

You asked us for –

- Any correspondence, including email or any other form of messaging, with UK Government ministers or officials relating to the Prime Minister's AI safety summit held in London.
- Any internal correspondence relating to the UK Government's AI safety summit.

I enclose a copy of some of the information you requested.

An exemption under sections 30(b)(i), covering free and frank official advice, 30(b)(ii), covering free and frank exchange of views, 36(1) confidentiality in communications, 38(1)(b), covering third party personal data, and 10(4)(e), covering internal communications (draft documents) of FOISA applies to some of the information you have requested.

Some of the information includes advice to the Scottish Ministers from Scottish Government officials and some of the information contains third party personal data that cannot be released. This means we have redacted identifiable information such as names and email addresses.

These exemptions are subject to the 'public interest test'. Therefore, taking account of all the circumstances of this case, we have considered if the public interest in disclosing the information outweighs the public interest in applying the exemption. We have found that, on balance, the public interest lies in favour of upholding the exemptions. With regards to exemption under sections 30(b)(i) and (ii) and 10(4)(e), we recognise that there is some public interest in release because it would ensure transparency by showing advice offered to the Scottish Ministers to support their decision-making and the views offered on that advice. However, this is outweighed by the public interest in ensuring Scottish Government officials are able to provide free and frank advice to the Scottish Ministers to ensure they are appraised of all possibilities when making policy decisions and that discussions on views are able to take place around that advice. With regards to the exemption under sections 36(1) and 38(1)(b), we recognise that there is some public interest in release to clarify who has been corresponding. However, this is outweighed by the public interest in ensuring the Scottish Government fulfils its requirements under the Data Protection Act.

I wanted to provide a quick update at the official level on engagement with your minister around the AI Safety Summit.

Last week we had it confirmed that due to the very restricted invite list, DA Ministers are not going to be invited to the AI Safety Summit. However, our Secretary of State is very keen to ensure that the Devolved Administrations are brought into the many discussions happening around the Summit, including the “Road to Summit” events – we will be reaching out with some more information on this very shortly.

[redacted] – as requested a quick readout on my conversation this afternoon. Much like you, I had an update from DSIT about the road to the AI Safety Summit, but not from FCDO about the Summit itself.

The planned DSIT activities sound like they might address our minister's letter at the start of the summer, making sure that the DAs have a voice in shaping the Summit. But, there won't be official announcements on this or the intended invitees of the Summit until the start of next week.

Besides the detail on the Summit, the DSIT officials described a positive coming response to the feedback we've given on the UK's AI Whitepaper, recognising the need to understand and support the different capacities of regulators and policy departments. But, it remains unclear how the UK's announced funding will be divided between the "frontier AI" risks that the Summit will consider, and the more practical risks from AI that our expert advisors suggest should be the focus. This is likely to remain the case until the Whitepaper is updated following the Summit.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) and foundation models have the potential to transform our economy, our public services and the way in which we work. Apologies for the delay in getting back to you on this. Highlighted below a couple of additions for our interest. I can also confirm that our DD asked about the AI summit and the role of the devolved administrations during a call with FCDO Devolution Unit last week. There was mention of a four nations meeting on 16 November but they gave no promises about the summit itself advising that it wasn't an FCDO lead. It may be worthwhile therefore adding a bullet for Joe to ask the question that if not FCDO leading then who should he be pursuing this with?

In terms of lines that Joe could raise with his counterpart FCDO DG, we're concerned about:

- The scarcity of UKG engagement with the public and other key stakeholders, including Devolved Administrations, ahead of the AI Safety Summit. This risks that the reserved AI policy we must follow is perceived by the public and other key stakeholders as elitist and out of touch, undermining our AI Strategy.

UKG have postponed the ministerial call with DAs, which they had proposed in lieu of Summit attendance, probably because WG were unable to make their proposed timing yesterday. Meanwhile, WG have said that their minister won't want to make a joint public response to the DSIT SoS.

I'm wary that the ministerial call may take some coordination to rearrange, if DSIT insist on having all the DAs involved. So, I'm inclined that we push now for official representation at the summit.

In terms of lines that Joe could raise with his counterpart FCDO DG, we're concerned about:

Joe – Geoff suggested that I reach out for advice on our engagement with the UK's AI Safety Summit.

