Contract Management -Service Review (CM2)

Under the Contract Management Framework, Planned Service Reviews of service providers and parent providers must take place. For service providers a service review must take place at least once during the contract term, ideally in the final year of the contract. Parent providers and contracts are subject to review every two years (where there is engagement from more than one commissioning care team) or once per contract term. In addition to Planned Reviews at pre-defined timescales, it may also on occasion be appropriate/necessary to conduct an Unplanned Review to address specific concerns or service deficiencies highlighted in relation to an individual service or parent provider.

Examples of situations where a Review may be required include:

- Receipt of complaint(s) or patterns/trends which suggest dissatisfaction with a service
- Where significant concerns are raised about a service by service users or their representatives, care managers, the media, the public etc
- Services where there are significant performance concerns, such as staff turnover, staff absence, the level of serious incidents
- Where Glasgow City Council is notified of serious concerns held by another interested party, such as the Care Inspectorate or other local authorities
- Breakdown of the service, which would potentially have significant budgetary impact or requirement for reconfiguration
- Where a review is requested internally or by the provider, due to lack of available resources and/or insufficient funding available, resulting in the service not being financially viable on existing funding arrangements
- Where the model of service no longer complies with Glasgow City Council's strategic or service objectives
- Where changes to legislation affect existing arrangements or the providers ability to provide a service
- Services where there are a large number of voids over a sustained period, which may suggest that the type of service no longer meets the needs of service users
- Services where the Provider is in breach of the terms and conditions of the contract, for instance non-compliance with the SWS Contract Management Framework
- Where changes in the service affects its overall cost, leading to concerns about the viability or cost of the service
- Where providers have not signed a letter of agreement and/or a contract for the service they are providing.

The list above is not exhaustive and other factors may be taken into consideration if deemed appropriate by the Lead Officer. All review activity must be discussed with and agreed by the relevant Principal Officer and/or Commissioning Manager before commencing.

The Lead Officer (Commissioning Manager or delegate) of the relevant care group is responsible for overseeing the review process, ensuring appropriate representation at any meetings (e.g. relevant provider reps, Finance reps, care managers etc). Where a service is shared between care groups or with a partner agency, the interested parties should agree from the outset who will take a lead role in the review and the extent of each party's involvement.

All reviews should be conducted using this review report form (CM2). At the conclusion of the Service Review, the review report should be shared with the provider's nominated representative(s) and the Commissioning Manager from the lead care group within four weeks.

Re: Turning Point Scotland - 218 Service

Thank you for your enquiry in relation to the above service. As you may be aware Glasgow HSCP recently conducted a review of the 218 service. This review was done in collaboration with Turning Point Scotland who were also in agreement with the findings and overall recommendations of the review, one of which was to reduce the capacity of the service from 12 to 8 women.

One of the key aspects of the review was to consider the demand for a residential service for women involved in the Justice system. When reviewing the data in terms of referral rates and usage of the service over the past two years it became clear that there isn't the demand for a 12 bed unit, and that occupancy has consistently sat below 8 women at any time. Whilst some of this level of demand may be attributed to the impact of Covid it was also noted that the referral criteria had been more focussed on women involved with the Justice system. Previously there had been more flexibility to accept referrals from addictions services which is outwith the remit and focus of the service. Furthermore, despite a great deal of work being done to promote the service within Justice social work services this has had little impact on referral rates.

It is important to note that Glasgow HSCP Justice services have developed a number of community based services specifically for women over the past 10 years. This has included Tomorrow's Women Glasgow, which is a "one-stop shop" approach for women that includes social care, mental health and housing support. Women's teams have been developed within localities as well as unpaid work provision focussed on women's needs. The Drug Court has recently launched a women's only clinic in separate facilities and we now have a Women's problem-solving Court at Glasgow Sheriff Court that the HSCP supports via Justice services. All of the above developments ensure that women involved in the Justice system receive a trauma informed approach that focusses on their specific needs that is very much in line with the findings of the Angiolini report.

At present Glasgow Justice Social Work are renewing their commissioned services, which includes a residential service for women involved in the

Justice system. This tender process should be concluded by November 2023.

