The Bluetongue (Scotland) Order 2012

DECLARATION OF AREA IN WHICH VOLUNTARY VACCINATION AGAINST BLUETONGUE IS PERMITTED

- 1. This declaration is made under articles 3(1), 4(1) and 24(1) of the Bluetongue (Scotland) Order 2012^a ("the 2012 Order").
- 2. In accordance with article 24(2) of the 2012 Order this declaration is made—
 - (a) based on the result of a specific risk assessment carried out by the Scottish Ministers; and
 - (b) the European Commission having been informed of the decision to make it.
- 3. The Scottish Ministers declare that the whole of Scotland^b is an area in which voluntary vaccination against bluetongue is permitted.
- 4. The permission to vaccinate is limited to vaccination using an inactivated vaccine (that is, a vaccine which is not a live attenuated vaccine).
- 5. Terms used in this declaration have the same meaning as they do for the purposes of the 2012 Order.
- 6. This declaration comes into force at 00:01 hours on 24th September 2012.
