Major Capital Projects and Programmes Reporting

Priority and Purpose

1. To update the Cabinet Secretary on the latest position regarding reporting to the Parliament's Public Audit Committee (PAC) on Major Capital Projects.

Background

2. The Scottish Government is due to provide the six monthly report to the Public Audit Committee on major capital projects at the end of January. For the first time, this report will formally report that all NHS capital projects in development have been paused and we expect there may be some Comms interest in this position.

Current Position

- 3. Following the publication of the Draft Capital Budget on 19 December 2023, the health portfolio's capital allocation allows for formula capital to be maintained at 2023-24 levels, all major projects in construction to be completed ([Out of Scope] and Jubilee Phase 2), [Out of Scope].
- 4. However, given the challenging settlement we are managing, the Scottish Government is not prepared to fund development costs for any new projects, [Redacted s.30(b)(i)]. The update to the PAC will inform them that all NHS projects in development have been stopped. This includes:
 - NHS Grampian National Treatment Centre
 - NHS Lothian National Treatment Centre
 - NHS Lothian Reprovision of Eye Services (Eye Pavilion)
 - NHS Ayrshire and Arran National Treatment Centre Ayrshire and Arran

- 5. The report, for all projects, will say:

'In common with all health capital investment projects in development, this business case has been paused until the necessary capital funding to complete the project becomes available. 

1. Routine. Following the meeting with the Deputy First Minister and the Cabinet Secretary on 20 November, a subsequent short submission was requested that set out the [Out of Scope] and proposed next steps in relation to the national treatment centre programme.

Background

- 2. The NHS Recovery Plan 2021-26 committed to the completion of the NTC programme and increased capacity for 40,000 additional procedures to be delivered by the end of this Parliamentary term. Five of the ten planned centres will be opened by end 2023 and will provide an additional 20,000 procedures per annum by 2025/26.
- 3. However, since the NTC programme was established in 2015 the capital costs have increased significantly [Redacted s.30(b)(i)]. There is no capacity in the health budget to progress any NTC not yet in construction either from a capital [Redacted s.30(b)(i)] perspective and [Redacted s.30(b)(i)]
- 4. Following the FMs announcement last month regarding additional investment of £300 million over three years, this will provide the resources necessary to source the additional capacity required from 2024/25 to support the reduction of waiting lists and to stabilise and sustain service provision [Redacted s.30(b)(i)].

With the exception of NTC Lothian, all the NTC projects (not yet in construction) are at a point where they are paused at a key decision point (OBC or FBC) or where funding has not been allocated to fund further development costs (due to the budgetary position within the Directorate). Context and Issues

3. The two remaining Centres in this phase of the NTC programme were scheduled to open by end 2023. NTC FV, [Redacted s.30(b)(i)]. GJ Phase 2[Redacted s.30(b)(i)].

- 11. NHS FV's original plan for 2023/24 was to deliver an additional 1,086 orthopaedic procedures. To date NHS FV have been using the previously commissioned new theatres to provide medical and surgical speciality support to other NHS Boards. Whilst not formally opened as an NTC, the pathways to enable provision

of mutual support to other Boards are well established within NHS FV. This has resulted in NHS FV having undertaken a significant number of additional procedures (1,367) for a range of patients since the start of this financial year.

- 12. Given the delay to the opening of the new ward, NHS FV are
 - a. evaluating the potential to use existing ward capacity until the NTC opens;
 - b. discussing with clinical teams the range of procedures that could be undertaken in FV Royal Hospital; and
 - c. discussing, with NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde, additional procedures that could be undertaken before 31 March 2024.
- 13. In this respect, the delivery of additional capacity is being fulfilled at FV Royal Hospital, albeit the new ward once open will further enhance the range of procedures that can be undertaken in the already commissioned theatres.

Bute House Agreement Implications

14. The NTC programme has no implications for the Bute House Agreement.

Verity House Agreement Implications

15. The NTC programme has no implications for the Verity House Agreement.

Financial and Legal Considerations

16. There are no financial or legal considerations for the Scottish Government as a result of the NTC delays.

17. The delayed opening of both facilities may be subject to Parliamentary scrutiny. Policy and media officials will develop reactive lines in case these are required; focusing on the 23/24 activity already being undertaken by NHS FV and the GJ.

18.I have advised officials to continue working closely with both NHS FV and NHS GJ to agree a revised programme for the opening of the new facilities and ensure that further additional activity, where possible, can be delivered in this financial year.

"As set out in our draft budget the capital funding position is extremely challenging. "Our Infrastructure Investment Plan (2021-22 to 2025-26) identified the priority health capital projects for funding within that period. As a result of the cut in our capital budget, a revised

pipeline of infrastructure investment will be published in Spring 2024. All due consideration will be given to what projects can be included within that revised plan to ensure it is affordable and deliverable. In the interim, boards have also been advised to pause any new capital projects."

