CENTRE OF TEACHING EXCELLENCE

Priority and Purpose

 Routine - to provide initial advice on high level options for the creation of a centre of teaching excellence, as part of the reform process, which would focus on high-quality pedagogy in our schools.

Recommendation

2. Recommends that you: consider this advice and provide feedback on the options provided.

Context and Issues

- 3. It is recognised internationally that, along with leadership, the quality of teaching is the key factor within schools in improving children and young people's learning and the outcomes they achieve. Research evidence also indicates that quality of teaching is the most important lever schools have to improve the attainment of children and young people.
- 4. Excellent teaching is happening in schools across Scotland. Children and young people are achieving well, and the gap is narrowing, but more can and should be done to ensure that all children and young people benefit from excellent teaching. Ensuring every teacher is supported in delivering high-quality teaching is essential to achieving the best outcomes for all children and young people, particularly those most impacted by poverty.
- 5. Quality indicator 2.3 Learning, teaching and assessment from *How Good is Our School?* (4th edition) includes the theme "Quality of teaching". Quality indicator 2.3 is included in all school inspections which enable HMI to provide evidence for the National Improvement Framework. In light of reflections from the Cabinet Secretary on this paper, further information can be sought from HMIE colleagues [redacted s.29(1)(a) (policy formulation)].

- 6. Overall teacher numbers remain at historically high levels. Scotland has the most teachers-perpupil compared to the rest of the UK, and education spend per person is higher than in England and Wales. Overall pupil teacher ratios also remain at near record levels with the current ratio of pupils-to-teachers maintained at 13.2, its lowest level since 2009.
- 7. [redacted s.29(1)(a) (policy formulation)].
- 8. It has been 20 years since the Teachers' Agreement was implemented following the McCrone report, and over 10 years since 'Teaching Scotland's Future' was authored by Graham Donaldson, setting out a wide range of recommendations relating to teacher education in Scotland. [redacted s.29(1)(a) (policy formulation)]
- 9. While the work on developing structural and system reform (OECD, Muir, Hayward, National Discussion, Withers) has focused on bringing greater coherence to the Scottish education and skills system, [redacted s.30 (b)(i) (free and frank advice)]. High Quality is a key principle in the Tertiary Purpose and Principles work, however, and while the recommendations made by Hayward are broad, the report does recognise that any changes to qualifications and assessment must be underpinned by high-quality teaching and makes recommendations about how that could be achieved.
- 10. In establishing a refreshed and renewed approach to education and skills reform, the Cabinet Secretary has an opportunity to position necessary structural and system reform in the context of a renewed approach to excellence in learning and teaching. This advice provides background on the current landscape and approach and options for the Cabinet Secretary to consider in relation to enhancing the support for high quality teaching.

The current system

GTCS Professional Standards

- 12. Scotland has a graduate teaching workforce with high professional standards, underpinned by a mandatory national registration scheme which is designed to ensure the high quality of our teaching profession. The professional standards provide the framework for all teachers in Scotland to enhance their professionalism and ensure rigour and challenge that supports a resilient and enabled profession confident in the skills, knowledge and values needed to enable Scotland's children and young people to develop skills for learning, life and work.
- 13. Among other aspects, registered teachers are required to demonstrate a depth of knowledge and understanding of how to plan for effective assessment, teaching and learning, in order to support the needs of every learner and how to adapt planning approaches to ensure that the needs of every learner are effectively addressed. It is important to note that the introduction of Professional Update and the new General Teaching Council for Scotland (GTCS) Standards played a crucial role in requiring increased engagement with professional learning. It is felt that the new Standards provided coherence to Career Long Professional Learning (CLPL) through all career stages and a shared language around CLPL and pedagogy.

14. GTC Scotland is required by the Public Services Reform (General Teaching Council for Scotland) Order 2011 to determine provisions about the admission of individuals to courses resulting in a recognised teaching qualifications for teachers of school education. [redacted s.30 (b)(i) (free and frank advice)].

Initial teacher education

- 15. ITE is the recognised qualification for individuals seeking registration as a school teacher in Scotland. There are currently 11 higher education institutions offering ITE programmes across Scotland.
- 16. All ITE programmes across Scotland are accredited by the GTCS, and must ensure that student teachers meet the requirements of the Standard for Provisional Registration.
- 17. ITE is underpinned by theoretical knowledge of purposes, principles and practices of education, which supports student teachers to develop skills in curriculum, pedagogy and assessment in order to meet the needs and interests of children and young people. ITE programmes allow student teachers to develop an in depth understanding of the complex processes of learning by engaging with theory, research and practice.

What do we know about the quality of ITE?

- 18. The report, Measuring Quality in Initial Teacher Education¹, published April 2023, was a six-year, Scottish Government-funded study of the quality of ITE, involving all 11 University providers of ITE along with the GTCS. MQuITE is the largest ITE study in Scotland to date, representing the views of 946 early career teachers from the 2018 and 2019 cohorts across 1,414 individual survey response. It has resulted in a comprehensive study contributing to our understanding of the quality of initial teacher education in Scotland.
- 19. Overall, the survey findings tell us that there are no specific areas of crisis but do help to give a clearer picture of confidence and self-efficacy across a number of measures which will help us to target specific areas of programmes, Teacher Induction Scheme and general early phase support in a more targeted way.
- 20. However, the report does highlight that not all teachers assigned school-based mentor roles possess the necessary knowledge, skills, or motivation to support student teachers appropriately.