FCDO are responsible for the Summit, but have resisted our attempts to engage. The DSIT team working with them have felt the need to “manage [our] expectations” about participation for DAs. So, we have a concern that SG will not be invited to participate in the Summit.

As well as the constitutional need for DAs to be involved, Scotland has a distinctive place in the global AI conversation thanks to its research pedigree and progressive AI Strategy.

Our minister is very enthusiastic to be involved, and there may be a valuable issue for us to pursue in the allocation of resources for regulators. Although AI itself is treated as a reserved matter, the current UK position on regulation delegates responsibility to the regulator in the domain where AI is being applied. These regulators are unlikely to have the capability, while all the resources being mobilised for AI by the UK seem focussed on “Frontier AI”, which is dominated by narrow commercial and research interests and may well not translate into resources our regulators can use to build capability.

Is there anyone within your area that you could point us to, please, who might be able to support raising this issue with Cabinet Office?

I take it by **Lochhead correspondence** you mean between him and UK DSIT SoS.

SoS replied in July that officials would be in touch to set up a 4-nation discussion, but they haven't.

In terms of the UK AI Safety Summit, UKG haven't said a word.

I have raised this with UKG contacts and have been told that FCDO (who are leading on the summit) will be in touch about both items. They have organised a meeting with my counterpart in Wales on 21 Sep, who has suggested to them that I join – am waiting for confirmation. But all evidence so far points towards UKG not having any real interest in involving DAs, and making sure the timetable makes it impossible for DAs Ministers or senior officials to attend.

If that situation does not improve by 21 Sep, I plan to write a Ministerial letter.

[redacted] and team – As per my email just now to Mr Lochhead’s PO, I had an update from DSIT about the road to the AI Safety Summit, but not from FCDO about the Summit itself.

Besides the detail on the Summit, the DSIT officials described a positive coming response to the feedback we’ve given on the UK’s AI Whitepaper, recognising the need to understand and support the different capacities of regulators and policy departments. But, it remains unclear how the UK’s announced funding will be divided between the “frontier AI” risks that the Summit will consider, and the more practical risks from AI that our expert advisors suggest should be the focus. This is likely to remain the case until the Whitepaper is updated following the Summit. But, in the meantime they promised a more regular dialogue between DSIT and the DAs, as well as civil-society led events on the road to the Summit.

The event on the 17th will be a hybrid event so joining remotely would be an option. The invitation limits us to the Minister plus one, so I assume (and will check) that if Mr Lochhead cannot attend we could ask someone to go in his place.

We are a little concerned however that the event is basically a sales pitch for lots of tech companies and I am not convinced that there will be much opportunity for significant discussion around key areas of AI policy. I discussed the event with Tom W and we both suspect there will be little of importance covered.

I am happy to reach out to the event organisers and find out what options we have for remote dial in or policy attendance.

I also wanted to share with you a possible alternative route to handling the event on the 16th, and would be grateful if could consider and if appropriate share with Mr Lochhead.

Currently it looks as though Welsh Government colleagues are going to raise their issues/concerns in person on the 16th and will not look to be part of our planned letter.

I wondered therefore if it might make sense for us to follow the same path and in the first instance raise our concerns on the call on 16th October. In advance of the call I will reach out to Catriona and Peter so we have their thoughts and views on hand to support the Minister during the call. We can then, after the meeting and dependant on the outcome, be ready to publish a public response, sharing our concerns and disappointment. Post meeting I could approach Welsh colleagues to see if the event had addressed their concerns or if they continue to have issues and would like to join us in the shared public response.

I think that taking this approach would help us ensure we only go public once we have full detailed knowledge of what will be shared with DAs on the 16th and we won't share anything publicly which turns out to be inaccurate or amended following the call. This also ties with Comms advice about waiting until after the call to share anything more widely.

19th Sept – Mr L shared that he had heard about the UK Summit and asked if we had had any engagement around it

27th Sept – we became aware that FCDO appeared not to be engaging with us/Wales around the summit – indication that invitation list would be restricted

3rd October – policy update from DSIT that DA Ministers would not be invited but that we would be asked to take part in ‘road to the summit’ events. Also shared plan for 13th October DA meeting

4th October – Letter issued by Mr L to FCDO – indicating he was aware of the UK summit but had not been formally contacted about it.