I am writing in relation to recent correspondence and discussion about the 218 Service, which is supported primarily through a ringfenced Scottish Government (SG) grant to Glasgow City Council (GCC) as part of its overall funding for justice social work services. In 2023-24, the justice social work grant included £1,527,196 specifically allocated for use in funding the 218 Service.

Following a service review undertaken earlier this year, you indicated GCC's intention to issue a tender for a redesigned residential service for women involved in the justice system, replacing the 218 Service and taking into account the review's findings and recommendations. These recommendations included reducing the capacity of the service (reflecting estimated levels of demand), a change to more suitable premises, reducing staffing levels, and a model that involves women accessing more community resources whilst resident in the service. GCC's estimate is that such a redesigned service will cost around £800,000 per year, and it intends to put in place a 4-year contract.

As a result of the specific ringfenced grant mentioned above you sought confirmation from the SG that a redesigned service could still be funded from within that grant and asked whether any assurances could be provided with regard to the continuation of relevant funding in future years.

We consider that any decision to re-tender the service is entirely a matter for GCC but can confirm that we have no objection to the replacement service utilising the funding currently allocated to the 218 Service, on the basis that the service aims and approach appear to be broadly similar in seeking to provide an alternative to custody for women in the justice system.

In relation to future years, you will appreciate – as discussed with my colleagues previously – that there are significant difficulties in providing certainty beyond the current financial year. However, I can confirm that if Glasgow is successful in procuring a service for a reduced cost of around £800k, the Scottish Government's intention is to continue providing ringfenced funding of that amount to the end of the current parliamentary session (scheduled for May 2026). This is subject, as always, to the annual budget process and parliamentary approval of the budget.

If GCC's estimates are correct, a new contract will result in significantly lower costs for the service in future. For the avoidance of doubt, any savings realised in 2023-24 within the grant ringfenced for the 218 Service should be declared so that the final payment can be reduced accordingly, and the grant will be reduced in future years to reflect the new cost of the service.

Lastly, you have indicated that retendering this service with more robust contract and commissioning arrangements in place should result in both a more effective service being delivered, and enable the gathering of evidence to assist a longer term decision about the needs for a women's justice-focused residential service in Glasgow. We would be interested in any reflections on this in due course, given the relevance to wider work on alternatives to custody.

Following on from our meeting on the 05 May 2023, you asked that we clarify our position on the need for a justice specific women's residential service in Glasgow given the statement made in my email dated 21 April 2023, which I have highlighted in yellow below.

The review of the service found the current model of service and service delivery was not effective and recommended the service be redesigned to reflect the findings. The review of the current service struggled to identify impactful outcomes for women beyond their time in the project and raised

questions about the continued need for such a service in Glasgow, which is highlighted further in the email below.

As you know, we have been working on a new service spec for a women's residential service which sees the bed numbers reduced to 8, a change in premises, a change in programme delivery within the project and a model that see's women access more community resources whilst resident in the service. By retendering this new service spec, with tighter contract and commissioning arrangements in place, we would hope to see a more contemporary and relevant justice service being delivered. Retendering the service will also provide us with additional evidence to support whether this type of service is required and will assist us in making a decision about the longer term need for a women residential service in Glasgow.

We are therefore requesting that the Scottish Government continues to fund a women's residential service in Glasgow at a reduced cost of £806,250 per annum.

We also discussed the multiyear funding nature of the justice tender being issued in Glasgow and you clear stated that there was no guarantee that the funding would be recurring over a number of years as budgets are linked to parliamentary approval. You asked for assurances that this would be reflected in the contact being issued, which I have detailed below:

7.3. FUTURE FUNDING ARRANGEMENTS

7.3.1. If in any Financial Year the Scottish Ministers reduce the funding awarded to the Purchaser then the Purchaser shall have the right to enter into discussions with the Provider regarding the level of funding and/or the level of Services being provided under this Agreement with a view to reaching an agreement on the continued provision of the Services.

