It was good to speak with you earlier in the week, and apologies that I hadn't responded in writing before that call. Entirely my error on that!

In response to your query below I can advise the following:

It is not possible for Marine Scotland to provide overarching advice on whether certain ADD devices will require an EPS licence as it will depend on where and how the device is being used. The Information Note and Frequently Asked Questions for the Operators of Finfish Farms on the use of Acoustic Deterrent Devices and the Requirement for a European Protected Species Licence recently published by Marine Scotland details that "*It is your responsibility as the fish farm operator to determine whether you need to apply for an EPS licence. However given current scientific advice, it is likely that an EPS licence will be required for all currently available ADDs unless you can demonstrate that the device(s) operating at your site will not cause disturbance to cetaceans."*

Marine Scotland has not been approached by Ace Aquatec or the fish farm operators detailed in the certificate to provide a view as to whether an EPS licence is required at these sites. The certificate provided by Ace Aquatec is therefore not recognised or validated by Marine Scotland. We are concerned that this type of certificate could be perceived by the industry or other stakeholders as being endorsed by Marine Scotland which is not the case. Because of this we think it would be helpful for the certificate to make this clear.

In addition the certificate details that a very low number of cetaceans (0.0005) could be injured but does not include any information on the numbers of animals likely to be disturbed. An EPS licence would be required if a single cetacean is likely to be disturbed.

I have copied Ace Aquatec and the operators of the fish farm sites detailed in the certificate into this response for awareness. The obligation to apply for an EPS licence lies with the fish farm operator if the use of ADDs at their site is likely to cause disturbance or injury to cetaceans.

Good afternoon.

I am emailing to ask if it would be possible to let me know what Marine Scotland's stance is on deployment of ADDs on Scottish Salmon Farms. Would it be possible to have a definitive ruling on whether an EPS License is required when deploying ADDs such as the RT1 which seem to meet the criteria set by NOAA. As outlined in the statement below and contained in a copy of a certificate I have attached.

MMPA & EPS Safe' in that our systems meet draft criteria set on NOAA's Acoustic Deterrent Web Tool launched in 2021 and, according to the Marine Scotland modelling methodology, risks PTS injury to less than 0.0005 marine mammals.

I am seeking this clarification on behalf of RSPCA Assured as there seems to be some confusion regarding EPS licenses. We require our members to be compliant with all regulations and operate within the legal framework regarding ADDs. As you will be aware we are a higher welfare farm assurance scheme so any clarification on this point would be very much appreciated.

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RSPCA – Review of Welfare Standards for Farmed Atlantic Salmon

The RSPCA are in the process of reviewing and updating their 2021 standards for the welfare of farmed Atlantic salmon: <u>RSPCA welfare standards for farmed Atlantic salmon - RSPCA</u>. There are a number of priority areas and stakeholder engagement is ongoing.

1. Welfare at slaughter

- RSPCA considering aspects of stunning (percussive and electric) with a view to improving efficacy.
- The distinction that a percussive blow is used to both stun and kill, while eccentric electric stunning is used to immobilise and is followed by another type of slaughter was made. Electric stunning is not used as a primary method of stunning in Scottish salmon farming, and is used more in trout.
- APHA is inspecting around 5 sites this year (as requested by SG) and that will give us a benchmark going forward.

2. Cleaner fish

- RSPCA is considering updating current standards in relation to cleaner fish.
- The industry has signalled a preference to focus on farmed wrasse in agriculture but volumes produced so far are not enough to meet industry requirements.
- Regardless of origin, there are some welfare concerns particularly in areas such as their exposure to freshwater which is used as a treatment for sea lice, stocking density as production of cleaner fish scales up and their environment requirements in contrast to salmon.
- SAIC have carried out some research on cleaner fish that may be inform the review of the RSPCA standards.

3. Non-medicinal treatments

- The RSPCA currently require a generic welfare risk assessment for nonmedicinal treatments including the use of fresh water, and mechanical de-licers such as the thermolicer and hydrolicer but in future could require something more specific
- Aquaculture industry has a legal obligation to keep sea lice numbers below certain levels to avoid any notification or enforcement from the Fish Health Inspectorate.
- Treating fish for sea lice can have implications for their health and welfare if they are treated and have underlying health conditions such as poor gill health. and a balance is required between keeping sea lice levels low and maintaining optimum fish health and welfare.
- SAIC project currently underway looking at impact of thermolicer.
- 4. Stocking density
 - Stocking density in marine pens is 15 / m³, or 10 for organic farms. RSPCA considering whether this is still best practice.
 - Questions remain on whether lower stocking density has an impact on sea lice transmission.
 - Question also relating to closed and semi-closed systems of aquaculture.

5. Antibiotics

- The RSPCA aims to bring its standards into line with other regulations (such as the EU), and no major changes are expected in this area.
- SG suggests RSPCA contacts the VMD and the BTA who have done some work in this area with regard to aquaculture (contacts can be provided by SG).
- There is no prophylactic use of antibiotics in aquaculture. The use of antibiotics per unit, is lower in aquaculture than in other agricultural sectors.