Query

A late update on this one but NHS Grampian have confirmed the new national treatment centre in Aberdeen is now on hold as a result of this freeze. Ellon and Banchory health centres are not relevant they say, as they didn't yet have funding secured, so I'm leaving that aspect out.

Capital spending update In December, the Scottish Government announced their budget and outlined a very challenging picture for public sector spending. One area which is seeing the impact of this very quickly is capital spending - spending on large building projects. Scottish Government have confirmed that, based on budget allocation for 2024/25 and medium-term funding outlook, work on the National Treatment Centre - Grampian Project, including an MRI for Dr Gray's Hospital, will not progress further at this time and all project activity will stop. This will be the position until there is certainty on funding. Plans to refurbish the mental health ward at Dr Gray's which were planned to take place at the same time as the MRI construction, will now be reviewed alongside wider NHS Grampian infrastructure investment plans.

Clearly, this news is hugely disappointing, not only for those who have worked on this project, but for the wider organisation and for everyone living and working in Grampian. We want to emphasise our ongoing commitment to these projects, and we hope both will proceed at some point in the future. It is worth noting any capital funds we receive will be directed towards maintenance of the existing estate and essential equipment replacement programmes.

It would be good to have comment from the government on what this means for the wider NTC plans.

Priority and Purpose

1. ROUTINE – to advise the Cabinet Secretary on the status of the programme for the National Treatment Centres at Golden Jubilee (Phase 2) and Forth Valley and to highlight the specific risks in relation to these centres which is now likely to delay opening until 2024. Whilst there is a delay to the opening of both centres, NHS Forth Valley will deliver additional procedures in this financial year using the previously commissioned new theatres and Golden Jubilee are ahead of plan in core activity in the current year.

Recommendation

2. Officials recommend that you note the position set out below and that a further update will be provided following further discussions with NHS Forth Valley and Golden Jubilee Phase 2 in relation to revised programmes.

Context and Issues

3. The two remaining Centres in this phase of the NTC programme were scheduled to open by December 2023[Redacted s.33(1)(b)]

NTC Forth Valley

- 4. The Forth Valley NTC (new ward) was due to open in December 2023 and we have been working closely with the Board as the programme has progressed.
- 5. [Redacted s.33(1)(b)].
- 6. As the project progresses through the latter stages of construction, the Board continues to work closely with NHS Assure to ensure that the building meets the required standards. In this respect, [Redacted s.33(1)(b)] At this stage the impact on the programme of any changes that maybe required are unknown and may take several weeks to conclude. There is a clear understanding from all parties of the importance to concluding on this matter. It is however anticipated that the new NTC ward will not now open in December 2023.
- 7. Whilst the original plan for 2023/24 was to deliver any additional 1,086 orthopaedic procedures, NHS Forth Valley have been using the previously commissioned new theatres to provide support to other NHS Boards across medical and surgical specialties. Whilst not formally opened as an NTC, the pathways to enable provision of mutual support to other Boards are well established within NHS Forth Valley. This has resulted in NHS Forth Valley having undertaken a significant number of additional procedures (1,367) for a range of patients since the start of this financial year. Discussions are also ongoing with NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde in relation to other procedures which could be undertaken before 31 March 2024. In this respect the delivery of additional capacity is being fulfilled at Forth Valley Royal Hospital, albeit the new ward once open will further enhance the range of procedures that can be undertaken in the already commissioned theatres.
- Final plans for the opening of the new ward will be confirmed following a risk assessment of options supported by guidance from technical advisors and NHS Assure.

Golden Jubilee Phase 2

9. We had previously advised of a delay to the opening of the Phase 2 building from 1 to 15 December. Since the last update the Board have flagged a further potential risk to the opening of the Centre by end of 2023. [Redacted s.33(1)(b)]. This further delay, which is unavoidable, may mean first patient treatment does not occur until early 2024. Officials will update as soon as we have a fuller understanding of the impact which we hope to be in a position to do following a meeting scheduled later this week.

Capital spending update In December, the Scottish Government announced their budget and outlined a very challenging picture for public sector spending. One area which is seeing the impact of this very quickly is capital spending - spending on large building projects. Scottish Government have confirmed that, based on budget allocation for 2024/25 and medium-term funding outlook, work on the National

Treatment Centre - Grampian Project, including an MRI for Dr Gray's Hospital, will not progress further at this time and all project activity will stop. This will be the position until there is certainty on funding. Plans to refurbish the mental health ward at Dr Gray's which were planned to take place at the same time as the MRI construction, will now be reviewed alongside wider NHS Grampian infrastructure investment plans.

