#### **Connectivity with Heathrow**

#### Dundee – Heathrow

Dundee's air service to London City has been moved to Heathrow Airport with effect from 6 May – the Scottish Government part-funds this PSO. Loganair has described this as a "gamechanger" for regional connectivity, as the move to Heathrow Airport brings a range of global flight connections to customers who can also benefit from Loganair's multiple interline and codeshare agreements. This includes a long-standing relationship with British Airways. This route also connects Sumburgh and Kirkwall with Heathrow via Dundee.

#### Aviation connectivity event

Heathrow work alongside the Scottish Chambers of Commerce (SCC) and the Scottish Council for Development and Industry (SCDI) and were welcoming senior leaders from Scotland, in partnership with the SCC, to a discussion on the importance of aviation to connectivity, trade, and investment, in May.

#### Heathrow passenger numbers

61.6 million passengers used Heathrow in 2022, which is around 76% of 2019 levels. Passenger growth at Heathrow continues to be supported by larger, fuller aircraft as the recovery from Covid continues.
