Just a quick email to ask a couple of questions. The site has a large range of protected species on it, however we have been advised by FLS and the Scottish Raptor Study Group that we should not be advertising the presence of these species on a publicly available document, so how do you propose we move forward with this?

The sensitive protected species we have present on the site, either breeding or making regular use of the site, include:

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As I said, we have been advised not to advertise the presence of these species, yet that leaves us in a bit of a pickle with your scoring system, unless you can take this email as evidence for the presence of these species, and the work undertaken to safeguard them (deadwood provision for \*relation of the surveys for all protected species prior to any activities and observance of appropriate buffer zones etc.).

Incidentally, all the \*Protection of the Environment \* species mentioned are not on the specific European Protected Species list, but rather on the WCA Schedules (\*Protection of the environment \*) affording them the highest possible level of protection.

Another point to make is that the Dorback burn has been identified as suitable habitat for Beavers, and with the impending reintroductions in the National Park, we expect that Beavers could well be present on the site within the lifetime of this plan, and so we will be taking measures to enhance the habitat for them (planting of preferable species such as Aspen and Willow along the watercourse). Is this something to be mentioned in the concept, or should it also be kept quiet as the Beaver is a European Protected Species.