32 TERMINATION FOR BREACH BY EITHER PARTY

32.1 Either Party may at any time by notice in writing terminate this Agreement immediately if the other Party commits a material breach of the terms of this Agreement which is not capable of remedy, or if capable of remedy, is not remedied within thirty (30) Working Days after receipt of notice from the non-breaching Party requiring the breach to be remedied.

We also discussed our desire to include a future women's residential service in our multi-lot justice tender which is being issued in Summer 2023 and would greatly appreciate an indication from Scottish Government about whether they will support the retendering of this service before or by the 25th May 2023.

There's been a bit of a development on this from our side, as Turning Point Scotland got in touch last week to highlight the planned review and request a meeting with us to discuss. A call has been arranged for this afternoon, as we've been discussing various other issues with them recently (not linked to Glasgow), and given wider interest in services of this nature it was felt that we should at least offer them the opportunity to speak to us.

I'm only back from leave today and so am just catching up on all of this now, but I'm obviously conscious that while we do have an interest (given the specific SG funding for the 218 service), we wouldn't comment on specific local authority funding arrangements or reviews of services. So, my intention is to emphasise that point to them and suggest that they should really be speaking to Glasgow about the review and any concerns arising from that (which I assume will be happening anyway).

Can I just summaries our discussion on the 20th. Glasgow HSCP have advised that a desktop review will be carried out in relation to the 218 service which will commence on 01 February 2022. This review will last for 4 weeks and a report will be produced at the end of the four week period setting out recommendations. It was noted at the meeting that we don't want to pre-empt the review findings, but it is likely that the service will be retendered in 2023 to align the service with changes to contract and commissioning arrangements within Glasgow HSCP – namely, a move from block funding to cost and volume.

We also discussed the additional investment in the 218 service made by Justice Social Work in addition to the grant funding made by Scottish Government. We advised that due to budgetary pressures justice social work were no longer in a position to support this additional investment and would cease doing so on the 31 March 2022. The value of this subsidy is £292K and the budget for 2023-24 will be reduced by this amount.

We recognise the removal of £292K from the budget will have a significant impact on the service and we would like to renew our commitment to working with 218 in early January 2023 to consider what efficiencies could be made to the current service. It was noted at the meeting that the service has ran under capacity for sometime and we would be open to reducing the overall occupancy rate to reflect the reduction in budget.

Just a quick update as the first PQ below was taken in the chamber this afternoon by the Deputy First Minister, as part of finance portfolio questions, and was indeed about the 218 Service. The official report should be available in the next couple of days but I've noted the key points below from watching the session (and so any mistakes are my own).

The only supplementary question was from Monica Lennon, who noted that a union (I didn't hear the name) had today called for a review of the budget cut to the 218 Service, which could result in it being closed. She asked the DFM to agree to a review of the funding.

In response, the DFM noted that the budget for community justice services has not been cut; that under the model for community justice most funding is allocated according to local needs with local authorities being responsible for the management / commissioning / re-tendering of relevant services; and that as a result, any questions may be better directed to Glasgow City Council.

Again, I'd stress that this is just my quick note of what was said, but I thought it would be of interest.

I just wanted to let you know that we've received some questions about the 218 service, from a couple of sources.

We will work closely Turning Point Scotland to support women currently in the 218 service to move on from the service. Currently there are 6 women in the service – some due to move on imminently. Women general stay in 218 for between 12 to 16 weeks, which will mean current residents will be moving on naturally mid-February / March 2024.

As previously alluded to a number of services have grown up around 218 over the past 15 years and the support services for women involved in the justice system have evolved greatly. Some examples of these service are below:

 Tomorrow's Women Glasgow (TWG) is a community based service for women involved in the Justice System. We have a multi-disciplinary team of social care and health staff who work with women on a 1-to-1 and / or groupwork basis to address a range of identified needs that the women themselves have identified as underpinning their involvement in the justice system. The service is very much trauma informed in its approach and recognises that the vast majority of women we work with have been affected by multiple and complex traumas and abuse. As a result much of the focus of the work is on safety and stabilisation. Women are offered a mental health assessment via the 2 mental health nurses within the service. This can then lead to psycho-social work being completed with women, either on a 1-to-1 basis or via the self-esteem groups that we run. We also offer a range of additional groupwork activity such as cooking, arts & crafts, personal safety and theatre / songwriting. In reach supports are provided by a range of key partners including Sandyford sexual health clinic, Quarriers family support and local advocacy services. Tomorrow's Women Glasgow currently works with around 95 women.