Career-long professional learning

21. It is important that we maintain our teachers' professionalism, and support them to engage in CLPL to further increase their skills to support young peoples' learning needs. Since the McCrone Review, a required minimum of 35 hours of professional development per year has been included in the Scottish Negotiating Committee for Teachers Handbook. [redacted s.30 (b)(i) (free and frank advice)].

- 22. Education Scotland (ES) has the strategic responsibility for Professional Learning and Leadership Development at a national level and aims to ensure that teachers and education professionals are supported by a streamlined and coherent professional learning offer. Central to this is the national Model of Professional Learning which provides guidance on what professional learning should look like for education professionals. It identifies the key principles and features of effective professional learning, offering strategic guidance for education professionals and leaders on how to support, structure and plan it.
- 23. The Professional Learning and Leadership Directorate (a team of approximately 18) in ES has its main focus on professional learning for leadership including the following programmes:
 - Aspiring to Middle Leadership
 - Educator Leadership programme
 - Into Headship
 - In Headship
 - Excellence in headship
- 24. The model for wider professional learning, reflecting national priorities and regional or local need, can also include delivery from ES staff across the wider organisation. Professional learning is also commissioned and delivered by Regional Improvement Collaboratives (RICs), LAs, schools etc. ES can offer bespoke professional learning at the request of LAs/RICs. [redacted s.29(1)(a) (policy formulation)].
- 25. Professional learning is also delivered by Teaching Unions, professional organisations, and through universities. [redacted s.29(1)(a) (policy formulation)].
- 26. In addition, in recognition of the importance of linking curriculum areas with pedagogy there have been calls from organisations such as the Institute of Physics for additional subject specific professional learning. [redacted s.29(1)(a) (policy formulation)].

Hello and thanks for dealing with this for me. As it's an explanatory piece rather than some news reporting I don't necessarily need abig formal comment to each of these questions and in most cases just the information would be absolutely fine. If you prefer to provide that on an unattributed basis that's not a problem and if you also wish to include an actual comment then feel free to send that through as well. As I say the piece is very much just going to be framed around trying to explain what this actually means - the nuts and bolts type of things I suppose.

The first issue is the surprise nature of the announcement. The EIS, and individuals I have spoken to in teacher education at universities, have said that the government did not discuss this with them beforehand. Did the government discussed this with anyone beforehand and if so who? I imagine discussions would have had to have taken place at least the GTCS and presumably with at least the head of education Scotland but I would appreciate clarification on that point, especially as the way in which this has been made public has been raised with me.

I'd also be keen to know where the idea came from? I'm assuming Jenny Gilruth didn't wake up one morning and decide this is a good idea. Have submissions come from outside organisations and/or individuals? Has expert opinion been sought? Given that this wasn't really on anyone's radar, I've had several people raising concerns about the origins of the new policy.

Q: With whom had the policy been discussed before it was announced?

Q: The government says it wants to work in partnership with teachers, and Jenny Gilruth has spoken of wishing to reset the relationship with the profession. Is a unilateral announcement like this the sort of thing that teachers can expect to see as part of that process?

People also want to know where exactly this new body will sit within the structures of Scottish education, particularly in lights of the fact that we've just had big formal reviews and this policy seems to have kind of come out of nowhere. We already know that inspection functions are going to be removed from Education Scotland and we're told the SQA is going to be replaced. One concern that's been raised with me is that what we're going to end up with here is just an extra organisation, an extra quango, in Scottish education. It seems to me there are two likely possibilities, since we we know that inspection is going to be in its own body and we know that qualifications are going to sit with another body, so: either this new organisation is effectively just going to replace the

remainder of Education Scotland or it is going to operate alongside Education Scotland. If it's the latter then that would suggest pedagogy and classroom practice would be in remit of the new body while curriculum and maybe some other things stay with whatever Education Scotland turns into? But a concern there is that separating teachers from the material that they teach, by having different bodies for pedagogy and curriculum, is a regressive idea? There is also the question of how a body focused on teaching practice would interact with (or would it replace?) the GTCS, which regulates teachers on the basis of their practice. I think it's important to know therefore exactly what we're talking about in terms of this new formal organisation in Scotland and its relationship to the existing bodies, most particularly the GTCS Education Scotland, HMIE and the SQA.

Q: Will the Centre of Teaching Excellence replace one or more of the GTCS, EdScot, HMIE, SQA, or will it become an additional body in Scottish education?

Money is, apparently, very tight just now, but something like what is being proposed surely costs money. The government has not yet delivered the cut to contact time that was promised, and teachers are increasingly vocal about the impact of it tightened spending and resources on the education they can provide. College lecturers still don't have a pay deal. That being the case, some might question the value of yet another initiative when other, perhaps more important issues, remain outstanding.

Q: How much will it cost to establish the new body, and how long will it take? How much will it cost to run each year?

I think all that should give me what I need to put together a decent explainer for readers, and am happy to discuss any of it if that helps.
