FIREWORKS AND PYROTECHNIC ARTICLES (SCOTLAND) BILL: TIMETABLE

Purpose

Background

- 3. My email of 4 April set out the challenges with the current timetable, particularly in relation to the revised dates for the stage 1 report being published by the Criminal Justice Committee and the subsequent stage 1 debate. Following approval from the Minister for Community Safety to seek a change to the deadline and debate for stage 1, officials have worked to identify potential alternative timetabling options with the aim of ensuring the Bill passes the required parliamentary stages in advance of summer recess.
- 4. Securing an alternative timetable has proved very challenging, and we have set out four potential options below for consideration in advance of your meeting.

Criminal Justice Committee

5. Following the discussion at Committee during the Minister for Community Safety's evidence session, which criticised the timetable and perceived lack of time for parliamentary scrutiny, a subsequent discussion between officials and the lead committee clerk has reinforced concerns that members have with the pace at which the Bill is being progressed with an indication that some members have likened it to the Bill stages of the since repealed Offensive Behaviour at Football and Threatening Communications (Scotland) Act 2012, which was criticised for being pushed through parliament too quickly and not allowing adequate time for proper parliamentary scrutiny. This discussion also indicated that it is very unlikely that only one day for stage 2 amendments will be sufficient; and therefore, as originally planned, we need to build in time for at least two stage 2 sitting days.