- The Glasgow Drug Court operates a women's only clinic one day per week to
 ensure that women have a safe, single-sex space that is available for testing
 and health support to be provided whilst they are subject to drug court orders
 (either SDS or DTTO). The clinic operates out of the TWG centre which also
 encourages women to engage with the wider range of supports available
 through this project, including sexual health clinics and other groupwork and
 1-to-1 support.
- Glasgow Sheriff Court implemented a Women's Problem Solving court in January 2023. The Court now operates 2 days per month and focusses on women within the Glasgow city boundary who have additional needs that could be addressed through the imposition of a structured deferred sentence. Regular reviews at Court ensure that women are encouraged to engage with the supports being offered, which includes a referral to TWG. An allocated SDS worker also supports the women with any additional needs that have been identified, such as housing, finances etc. Since January 84 women have appeared at the Women's Court with approximately 47 made subject to an SDS.
- We currently purchase 59 residential placements for men and women in addiction services which range from 3 week crisis stay to a 24 week stay. We have 30 move-on spaces were people learn tenancy sustainment skills. There are 3 recovery hubs one in each of the Glasgow Sectors who have independent Women's community services and each sector also host female only recovery communities.
- We have 60 Tenancy Sustainment placements specific to those open to Justice Social and a host of community support services. Glasgow Working Group on Women Offending host a meeting bi-monthly to bring together statutory and third sector partners to improve/learn/share information on the support available for women involved in Justice.
- The Lilias Centre is based in Glasgow and practice has evolved greatly in supporting all the women currently serving sentences in this establishment.
- Glasgow Women's Aid/Hemat Gryffe and Glasgow East Women's Aid can provide up to 64 safe places for women and SAY Women who support

Writing to flag that we have been asked to provide further information about funding for the 218 service from the Health, Social Care and Sport Committee.

We are currently working on the response, but welcome any quick views you may have on the below (today if possible).

As part of Glasgow City Council's (GCC) overall grant funding from the Scottish Government to support the provision of justice social work services, approximately £1.5m per year is provided for a specific commissioned service, the 218 Service. This funding has been provided to GCC at that level since 2017, and was previously provided to the now-disestablished Glasgow Community Justice Authority. While funding is provided for that particular purpose, however, the oversight and management of the service is a matter for GCC, in line with the overall model for community justice.

Community justice funding is primarily based on a local model, with the Scottish Government providing funding to local authorities which then provide or commission services according to local needs. Even where aspects of that funding are targeted at more specific needs, the commissioning and management of those services - including any retendering exercises - is a matter for the relevant local authority.

In 2023-24, the Scottish Government is investing around £134m in community justice services across Scotland, and has not asked local authorities to reduce any specific funding within that. The Scottish Government does not monitor any additional sources of funding

received by the 218 Service, which would be a matter for Turning Point Scotland and/or GCC.

ANNEX C

JUSTICE SOCIAL WORK SERVICES Conditions of Grant for 2023-24

On behalf of Scottish Ministers, I hereby offer a grant not exceeding the sum of £19,629,059 STERLING, payable for eligible expenditure within the financial year 2023-24, for the delivery of Justice Social Work services, for the purpose laid out in Part 1 of Schedule 1, on the terms and conditions set out below.

1. Definitions and Interpretation

- 1.1 In these Conditions, the words and expressions set out in **Schedule 4** shall have the meanings ascribed to them in that Schedule.
- 1.2 In these Conditions unless the context otherwise requires, words denoting the singular shall include the plural and vice versa and words denoting any gender shall include all genders.
- 1.3 The headings in these Conditions are for convenience only and shall not be read as forming part of the Conditions or taken into account in their interpretation.
- 1.4 Except as otherwise provided in these Conditions, any reference to a clause, paragraph, sub-paragraph or schedule shall be a reference to a clause, paragraph, subparagraph or schedule of these Conditions. The schedules are intended to be contractual in nature. They form part of the Agreement and should be construed accordingly.
- 1.5 This Agreement shall not be varied except by an instrument in writing signed by both parties.

