An exemption applies

An exemption under section 38(1)(b) of FOISA (personal information) applies to some of the information, documents or parts of documents requested because it is personal data of a third party eg names/contact details of individuals or other information that would create a realistic prospect of identification, and disclosing it would contravene the data protection principles in Article 5(1) of the General Data Protection Regulation and in section 34(1) of the Data Protection Act 2018. This exemption is not subject to the 'public interest test', so we are not required to consider if the public interest in disclosing the information outweighs the public interest in applying the exemption.

An exemption applies, subject to the public interest test

An exemption under section 28(1) of FOISA (relations within the UK) applies to some of the information requested. This exemption applies because disclosure would, or would be likely to, prejudice substantially relations between the Scottish Government and the UK Government. This is because this would entail revealing candid internal discussion about the other administration's policies. It is essential for the effective administration of the UK as a whole that there should be regular, and often private, communications between the Scottish Government, the UK Government and the other devolved administrations. Disclosure of this information will mean that the UK Government is likely to be more reluctant to communicate as frequently and openly with the Scottish Government in future.

This exemption is subject to the 'public interest test'. Therefore, taking account of all the circumstances of this case, we have considered if the public interest in disclosing the information outweighs the public interest in applying the exemption. We have found that, on balance, the public interest lies in favour of upholding the exemption. We recognise that there is a public interest in disclosing information as part of open, transparent and accountable government, and to inform public debate. However, there is a greater public interest in maintaining close working relationships between the Scottish Government and the UK Government, and in protecting the free exchange of information between the administrations to ensure that we keep each other fully and regularly informed about matters of mutual interest. There is no public interest in disclosing information when that will damage relationships and disrupt future communications as that may impact on the effectiveness of future policy development and implementation.

An exemption applies, subject to the public interest test

An exemption under section 31(1) was applied to information regarding the financing for Prevent intervention providers. This section prevents disclosure of information that safeguards national security. The Scottish Government considers the balance of public interest against the national security, and we are not able to disclose details of the documents in this instance.

This exemption is subject to the 'public interest test'. Therefore, taking account of all the circumstances of this case, we have considered if the public interest in disclosing the information outweighs the public interest in applying the exemption. We have found that, on balance, the public interest lies in favour of upholding the exemption. We recognise that there is some public interest in release because of the importance of financial scrutiny of government spending. In relation to the Prevent Strategy, the disclosure of some information about providers could enhance the openness of Government and help the public understand, in greater depth, how the Government is responding to a range of factors that can draw people into terrorism or pull people away from it. It is also in the public interest to be assured that the Government's counter terrorism strategy is robust and appropriate. However, this is outweighed by the public interest in protecting national security. Provision of a breakdown of the details of intervention provider funding could make it possible to identify those involved, thus compromising the effectiveness of prevent. There is a serious terrorist threat to the United Kingdom and disclosing detailed information into the public domain could put national security at risk by jeopardising the positive effects of activities undertaken through the Prevent intervention programme, and therefore of the government's efforts to prevent acts of terrorism and terrorist related crime.
