INVITATION TO TYPE 26 STEEL CUTTING CEREMONY 4th APRIL 2023

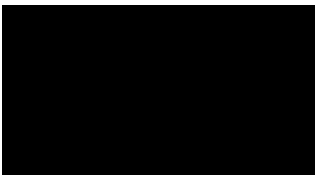