2. Purposes of the Grant

- 2.1 The Grant is made to enable the Grantee to provide funding for the delivery and commissioning of Justice Social Work services. The allocation of the grant has been determined by using the new JSW funding formula and the grant is provided under sections 27A and 27B of the Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968 as amended and includes specific funding agreed by the Cabinet Secretary for Justice.
- 2.2 The Grant shall only be used for the purposes of delivering and commissioning Justice Social Work services and for no other purpose whatsoever, i.e., this is a ring-fenced grant.
- 2.3 No part of the Grant shall be used to fund any activity or material which is party political in intention, use, or presentation or appears to be designed to affect support for a political party.
- 2.4 The main objective of the Grant for 2023-24 and the eligible costs for which this grant can be claimed are those set out in Schedule 1 Part 1 of this letter. The eligible costs exclude reclaimable Value Added Tax.

3. Payment of Grant

- 3.1 The Grant shall be paid by the Scottish Ministers to the Grantee in accordance with the terms of **Schedule 1** attached.
- 3.2 The Grantee shall, following the end of financial year 2023-24 in respect of which a Grant payment has been paid submit to the Scottish Ministers a statement of compliance with the Conditions of the Grant using the form of words provided in **Schedule 3**. The statement shall be signed by the Grantee's Director of Finance.
- 3.3 In the event that the amount of the Grant paid by the Scottish Ministers to the Grantee at any point in time is found to exceed the amount of the expenses reasonably and properly incurred or required by the Grantee in connection with the delivery of Justice Social Work services the Grantee shall repay to the Scottish Ministers the amount of such excess within 14 days of receiving a written demand for it from or on behalf of the Scottish Ministers. In the event that the Grantee fails to pay such amount within the 14-day period, the Scottish Ministers shall be entitled to deduct the amount due, from other payments made to the Grantee by Scottish Ministers under Section 27A (1) of the Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968.
- 3.4 The Scottish Ministers shall not be bound to pay to the Grantee and the Grantee shall have no claim against the Scottish Ministers in respect of, any instalment of the Grant which has not been claimed by the Grantee by the 31 March of the applicable financial year as set out in Schedule 1, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Scottish Ministers.

4. Inspection and Information

- 4.1 The Grantee shall keep the Scottish Ministers fully informed of the progress of the delivery of Justice Social Work services and the use of grant funding in the form of quarterly updates. Details shall include actual expenditure to date compared with profiled expenditure and any change to estimated expenditure for the financial year and/or the project as a whole, the reasons for any such change and progress in achieving objectives/outcomes.
- 4.2 Revisions to any targets / milestones against which progress in achieving objectives / outcomes are monitored shall be subject to the written agreement of the Scottish Ministers.
- 4.3 The Grantee shall, on completion of the Project, submit a report to the Scottish Ministers summarising the outcomes and performance of the Project. Such a report shall include such

statistical and other information relating to the impact of the Project as shall be required by the Scottish Ministers.

- 4.4 The Grantee shall also provide any other information that the Scottish Ministers may reasonably require to satisfy themselves that the delivery of Justice Social Work services is consistent with the Agreement. The Grantee shall provide the Scottish Ministers with prompt access to any information they reasonably require to ensure compliance with these Conditions.
- 4.5 The Grantee shall keep and maintain adequate and proper records and books of account recording all receipts and expenditure of monies paid to it by the Scottish Ministers by way of the Grant. These should be kept for the specified retention period after the expenditure occurs. The Grantee shall afford the Scottish Ministers, their representatives, the Auditor General for Scotland, his/her representatives and such other persons as the Scottish Ministers may reasonably specify from time to time, such access to those records and books of account as may be required by them at any reasonable time in response to a written request for such access from the person seeking it. The Grantee shall provide such reasonable assistance and explanation as the person carrying out the inspection may from time to time require. The current retention period is 6 years.
- 4.6 In the event of the Grantee becoming aware of or suspecting any irregular or fraudulent activity that may have any impact on the delivery of Justice Social Work Services or on the use of the Grant, or any part of it, the Grantee shall immediately notify the Scottish Ministers of such activity and provide such other information as the Scottish Ministers may reasonably require in relation to the impact on the Project and the use of the Grant.
- 4.7 The grantee shall immediately inform the Scottish Ministers of any change in its constitution for example, but not limited to, a change in status from one type of body corporate to another.

