Just a quick follow up to share some suggested points of key things we'd be grateful for the Cabinet Secretary to speak about, but please do amend these to suit the Cabinet Secretary:

- Great to be at the University of Glasgow's Mazumdar-Shaw Advanced Research Centre (ARC)
  which is bringing together world-class researchers to collaborate and drive innovation from
  the research base in key areas for Scotland such as quantum technology & semiconductors,
  life sciences, digital chemistry and cultural/creative economies.
- Universities like Glasgow are driving growth for Scotland through their research and activity.
   <u>A 2021 report by London Economics</u> found that the University contributes £4.4bn of
   economic impact to the economy and I've seen met today some of the researchers at the
   heart of this impact.
- It's good to hear the University's plans to foster entrepreneurship and spinouts, building on relationships with major industry partners and stakeholders like the NHS and the Scottish Government to drive opportunities for innovation. For example, the Glasgow Riverside Innovation District (or GRID) of which the University is a major partner, was announced in March 2023 as Scotland's first ever whole-systems innovation demonstrator. The GRID Discovery initiative will see the University partner with industry, Government, academia and the local community to identify a number of R&D collaboration projects and draw on the University's world-leading research capabilities to drive impactful innovation at pace. The Discovery programme is aimed at attracting inward investment, creating access to good quality jobs, and in developing a skills pipeline to build on the region's strengths and support productive, thriving places.
- To further welcome the approach taken by the University to use its role as a civic institution to address some of the major health, environmental and socioeconomic challenges facing Scotland, whilst being an innovator in key technologies. This approach is central to the ambitions of a wellbeing economy, driving inclusive growth for the benefit of society and our planet (for example the Cabinet Secretary will see during his visit how we're using quantum technology to drive investment in Scotland whilst applying this in real-world clinical settings for patients and using it to develop cleaner solutions to support the transition to net zero)

In the meantime, please see below a brief summary of semiconductors & quantum technology and the applications Cab Sec will hear about and see during his visit.

## **Semiconductors & Quantum Technology**

The University of Glasgow lies at the heart of a Semiconductor and Quantum Technologies research and innovation ecosystem of global significance, bringing together world-leading academic research with a cluster of innovative companies spanning sectors such as photonics, chip-scale components, precision instrumentation, defence and life sciences.

A semiconductor is a material product usually comprised of silicon, which conducts electricity more than an insulator, such as glass, but less than a pure conductor, such as copper or aluminium. They are found in thousands of electronic devices and used in the manufacture of various kinds of electronic devices, including diodes, transistors, integrated circuits, smartphones, computers, gaming hardware, medical equipment and appliances. Their conductivity and other properties can be altered with the introduction of impurities, called 'doping', to meet the specific needs of the electronic component in which it resides. They are sometimes referred to as 'chips' within electronic devices and their actual function includes the amplification of signals, switching, and energy conversion. The semiconductor industry is a hugely important global sector, particularly for the US and China, with semiconductor components found in a wide range of consumer and commercial products, from vehicles to computers to mobile devices and personal electronics.

Scotland's Silicon Glen had its origins in the electronics business with Ferranti establishing a plant in Edinburgh in 1943, relocating facilities from Manchester during the Second World War. Companies like IBM began to establish a presence in the Central Belt in the 1950s and the emphasis on electronics came about due to the decline in traditional Scottish heavy industries such as shipbuilding. Like Silicon Valley in the USA as a leader in semiconductors, Silicon Glen also had a significant influence in semiconductor design and manufacturing, with companies like Motorola and National Semiconductor operating in Scotland in the 60s. The heavy dependency on electronics manufacturing hit Silicon Glen hard after the financial crisis and since then Scotland has had less of a presence on the international semiconductor scene. Quantum technology uses the principles of quantum mechanics (the physics of subatomic particles) to improve a vast range of technologies. As discussed, I'm doing a story for tomorrow on figures in the GERS document which show SG spending on benefits has increased at a faster rate than UKG spending on benefits in Scotland, while tax income has grown faster in Scotland than across the UK.

Scottish Government social security spending in 22/23 was £4.5 billion, up 13 per cent on 21/22.

Spending on universal credit, housing benefit and other DWP benefits increased at the slower rate of 9.1 per cent, to £7.5 billion.

Revenue from land and buildings transaction tax increased by 5.4 per cent to £858 million in 22/23. This growth rate was more than four times faster than stamp duty income in the rest of the UK, which increased by 1.3 per cent to £19.1 billion.

Scottish income tax receipts were up 13 per cent at £16.6 billion, compared to +10.5 per cent to £248.7 billion across the rest of the UK.

I'd appreciate any comment on this. Do ministers intend to continue to increase spending on benefits at a faster rate than the UK Government and will there be more tax rises to fund this?