Clearly, this news is hugely disappointing, not only for those who have worked on this project, but for the wider organisation and for everyone living and working in Grampian. We want to emphasise our ongoing commitment to these projects, and we hope both will proceed at some point in the future. It is worth noting any capital funds we receive will be directed towards maintenance of the existing estate and essential equipment replacement programmes.

It would be good to have comment from the government on what this means for the wider NTC plans.

- 5. As indicated in the earlier briefing on 9 October we highlighted the technical compliance issues [Redacted s.33(1)(b)].
- 6. As the project progresses through the latter stages of construction, the Board continues to work closely with NHS Assure to ensure that the building meets the required standards. [Redacted s.33(1)(b)].
- 7. Whilst the original plan for 2023/24 was to deliver any additional 1,086 orthopaedic procedures, NHS Forth Valley have been using the previously commissioned new theatres to provide support to other NHS Boards across medical and surgical specialties. Whilst not formally opened as an NTC, the pathways to enable provision of mutual support to other Boards are well established within NHS Forth Valley. This has resulted in NHS Forth Valley having undertaken a significant number of additional procedures (1,367) for a range of patients since the start of this financial year. Discussions are also ongoing with NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde in relation to other procedures which could be undertaken before 31 March 2024. In this respect the delivery of additional capacity is being fulfilled at Forth Valley Royal Hospital, albeit the new ward once open will further enhance the range of procedures that can be undertaken in the already commissioned theatres.
- Final plans for the opening of the new ward will be confirmed following a risk assessment of options supported by guidance from technical advisors and NHS Assure.

Golden Jubilee Phase 2

9. We had previously advised of a delay to the opening of the Phase 2 building from 1 to 15 December. Since the last update the Board have flagged a further potential risk to the opening of the Centre by end of 2023. [Redacted s.33(1)(b)]. This further delay, which is unavoidable, may mean first patient treatment does not occur until early 2024. Officials will update as soon as we have a fuller understanding of the impact which we hope to be in a position to do following a meeting scheduled later this week.

The twin challenge of a UK Government cut to our capital grant over the next five years and unprecedented levels of inflation caused by Brexit, Ukraine and the handling of the UK economy has impacted our ability to fund capital projects.

The 10% real terms cut to our capital budget is equivalent to a reduction of around £540 million a year by 2027-28, and a cumulative reduction of £1.6 billion over the period.

Unfortunately this has meant that all NHS capital projects, including the National Treatment Centre in Ayr, will be paused. Our emphasis now has to be on addressing backlog maintenance and essential equipment replacement.

All capital projects are now under review and I expect the Deputy First Minister to set out the results of that review in the coming weeks. The Deputy First Minister will also be writing to the Chancellor ahead of the Budget asking him to reverse the cuts to our capital investment budget.

We're also waiting for final confirmation of the supplementary for this Q. This will likely focus on finance – [Redacted s.38(1)(b)] can you provide an answer to the below please as soon as possible and any additional relevant background points.

TBC: As the Cab Sec has touched on, the UK Government's disastrous autumn statement slashed the Scottish Government's capital budget. The UK Government's reckless spending decisions will have a substantial impact on capital investment and it is clear that we need to see the Chancellor rectify this in his spring budget. Can the Cab Sec provide any update regarding the Scottish Government's latest engagement with the UK Government in this regard?

The Scottish Government will publish its next Major Capital Projects Progress Update report on [day], X January. This will set out progress in the delivery of infrastructure projects with a value over £5 million, which have agreed outline business cases (OBCs) or equivalent. It will set out that a number of projects which were included in the 2021 Infrastructure Investment Plan may be paused or cancelled in the ongoing review of the infrastructure pipeline. This specifically relates to five projects within the Health sector, four of which form part of the National Treatment Centres Programme. In addition to these five projects, [Out of Scope] will no longer be included within the report going forward due to funding not being available for its Health and Social Care element.

This report would normally be published as a package with the Project Pipeline report (major projects without agreed OBCs) and the Programme Pipeline (all infrastructure programmes with a value over £20 million). These reports will not be published at this time as the content of them is dependent on agreement of multi-year capital allocations. This may lead to criticism from the Parliament and wider stakeholders including Audit Scotland. NATIONAL TREATMENT CENTRE - PROGRAMME PAUSE

The NHS Recovery Plan 2021-26 committed to the completion of the NTC programme and increased capacity for 40,000 additional procedures to be delivered. Five of the ten planned centres will be opened by the end of 2023/24 and will provide an additional 20,000 procedures per annum by 2025/26.