5. Confidentiality and Data Protection

- 5.1 The Grantee will respect the confidentiality of any commercially sensitive information that they have access to as a result of the Project.
- 5.2 Notwithstanding the above, the Grantee may disclose any information as required by law or judicial order. All information submitted to the Scottish Ministers may need to be disclosed and/or published by the Scottish Ministers. Without prejudice to the foregoing generality, the Scottish Ministers may disclose information in compliance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002, any other law, or, as a consequence of judicial order, or order by any court or tribunal with the authority to order disclosure. Further, the Scottish Ministers may also disclose all information submitted to them to the Scottish or United Kingdom Parliament or any other department, office or agency of His Majesty's Government in Scotland, in right of the Scottish Administration or the United Kingdom, and their servants or agents. When disclosing such information to either the Scottish Parliament or the United Kingdom Parliament it is recognised and agreed by both parties that the Scottish Ministers shall if they see fit disclose such information but are unable to impose any restriction upon the information that it provides to Members of the Scottish Parliament, or Members of the United Kingdom Parliament; such disclosure shall not be treated as a breach of this agreement
- 5.3 The Grantee shall ensure that all requirements of the Data Protection Laws are fulfilled in relation to the Project.
- 5.4 To comply with section 31(3) of the Public Services Reform (Scotland) Act 2010, the Scottish Ministers publish an annual statement of all payments over £25,000. In addition, in line with openness and transparency, the Scottish Government publishes a monthly report of all

payments over £25,000. The Grantee should note that where a payment is made in excess of £25,000 there will be disclosure (in the form of the name of the payee, the date of the payment, the subject matter and the amount of grant) in the both the monthly report and the annual Public Services Reform (Scotland) Act 2010 statement.

6. Disposal of Assets

The Grantee shall not, without prior written consent of the Scottish Ministers, dispose or permit disposal of any asset funded, in part or in whole, with Grant funds within 5 years of the asset being acquired. During that period the Scottish Ministers shall be entitled to the proceeds of the disposal – or the relevant proportion of the proceeds based on the percentage of grant funding used in connection with the acquisition or improvement of the asset against the whole proceeds. The Scottish Ministers shall also be entitled to the relevant proportion of any proceeds resulting from any provision included as a condition of sale. Recovery by the Scottish Ministers shall not be required where the value of the asset is less than £1000.

7. Publicity

The grantee where reasonably practicable acknowledges in all publicity material relating to the Project the contribution of the Scottish Ministers to its costs. The Scottish Ministers may require to approve the form of such acknowledgement prior to its first publication.

8. Intellectual Property Rights

- 8.1 All Intellectual Property Rights are hereby assigned to and shall vest in the Crown or its assignees.
- 8.2 The Grantee shall ensure that nothing contained in any materials produced or submitted to the Scottish Ministers by the Grantee or anyone acting on its behalf nor the reproduction of such materials, shall constitute an infringement of any third-party copyright or intellectual property right and shall indemnify the Scottish Ministers against all actions, proceedings, claims and demands made by reason of any such infringement.

9. Default and Recovery etc. of Grant

- 9.1 The Scottish Ministers may re-assess, vary, make a deduction from, withhold, or require immediate repayment of the Grant or any part of it in the event that:
 - 9.1.1 The Grantee commits a Default.
 - 9.1.2 The Scottish Ministers consider that any change or departure from the purposes for which the Grant was awarded warrants an alteration in the amount of the Grant.
 - 9.1.3 The Grantee or the local authority funded by the Grantee, fails to carry out its statutory duties in the delivery of Justice Social Work services.
 - 9.1.4 In the Scottish Ministers' opinion, the progress on the delivery of Justice Social Work services is not satisfactory; or
 - 9.1.5 In the Scottish Ministers' opinion, the future of the delivery of Justice Social Work services is in jeopardy.
- 9.2 If, in the Scottish Ministers' opinion, the Grant or any part of it is state aid and they consider that they are required to recover such sum in order to ensure compliance with their legal obligations Scottish Ministers may require immediate repayment of the Grant or

any part of it together with interest at such rate and on such basis as may be determined from time to time in accordance with law.