6. Environmental enrichment

- RSPCA exploring how environmental enrichment may benefit fish health and welfare.
- This is likely to be more important with regard to cleaner fish than for salmon.
- Any enrichment will have to take other aspects of animal husbandry (*e.g.* nets, cleaning) into consideration.
- RSPCA advised to contact Prof Jimmy Turnbull at Stirling University for more information on research that has been carried out in this area (<u>Professor Jimmy</u> <u>Turnbull | University of Stirling</u>).

8. Welfare outcome assessments

 The RSPCA has not previously asked for these, but is aware that the industry already carry them out. Some kind of behavioural analysis may be required as well as general welfare assessments, which is possible with underwater cameras. • SG respond that observation of behaviours is part of good husbandry practice, and there may be challenges incorporating a standard reporting method into a questionnaire.

RSPCA Timeline

- Complete consultation by the mid-April
- Present preliminary thoughts to Standards Technical Advisory Group (STAG) at the end of April
- Second iteration of standards by July 2022
- Second presentation to STAG towards end of 2022
- Publish standards in spring 2023

The Fish Farming Code of Practice (Scotland) Order 2021 came into force in November 2021. It approves the "Aquaculture Code of Practice: Containment of and Prevention of Escape of Fish on Fish Farms in relation to Marine Mammal Interactions" which is applicable to all aquaculture production businesses (APBs) in Scotland. The Code of Practice provides guidance and sets out standards in relation to the use of non-lethal measures and containment. Therefore, as far as ADD use is concerned, we do not differentiate between salmon and trout.

It is not quite accurate to say that ADDs cannot be used. If a fish farm wanted to use an ADD they either have to demonstrate to Marine Scotland that the device would not cause disturbance to European Protected Species (EPS – cetaceans in this case) or they would have to apply for a licence to disturb EPS.

No there isn't a published list. There are lists of countries that may export live fish to GB (EU/EFTA - <u>Aquaculture+Products.pdf (amazonaws.com)</u> Non EU - <u>Aquaculture+Products.pdf</u> (<u>amazonaws.com</u>), but these were inherited via the EU legislation that was retained post Brexit. They only indicate that importation may be permissible, but it will depend on the health status of the country/farm and the species being imported.. The EU publishes lists in legislation of countries that are declared free of specific diseases, but these don't include individual suppliers and can take some time to update if there are disease outbreaks.

We always advise importers to contact the FHI (either ourselves in Scotland or the FHI in England) directly and we will be able to advise on whether trade is permissible with a particular source. If you have any cases where you would like to check the source, I would be happy to help.

Yes, that's correct that your requirements to test ova for pathogens are redundant as there is no legal requirement.

I've tweaked my wording slightly to clarify that the requirement for ova to originate from a source of equal or higher health status is only in relation to the listed diseases. If importers want ask there supplier for testing for non-listed diseases such as IPN, SAV etc that is a commercial decision and there are no certification requirements for entry into GB.

"Any ova sourced out with GB must originate from a site with equal or higher health status with regard to the listed diseases and be accompanied by a health certificate issued by the competent authority in the country of origin".

Thanks for the prompt and detailed reply. If I am understanding this correctly, then our requirements in the standards (as currently written) are functionality redundant as there is no legal requirement to test for pathogens (if the country of origin is the UK or of the same, or higher, health status). Is that correct?

It would be better to say (i've quoted from your email) "Any ova sourced out with GB must originate from a site with equal or higher health status and be accompanied by a health certificate issued by the competent authority in the country of origin". For completeness sake, I've put our current standards below

Salmon - All eggs must be tested for specified fish pathogens as required under the relevant European and national legislation.

Trout - FW 1.2 All eggs must be tested for specified pathogens as required under the relevant European and national legislation. and, FW 1.2.1 Imported eggs must come from sources in line with national legislative requirements.

Of course, we could add our own requirement to test for pathogens as part of a higher welfare standard/scheme, but I want to properly understand the legal side first.

Thank you for your query.

There is no requirement in legislation for ova to be tested for pathogens either in GB legislation or in the EU legislation that was retained post Brexit. The GB zone has a high health status for fish diseases, recognised as free of EHN, ISA (HPR deleted), VHS, IHN, SVC and *Gyrodactylus salaris*. Any ova sourced out with GB must originate from a site with equal or higher health status and be accompanied by a health certificate issued by the competent authority in the country of origin. Current sources of salmonid ova are either recognised as free of the relevant listed diseases on a country wide basis though historical freedom and/or testing of fish (broodstock are tested, not ova) or as an individual compartment with suitable biosecurity measures in place and testing of fish.

There are no requirements for testing of broodstock or ova grown within GB that are for further growing in GB. Some producers may screen broodstock for additional diseases such as IPN or other diseases requested by their customers, but this is a commercial decision and not required under legislation. All ova should be surface disinfected as per good practice.


Hello,

Within the RSPCA welfare standards for both salmon and rainbow trout, we require eggs to be tested for specific pathogens as required by European and national legislation. Historically, this would have been applicable to imported eggs for the notifiable diseases but with the increased production of eggs in Scotland, I was wondering if there are any pathogens that eggs produced in Scotland for on-growing in Scotland must be tested for under Scottish legislation?