The £100m is supposedly new money but the article doesn't say how it will be disbursed exactly. Copying Imme and Alistair for interest.

The £400m article is behind a paywall but I assume it refers to the actually £200m new money going to Cambridge and Bristol for supercomputing. This need to be seen in the context of the £900m that is going to Edinburgh for exascale computing, which was announced three weeks ago. So no action possible there.

The £118m is actually £117m old money – and four of the twelve CDTs are led by or involve a Scottish university, so we are punching above our weight this time when it comes to getting UKRI funding. So no further action needed there.

Regarding the proceedings of the UK AI Safety Summit in Bletchley Park (point 1), we will provide a more comprehensive readout on Monday, but the key elements so far are:

- UK Government have released very little information to date, in accordance with the exclusive, closed-door nature of the event. The list of organisations attending (but not individuals) is available on the event's website (<https://www.aisafetysummit.gov.uk/>), as is the agenda, which is focused on so-called "Frontier AI" and consistent with what UK DSIT Secretary of State outlined on her call with the Minister and other DA Ministers on 23 October, and the concerns the Minister expressed publicly subsequently.
- The key policy output is the so-called Bletchley Park Declaration (<https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/ai-safety-summit-2023-the-bletchley-declaration/the-bletchley-declaration-by-countries-attending-the-ai-safety-summit-1-2-november-2023>), which contains very little of substance, as can be expected from a document signed by both the US and China.
- That declaration was somewhat (and potentially intentionally) overshadowed by the White House's Executive Order on Safe, Secure, and Trustworthy Artificial Intelligence, issued the day before, which has significantly more substance (<https://www.whitehouse.gov/briefing-room/statements-releases/2023/10/30/fact-sheet-president-biden-issues-executive-order-on-safe-secure-and-trustworthy-artificial-intelligence/>)
- UK Government have made a number of investment announcements. Some of them were previously allocated funding:
 - Repurposing of the £100 Frontier Model Task Force (originally Foundation Model Task Force) as an "AI Safety Institute"
 - Announcement of the winning bids for the twelve £117m UKRI-funded Centre for Doctoral Trainings – of which three are Scotland-led, and a fourth includes a Scottish partner – reflecting the strengths of our universities in AI (<https://www.gov.uk/government/news/britain-to-be-made-ai-match-fit-with-118-million-skills-package>)
- Some investments were new funding:
 - Additional £200m for supercomputing infrastructure in Bristol and Cambridge (<https://www.gov.uk/government/news/technology-secretary-announces-investment-boost-making-british-ai-supercomputing-30-times-more-powerful>)
 - This should be seen in the context of the £900m UKG investment in exascale computing at the University of Edinburgh, announced last month (<https://www.ed.ac.uk/news/2023/edinburgh-to-lead-new-era-of-uk-supercomputing>)

- Additional £100m for AI in life sciences and health care (<https://www.gov.uk/government/news/new-100-million-fund-to-capitalise-on-ai-game-changing-potential-in-life-sciences-and-healthcare>).

Mr Lochhead has quickly drafted the following to give the tone etc. that he is looking for:

Some thoughts on the U.K. Government's AI summit.

I'm disappointed the Scottish Government is not represented at the summit despite requesting a place as did the other Devolved Administrations. Given the impact of AI on devolved areas of government it would have been helpful to have been part of the conversation.

I was however grateful to be invited by the UKG and City of London to attend the pre-summit dinner in London last night.

However, I recognise that the summit is focussing on a narrow and niche agenda which is the threat of AI to global security and how to manage and prepare the risks.

Speaking to many people in the sector it is understood that the U.K. wishes to carve out a niche in the global response to rapidly developing AI.

My concern shared by many is that AI has enormous potential to benefit society and our economy and by choosing to focus on the risks the U.K. is in danger of generating concerns about potential long term threats rather than on the benefits or the here and now risks like misinformation, bias and cyber security.

Focussing on far into the distance doomsday scenarios could drown out or demote the massive game changing benefits for people, our economy and the wider world.