- 9.3 In the event that the Grantee becomes bound to pay any sum to the Scottish Ministers in terms of clause 9.1, the Grantee shall pay the Scottish Ministers the appropriate sum within 14 days of a written demand for it being given by or on behalf of the Scottish Ministers to the Grantee. In the event that the Grantee fails to pay the sum within the 14-day period, the Scottish Ministers shall be entitled to interest on the sum at the rate of 2 per cent per annum above the Bank of England base lending rate prevailing at the time of the written demand, from the date of the written demand until payment in full of both the sum and interest.
- 9.4 Notwithstanding the provisions of this clause 9, in the event that the Grantee is in breach of any of the Conditions, the Scottish Ministers may, provided that the breach is capable of a remedy, postpone the exercise of their rights to recover any sum from the Grantee in terms of clause 9 for such period as they see fit, and may give written notice to the Grantee requiring it to remedy the breach within such period as may be specified in the notice. In the event of the Grantee failing to remedy the breach within the period specified, the Grantee shall be bound to pay the sum to the Scottish Ministers in accordance with the foregoing provisions.
- 9.6 Any failure, omission or delay by the Scottish Ministers in exercising any right or remedy to which they are entitled by virtue of clauses 9.1 to 9.2 shall not be construed as a waiver of such right or remedy.

10. Assignation

The Grantee shall not be entitled to assign, sub-contract or otherwise transfer its rights or obligations under the Agreement without the prior written consent of the Scottish Ministers.

11. Termination

The Agreement may be terminated by the Scottish Ministers giving not less than 3 months' notice in writing from the date of the notice being sent.

12. Corrupt Gifts and Payments of Commission

The Grantee shall ensure that its employees shall not breach the terms of the Bribery Act 2010 in relation to this or any other grant. The Grantee shall ensure that adequate controls are in place to prevent bribery.

13. Continuation of Conditions

- 13.1 These Conditions, except for Condition 6, shall continue to apply for a period of 5 years after the end of the financial year in which the final instalment of the Grant was paid.
- 13.2 Condition 6 shall continue to apply until the end of the period referred to in that Condition.

14. Compliance with the Law

The Grantee shall ensure that in relation to the funding of Justice Social Work services, they and anyone acting on their behalf shall comply with the relevant law, for the time being in force in Scotland.

15. Governing Law

This contract is governed by the Law of Scotland and the parties hereby prorogate to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Scottish Courts.

PART 1: GRANT FUNDING FOR JUSTICE SOCIAL WORK SERVICES - 2023/24

Purpose of the Grant

The grant funding is for the delivery of Justice Social Work (JSW) services for the financial year 2023-24.

The allocation of this grant has been determined by using the new JSW funding formula and the grant is provided under sections 27A and 27B of the Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968 as amended.

This funding is being provided by the Scottish Government to your Local Authority in order to allow it to discharge its statutory duties and to work towards prevention and reducing further offending in line with your Community Justice Outcome and Improvement Plans (CJOIPs) as a statutory partner. Accountability for the obligations that the Community Justice (Scotland) Act 2016 places on the various Community Justice Statutory Partners will remain with their respective organisation.

The makeup of this grant funding is in two parts.

Part one

This funding is derived from JSW workloads, Rurality and the Social and Economic Cost of Crime statistics. Each Local Authority (LA) has flexibility, working in partnership with other statutory partners and the third sector to direct this funding to meet Community Justice local priorities, but have regards to the key delivery of statutory services. LAs in partnership are free to allocate funds as they see fit across their LA in accordance with their Community Justice Outcome and Improvement Plans (CJOIPs), in the way they see as most appropriate to fulfil their statutory obligations and prevent and reduce further offending.

