Organisational Processes & Arrangements

Informal and formal sources of support and care
Sustained by the responsive allocation of resources

Engaged, Informed, Empowered Individuals & those that matter to them (Carers)

Health & Care professional team committed to partnership working

Better and earlier *identification* of people with dementia who require PEOLC services

Improved commissioning, planning and delivery of PEOLC services – including for people with dementia - by Integration Joint Boards

Better public discussion and understanding of dementia and a "good death"

Better and earlier *care coordination* of people with dementia who require PEOL services

Workforce better trained to provide PEOL care for people with dementia

Test and implement care models through HIS, including for dementia and Alz Scot's proposed advanced care model

On-going implementation of dementia post-diagnostic support, including planning for future and EOL care

Better recording and sharing of anticipatory care plans and e-care summary

Better evidence on scale and nature of challenge cost-effectiveness of PEOL dementia care models and scale of challenge (e gnational estimated diagnosed incidence report – 28th Nov)

Effective measures and indicators for PEOL dementia care

Guidance on IJB strategic commissioning plans

On-going bespoke work in specialist NHS and acute care settings

Strategic approach on public discussion on "good death", including with dementia

Ongoing implementation of the Promoting Excellence dementia workforce framework to support implementation of dementia standards, including standard on PEOL

Development and implementation of a PEOL care workforce educational framework
