in Scotland has identified a potential State aid issue.

The development relates to a single clause in the arrangement with Tata Steel, via its former subsidiary Longs Steel UK, under which the Scottish Government facilitated the ownership transfer of the Dalzell and Clydebridge steelworks. There is no impact on the wider agreement or Liberty Steel's current ownership and operation of the plants.

The review considers that Scottish Ministers' commitment to indemnify Tata Steel, as the previous owner, from certain past, present or future liabilities arising from the sites may not comply with State aid rules and would therefore be unenforceable. This would mean that in the unlikely event of the indemnity being called upon, no money would be paid out by the Scottish Government.

The issue was identified during contingency planning undertaken in response to the administration of Greensill Capital UK. There is no adverse impact on the public purse and no money has been paid under the Scottish Government's indemnity.

The Scottish Parliament, Audit Scotland and Tata Steel have been informed and discussions are continuing. The Scottish Government will ask the UK Government, as the former member state, to inform the European Commission.

Business Minister Ivan McKee said:

"The rescue deal facilitated by the Scottish Government in 2016 was agreed at pace and in good faith to maintain employment at Dalzell and Clydebridge. Without our intervention the likelihood of anyone being employed producing steel plate in Scotland today would be very slim. The decision to support the steel industry in Scotland was, and still, is the right thing to do.

"The contract arrangement has now been re-examined as part of the ongoing contingency planning process and it is considered that the clause providing the indemnity to Tata Steel may represent State aid, even though no money has, or may ever, change hands.

"In the interests of transparency we have made the interested parties aware of these findings. However, it is important to emphasise that this matter does not affect the integrity of the wider agreement struck in 2016 or impact Liberty Steel's ownership and running of the steelworks.

"We will continue supportive dialogue with Tata Steel and the company has access to our officials as it requires. Most importantly we will continue to support the production of steel plate in Scotland and help our steel communities to prosper and to harness new opportunities that develop."

Background

The Business Minister's statement to Parliament.

In March 2016 the Scottish Government facilitated the transfer of ownership of the Dalzell and Clydebridge steelworks from Longs Steel UK (then a subsidiary of Tata Steel) to Liberty House to ensure the sites remained open and save jobs. The back–to-back sale saw the Government buy the sites for £1 and immediately sell them to Liberty House. Liberty House took on all existing liabilities and the Scottish Government agreed to indemnify Longs Steel UK from future claims. In turn Liberty House and its parent company provided a continuing and unlimited indemnity to hold the Scottish Government harmless from all historic and future liabilities.

At the time of negotiating the deal it was acknowledged that the back-to-back indemnities approach was untested due to the novel approach of the transaction in the UK.

The Scottish Government's indemnity to Tata Steel, arising from its ownership of Longs Steel UK, covered certain future liabilities arising from the sites that might pass to the company. These included any share of environmental remediation costs, although many factors would need to happen before such a scenario came to fruition.

The original transaction was reported to the Scottish Parliament in 2016.
