AGENDA ITEM 2: UPDATE ON THE DEVOLUTION OF WINTER HEATING BENEFITS AND LEGISLATIVE TIMETABLE

- Previous intention was to introduce like-for-like Scottish benefits to replace both Winter Fuel Payment (WFP) and Cold Weather Payment (CWP) in Winter 2021.
- Work on the Scottish replacements for Cold Weather Payments and Winter Fuel Payment was temporarily paused due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- We have now committed to replacing the UK Governments CWP with a new Low Income Winter Heating Assistance (LIWHA) payment in Winter 2022
- We will also replace the UK Government's Winter Fuel Payment (WFP) in winter 2024. We will consult on proposals for that benefit separately.

<u>What is Low Income Winter Heating Assistance?</u>

- Single annual payment of £50 to replace the current DWP Cold Weather Payment in Scotland from winter 2022.
- Eligibility based on receipt of low income benefits during an annual qualifying week; no longer triggered by a period of cold weather.
- It will provide a guaranteed payment to around 400,000 lowincome households currently eligible for Cold Weather Payments – an investment of around £20 million every year

Consultation

- We are now consulting on the proposals for Low Income Winter Heating Assistance.
- The consultation is live and will be open for responses until 23 February 2022.
- We intend to principally to gather views on:
 - Policy aim: LIWHA will provide more money, greater dependability and better targeting.
 - Removing weather dependency.
 - Eligibility criteria (qualifying benefits).
 - Value of payment.
 - ► Key annual dates September qualifying week and February payment.
 - ► Unintended consequences.
- We want to hear from both the households who have applied for and benefited from Cold Weather Payments and key stakeholders with an interest in this benefit.



Policy Intention

- Should we replace CWP with a new benefit whose eligibility is based solely on receipt of a low income benefit and not on reaching a specific temperature for a period of time?
- Is Low Income Winter Heating Assistance an appropriate name for this new payment?
- Do you think this is an effective way for the Scottish Government to provide support towards winter heating costs for people on low incomes?



Eligibility

- Should we continue to identify a person's eligibility through the award of other qualifying benefits?
- Should we retain the current qualifying benefits to indicate eligibility?
- Are the eligibility criteria for LIWHA clear?



Amount and Format of Payment

- ▶ What are your thoughts on the proposed rate of £50 for LIWHA?
- Should this continue to be a cash payment?
- When is the most appropriate time during the winter period to make these payments?

Are there any potential unintended consequences which we have not considered in these proposals?
