

**Winter 2019/20: homelessness interventions summary table**

Bethany Night Shelter	£35,000	Announced 10 Oct
Flexible emergency funding	£55,000	For Edinburgh, Glasgow and Aberdeen; announced 10 Oct
Vehicle Hire for cold weather emergency use and frontline outreach services to determine the extent of rough sleeping in rural Ayrshire	£10,000	announced 10 Oct
City of Edinburgh Council – link worker	£29,000	Facilitating homelessness assessments to be carried out in dispersed locations; announced 10 Oct
National pet friendly worker	£15,000	To implement the findings of the ‘Paws for Thought’ report; announced at the <i>Paws for Thought</i> report launch on 27 Nov
Supporting people with NRPF: A peer worker model to work with the eastern European men in Edinburgh	£30,000	announced 10 Oct
Supporting people with NRPF: Translate, print and publish basic information about rights and services available in a number of languages.	£5,000	announced 10 Oct
Multi-agency support for people sleeping rough	£140,000	Simon Community proposal to create a multi-agency hub for better all-round support for people sleeping rough in Glasgow.
Outreach contingency fund for Glasgow and Edinburgh	£10,000	Support to Simon Community and Streetwork to allow them to provide additional street outreach support on a contingency basis to manage adverse weather and other emergency conditions. Discussions are underway to consider whether funding should be made available on a similar basis for Aberdeen
Additional funding for the City Mission Glasgow Winter Night Shelter	£25,000	Additional support to allow the night shelter in Glasgow to expand in response to a potential increase in people experiencing street homelessness.
<b>Total</b>	<b>£354,000</b>	<b>This total figure has changed since the first announcement and will change again across the course of the next few months.</b>

We are also in discussions with a provider in Edinburgh about funding a project to combat the social exclusion that people feel as result of their homelessness, and are developing a package of measures to provide support for those likely to be subject to lock change eviction by Serco, within the legislative constraints.