Scotland is leading on many areas of AI centred around our universities and expertise in both the technology and ethics.

The U.K.'s approach so far appears to be to engage with big business and national governments. We need to take people with us and ensure that this is or a remote or elitist debate.

Annex A – Summary 2 Pages

The UK Government is organising an international AI Safety Summit in Bletchley Park (1-2 November 2023). Attendance will be limited to around 100 key stakeholders including political, industry and thought leaders.

The UK Government has not meaningfully engaged with wider stakeholders, including Devolved Administrations, or the public ahead of the Summit.

This is in spite of the Minister writing on 12 June to Rt Hon Chloe Smith, MP Secretary of State for Science, Innovation and Technology, proposing that a Four-Nation AI Summit be held before the Safety Summit. The Secretary of State responded on 19 July that “[her officials] are working to identify an opportunity for a discussion on this topic between Ministers and officials from the UK Government, the Scottish and Welsh Governments and the Northern Ireland Executive. We will be in touch shortly to confirm arrangements.” **[redacted]**

The UK Government belatedly announced a short series of events prior to the Summit, co-organised with the Alan Turing Institute, techUK (which Scottish Government officials were invited to and attended, even though the primary audience was a business one) and the Royal Society, and are now presenting the Summit as the beginning of a broader national conversation.

Connor Leahy, the chief executive of the AI safety research company Conjecture, and one of the executives invited to the Summit, warned in the Guardian on 20 October that the conference risks achieving very little, accusing powerful tech companies of attempting to “capture” the Summit.

The Summit will focus on “Frontier AI”, which the UK Government describes as “highly capable general-purpose AI models that can perform a wide variety of tasks and match or exceed the capabilities present in today’s most advanced models”.

The Summit will consider specifically:

1. Risks to Global Safety from Frontier AI Misuse (including bio- and cybersecurity).
2. Risks from Unpredictable Advances in Frontier AI Capability
3. Risks from Loss of Control over Frontier AI (whether and how very advanced AI could in the future lead to loss of human control and oversight, risks this would pose, and tools to monitor and prevent these scenarios).
4. Risks from the Integration of Frontier AI into Society (including election disruption, bias, impacts on crime and online safety, and exacerbating global inequalities).

- The current lack of clarity in AI regulation poses potentials risks to the rights of Scottish citizens, as well as obstacles to realising the full economic and social benefits of AI in Scotland.
- The UK Government White Paper published on 29 March 2023 sets out a minimalist, sector-by-sector, non-statutory regulatory approach to AI, in contrast to the EU’s much more ambitious EU AI Act.
- The UK Government do not plan to create a new, dedicated UK AI regulator, but instead to delegate to existing regulators such as the Information Commissioner’s Office, Equality and Human Rights Commission, and the Financial Conduct Authority.
- Furthermore, the UK Government’s regulatory framework for AI will initially be issued on a non-statutory basis.

Thank you for our 23 October discussion regarding the AI Safety Summit, AI regulation and Four-Nation collaboration in this key policy area.

Like my Welsh and Northern Irish colleagues, I reiterated my disappointment at UK Nations not being invited to take part in the AI Safety Summit. Scotland is a leader in several AI areas and I believe could have made a valuable direct contribution to this global conversation. Our National AI Strategy pre-dates that of the UK, and the Scottish AI Alliance's Leadership Group is currently carrying out an independent review to ensure that we remain at the forefront of AI policy and technology development.

More broadly, although I acknowledge that AI regulation *per se* is a reserved matter, AI is a transformational technology that will impact many devolved policy areas. Moreover, the approach to regulation taken in the UK's AI Whitepaper, delegating regulatory functions to existing industry regulators, will likely force implementation onto Scottish agencies. Therefore, Scotland's interests and priorities need to be taken into account as part of further development of the UK AI regulations. In particular, we are keen that the AI Safety Summit's focus on speculative "Frontier AI" does not divert attention from addressing the more immediate risks and opportunities presented by today's AI.

For the UK to remain successful on the global AI stage, I believe it is essential that UK Nations work as a team, and I welcome your assurances that going forward the UK Government will closely engage with the Scottish Government on AI.

