Linlithgow Burgh Halls

- The iconic Linlithgow Burgh Halls is an elegant Category A-listed building steeped in the tradition at the heart of Linlithgow next to historic Linlithgow Palace, St Michael's Church and Linlithgow Loch.
- In November 2008 Historic Scotland issued an offer of grant of up to £261,783 based on tendered eligible costs of £1,047,131, towards assistance with a £5m scheme of repair and redevelopment. This is the standard 25% level of grant awarded to local authorities.
- The project involved the repair and refurbishment of the Burgh Halls to improve its traditional role as a town house. Since completion it has been available to stage events and celebrations as a multi purpose arts and heritage centre for the benefit of the people of the town with a stunning new roof terrace, cafe and gardens. The redevelopment sympathetically positions modern design alongside period features.
- Whilst the project was on site the contractor unfortunately went into liquidation. The appointment of another contractor and the consequent additional costs led to an additional supplementary grant of £52,200 being awarded by Historic Scotland in 2011. This allowed the Council to offset some of the project deficit.
- The building has made the shortlist of this year's Royal Incorporation of Architects in Scotland Andrew Doolan Best Building in Scotland Award.