Part two

This element of funding makes up the total allocation. It is intended to help support effective interventions and improvements in the priority areas highlighted, including funding for key programmes and services agreed by Ministers and support for the implementation of the extended presumption against short sentences. Specific funding allocated for Women's Services is in addition to the other elements of funding which support interventions for both men and women in contact with justice social work services. This is derived from the formula and also includes funding for key programmes and services agreed by Ministers. Flexibility to direct this funding working in partnership still exists for these areas, however the funding identified under **Annex B** in the letter dated the 19 December 2022, which refers to the main JSW grant should be utilised under the relevant headings. Any underspends should be declared, as this is not service specific delivery funding which falls under flexible resources identified under **Annex A**. This funding is additional to the workload component in Part 1 of the grant.

Additional funding is also being made available to help build further capacity around bail supervision, and to help support and improve the use of and delivery of alternative non-custodial interventions such as structured deferred sentences and diversion from prosecution.

Where a Justice Social Work grant is paid by the Scottish Government, in accordance with Section 27A of the Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968, an LA has no discretion to forward it to a service provider other than a local authority, unless it provides the services following transfer of the functions under the relevant sections of the Management of Offenders etc. (Scotland) Act 2005. It is however for LAs to determine the proportion of funding to be allocated in accordance with the priorities identified within the CJOIPs.

PART 2: PAYMENT OF GRANT

The total Grant of £19,629,059 shall be payable by the Scottish Ministers to the Grantee in twelve monthly instalments of £1,635,755

Grant payment - The funding will be paid within 10 working days, following the month end. Unlike previous arrangements with Community Justice Authorities, there will be no retention factor.

On a **quarterly** basis for budget monitoring purposes, payments will be released following receipt and examination of Schedule 2 which will confirm spend to date and forecast expenditure to year end.

The Grantee shall advise Scottish Ministers via **Schedule 2** of any change to the profile or to the overall costs for the delivery of Justice Social Work Services, **as set out in Schedule 1**. This includes any potential underspend for specific targeted funding which forms an element of the overall grant. Each claim shall be submitted together with such explanatory or supplementary material as the Scottish Ministers may from time to time require whether before or after submission of the claim.

On receipt of each claim (and any required documentation and information), the Scottish Ministers shall determine the amount of expenditure which they consider the Grantee has reasonably and shall reasonably and properly incurred in the delivery of Justice Social Work services having regard to that claim. The determination shall be based on the information provided by the Grantee in accordance with this Schedule. The Scottish Ministers shall use their best endeavours (but shall be under no obligation or duty) to pay the amount determined to the Grantee within 2 weeks of receiving a claim and any required documentation and information relevant to the claim. Each claim shall be for an amount equal to the actual reasonable and proper costs and expenses forecast by the Grantee.

Schedule 3 will confirm actual expenditure at financial year end and compliance with Grant Conditions. This form should be submitted to Community Justice Division by **17th April 2024**. Payment for period ending 31st March 2024 will be released following receipt and examination of both Schedules 2 and 3.

The Scottish Ministers shall not be bound to pay any instalment of the Grant which has not been claimed by the Grantee by 17th April 2024 of the applicable financial year, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Scottish Ministers.

At the end of financial year 2023/24, any underspend must be returned to the Scottish Government.

"Conditions" means these grant conditions.

"Data Protection Laws" means any law, statute, subordinate legislation, regulation, order, mandatory guidance or code of practice, judgment of a relevant court of law, or directives or requirements of any regulatory body which relates to the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of Personal Data to which a Party is subject including the Data Protection Act 2018 and any statutory modification or re-enactment thereof and the UK GDPR.

"Default" means:

(a) Any breach of the obligations of either party under this Agreement (including, but not limited to,

any breach of any undertaking or warranty given under or in terms of this Agreement).

- (b) Any failure to perform or the negligent performance of any obligation under this Agreement.

In all cases by either party, its employees, agents or representatives.

"Financial Year" means a period from 1 April in one year until 31 March in the next.