I look forward to your officials setting out how this will be achieved, meantime, I am looking forward to seeing you tonight at the dinner.

I write to you in follow up to my letter of 13th April 2023, and following a very interesting and thought provoking Scottish Parliamentary debate on the topic of Trustworthy, Ethical and Inclusive Artificial Intelligence: Seizing opportunities for Scotland's people and businesses, which took place on 1st of June.

The debate itself covered a wide range of areas of opportunity and of course of concern from MSPs across the chamber. Following the discussion I intend to update and refresh Scotland's AI Strategy to reflect the ever changing environment in which we are working. My main take away from the debate however was that regardless of which constituency my colleagues represented, or from which side of the political spectrum they were placed, their main concern and focus, was that Scotland needs to ensure that AI is delivered in a way which is both supportive of innovation and prosperity, but which is also fair and open to the people of Scotland.

We are, I believe, at a pivotal point as a nation, where we have the opportunity to ensure that the people of the United Kingdom can have faith that we are all working together to deliver an AI infrastructure which will protect them from any potential risk, whilst also ensuring we can make the most of the benefits. It is with this in mind that I would like to propose a Four Nations AI Meeting, in order to ensure that all parts of the UK are represented as the regulation and deployment of AI continues.

I also believe there would be significant benefit in our Four Nations being able to meet and discuss their respective positions in advance of the proposed global AI summit put forward by the Prime Minister on Thursday June 8th. If the United Kingdom is to maintain its position at the forefront of technology development and innovation, we must also offer a joined up and cohesive platform for the future and I believe that Scotland has a significant contribution to make in this respect. For example the work of The University of Edinburgh, who contribute significantly to the on-going delivery of Scotland's AI Strategy, and are widely regarded as leading the world in the technical and ethical development of AI. I know that my Welsh and

Northern Irish counterparts would be very keen to be given the opportunity to contribute also.

I would be very grateful if you could consider this request as a matter of urgency, and if this is something you would like to take forward please let me know and our Private Office teams can make the arrangements.

I welcome your support and the opportunity to discuss AI further with you and our Four Nations colleagues.

Annex: Recent international developments.

On Thursday 8th June the UK Government announced that the Prime Minister intends to host the [worlds first global summit on AI](#).

Media coverage of the announcement has varied on the idea but there has been some description of the notion that the [UK is now an outlier in relation to global management of AI, and will be ignored](#).

[Rishi Sunak's AI summit: what is its aim, and is it really necessary? | Artificial intelligence \(AI\) | The Guardian](#) has written a very balanced article describing the reasons for the summit and indeed how the proposal might work.

Analysis has suggested that China would be omitted from the summit, leading to some concerns of the UK/US creating a global split and potential barrier between organisations working together in a truly global sense.

The Guardian article has also highlighted the recent move away from some of the UKG optimism around AI into the sphere of discussing risk and regulation.

We have asked if the proposed Four Nations meeting, can take place prior to this summit, with the intention of ensuring that our voice is heard in any resulting event.

Catriona Campbell has reached out to say that should we require any quotes or input from the Scottish AI Alliance, in support of the meeting, she is happy to contribute.

EU AI Act

The [EU AI Act](#) aims to ensure safety, fairness, and respect for EU citizen's rights and is expected to set an influential worldwide standard, as the EU General Data Protection Regulation did. It is expected that the EU AI Act will be adopted before the end of 2023.

The EU AI Act introduces certain minimum requirements that all AI systems must meet. It also introduces more stringent requirements for AI systems that pose higher risks to users, and bans the use of certain types of AI.

Risk levels: The Act will classify AI systems based on their level of risk: unacceptable, high, limited, and minimal. Different requirements and obligations will be imposed on AI providers on these categories, which factor both the system and its impact.

Bans: AI that is deemed as harmful or too high risk AI in terms of citizen's rights or safety will be banned. Prohibited technologies originally included social scoring systems and manipulative subliminal technology. In the last month, this has been expanded to real-time biometric identification systems within public spaces (including facial recognition technology), or that can categorize people based upon sensitive information. Predictive policing including biometric data from social media and CCTV for facial databases, as well as emotion recognition systems in law enforcement, border management, work environments, and education were also banned.