- The NTC programme was established in 2015 to increase capacity for planned care given the long term forecasts for increased demand. Since 2015, there have been a series of significant events which have impacted on planned care and the NTC programme, including BREXIT, COVID, the war in Ukraine and rising inflation, construction and energy costs.
- As a result, the capital costs have increased significantly with the next phase of the programme now estimated to require in excess of £800 million capital funding and £114 million of revenue funding.
- There is no capacity in the health budget for 2024/25 to progress any NTC not yet in construction either from a capital or revenue perspective and further workforce recruitment, design and development work has been paused until funding for the next phase is confirmed.

As the next phase of new NTCs will not add significant additional capacity during this parliamentary term we are re-assessing our approach to planned care.

NATIONAL TREATMENT CENTRE DELAYS (PHASE 2 DELAYS)

Golden Jubilee Phase 2: delayed due to abnormal water samples coming back with indications out with normal scope; action to address the source of the abnormal samples has been undertaken and further testing will progress later this month. This has had an impact on the commissioning programme for the hospital, with first patient treatment now expected in February / March 2024. Officials will update as soon as we have a fuller understanding of the impact which we hope to be in a position to do soon.

Forth Valley: A Key Stage Assurance Review (KSAR) identified a number of issues that require rectification which the Forth Valley Project team have been working on resolving over recent months.

- NTC FV (new ward), originally due to open in Sept 2023, was delayed due to incorrect installation of the 'wrapping' of pipework, and. NHS Assure also highlighted potential risk in relation to fire compliance, primarily relating to smoke containment, which could impact patients in the event of evacuation.
- NHS Forth Valley committed to developing an action plan to address observations raised by NHS Assure, supported by the wider project team. The Board has provided assurance on a number of observations, however work continues to resolve those still outstanding.

Final plans for the opening of the new ward will be confirmed following a risk assessment of options supported by guidance from technical advisors and NHS Assure. Officials will continue to engage with NHS FV weekly to monitor progress.

Patient safety is always top priority and the reason for establishing NHS Scotland Assure was to improve how we manage risk in the healthcare built environment across Scotland.

 In February 2023, we formally notified NHS Boards that they cannot open a new facility without NHS Scotland Assure support.

Forth Valley has resolved many of the issues highlighted within their KSAR and we are working closely with the Board to open the new inpatient ward at the earliest opportunity.

 Patients from other Boards are being treated in the additional two recently commissioned operating theatres at Forth Valley Royal Hospital with the support of the additional staff recruited to the new NTC. This activity has provided access to priority patients on cancer waiting lists and long waiting elective care patients.

- Included in the areas highlighted were concerns with pipework and fire compliance, the Board is committed to address identified issues.
- The NHS Assure process has been established to ensure that new infrastructure meets the required standards and to support Boards hold contractors to account for delivering against the specific requirements set by the NHS.
- NHS Forth Valley has established robust governance arrangements to oversee the project.
- The Board and Scottish Government will continue to work closely with NHS Assure to ensure that outstanding issues are resolved as quickly as possible.

NATIONAL TREATMENT CENTRES

We've opened two National Treatment Centres this year in NHS Fife and NHS Highland, with two further centres opening in the coming months in NHS Forth Valley and the Golden Jubilee Hospital.

- The four National Treatment Centres opening this financial year are planning to deliver over 20,000 additional procedures by 2024/25.
- In 2022/23 the National Eye Centre at Golden Jubilee, and is now treating over 12,000 patients and delivering over 8,700 cataract procedures per annum.
- The new centres will provide eight orthopaedic theatres; an inpatient/day-case ward; three endoscopy rooms and two general theatres.

- NTC-Fife plans include around 500 orthopaedic procedures this year, rising to more than 700 by 2025/2026.
- NTC-Highland has created new capacity for over 1,500 orthopaedic procedures this year for patients in Highland, Tayside and Grampian, including hip and knee replacements and additional future ophthalmology following recruitment of staff.
- Whilst the new ward is being constructed at Forth Valley, the additional theatres already commissioned and opened are delivering a range of additional medical and surgical procedures to Boards across Scotland.

NATIONAL TREATMENT CENTRE - FUTURE

The NHS Recovery Plan 2021-26 committed to the completion of the NTC programme and increased capacity for 40,000 additional procedures to be delivered. Five of the ten planned centres will be opened by the end of 2023/24 and will provide an additional 20,000 procedures per annum by 2025/26.

- The NTC programme was established in 2015 to increase capacity for planned care given the long term forecasts for increased demand. Since 2015, there have been a series of significant events which have impacted on planned care and the NTC programme, including BREXIT, COVID, the war in Ukraine and rising inflation, construction and energy costs.

NATIONAL TREATMENT CENTRE DELAYS (PHASE 2 DELAYS)

 In February 2023, we formally notified NHS Boards that they cannot open a new facility without NHS Scotland Assure support.

Forth Valley has resolved many of the issues highlighted within their KSAR and we are working closely with the Board to open the new inpatient ward at the earliest opportunity.