High-risk regulations: AI used in critical areas like healthcare or law enforcement will face stricter rules. These systems will need to be assessed for compliance, be transparent, and have human oversight. AI implemented in critical infrastructures,

such as healthcare, or law enforcement, will require conformity assessments, obligations to transparency, and require human oversight.

Openness and explainability: The Act emphasizes the importance of transparency by asking for clear and accessible information about a system's capabilities, limitations, and potential biases.

Data quality: the use of high-quality training data is emphasised with robust data governance practices to increase the accuracy, and reduction in bias.

Regulators: National authorities will be expected to enforce the Act with the power to do checks, give fines, and give corrective actions to ensure compliance is obliged.

UK Regulations

In March 2023, the UK Government published a White Paper on a “pro-innovation approach to AI Regulation”. The Paper outlines a non-statutory regulatory framework, underpinned by five non-mandated key principles. This framework would be incorporated into the existing regulatory bodies for the regulators to interpret and apply within each of their own remits.

These principles are - safety, security and robustness, appropriate transparency and explainability, fairness, accountability and governance and finally contestability and redress.

Where the EU AI Act focuses on risk levels within specific technologies, the UK AI Regulation white paper instead focuses on the context in which AI is deployed.

Scottish Government officials provided feedback to UKG officials on an earlier draft on the White Paper, raising concerns about:

- Whether a non-statutory regulatory framework would meet the needs and expectations of key stakeholders, including the public
- The need for UK Government to provide substantial support to existing sectoral regulators to increase their capacity and capability to take on new regulatory duties related to AI
- The need for UK Government to provide a central coordination function to ensure consistency across sectors
- The importance of UK Government supporting businesses, including Scottish businesses, comply with regulations not only in the UK but also in key markets such as the EU, where they might be divergent and more onerous
- In particular, the importance of UK Government supporting the development of common, effective international AI standards

Most of those concerns are acknowledged in the White Paper, but it is not entirely clear how the paper's limited proposals will effectively address them.

The White Paper was published on the same day as an open letter from a number of prominent AI figures, including OpenAI founder Elon Musk, calling for a pause in the development and deployment of such large models. Although that letter has itself attracted controversy, it clashed strongly with the tone of the UK Government White Paper, as did Italy's immediate ban on ChatGPT on data protection grounds, two days later.

Within the UK, the White Paper has attracted criticism, including from Michael Birtwistle, associate director from the influential Ada Lovelace Institute, who warned about "significant gaps" in the UK's approach which could leave harms unaddressed. "Initially, the proposals in the white paper will lack any statutory footing. This means no new legal obligations on regulators, developers or users of AI systems, with the prospect of only a minimal duty on regulators in future." "The UK will also struggle to

effectively regulate different uses of AI across sectors without substantial investment in its existing regulators," he said.

Context and Issues

UK AI Safety Summit

3. The UK Prime Minister hosted the AI Safety Summit 2023 on 1 and 2 November at Bletchley Park, Buckinghamshire.
4. The Summit intended to bring together international governments, leading AI companies, civil society groups and experts in research to consider the risks of AI, especially at the *frontier* of development, and discuss how they can be mitigated through internationally coordinated action.
5. This focus on so-called “Frontier AI” is consistent with what UK DSIT Secretary of State outlined on her call with the Minister and other DA Ministers on 23 October, and the concerns the Minister expressed publicly subsequently.
6. The five objectives of the Summit’s discussions were:
- A shared understanding of the risks posed by Frontier AI and the need for action
 - A forward process for international collaboration on Frontier AI safety, including how best to support national and international frameworks
 - Appropriate measures which individual organisations should take to increase Frontier AI safety

- Areas for potential collaboration on AI safety research, including evaluating model capabilities and the development of new standards to support governance
 - Showcase how ensuring the safe development of AI will enable AI to be used for good globally
7. UK Government have released relatively limited information to date on the proceedings of the Summit, in accordance with the exclusive, closed-door nature of the event.
 8. A list of attendees and high-level summaries of each day's round table discussions have been released on the event's website. The most high-profile attendee was Elon Musk, and very short summaries of the Prime Minister's one to one meetings with EC President Ursula von der Leyen, UN Secretary-General António Guterres, and Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, have also been published.
