Diversity in the Teaching Profession Scotland Annual Data Report

Version 1



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1. Introduction

The Teaching in a Diverse Scotland report¹ was published in November 2018. The report was commissioned by the Strategic Board for Teacher Education (SBTE) following the publication of the National Race Equality Framework for Scotland². This report was written by a working group chaired by Professor Rowena Arshad CBE with the aim to increase the number of teachers from under-represented groups at all levels in Scottish schools. The working group was expanded and reconvened, with Professor Arshad as chair, from June 2019 to March 2021 to support the implementation of the recommendations made in the report.

At the time of the original report's publication, 1.4% of the teaching workforce came from a minority ethnic background. The Scottish Government supported the recommendations of the report which set the ambitious aim that by 2030 the number of minority ethnic teachers in Scotland's schools should be at least 4%³, which is at a par with the Scottish minority ethnic population as per the 2011 census (Table 5.5).

To achieve the target of at least 4% of minority ethnic teachers in Scotland's schools by 2030, would mean we need to recruit approximately an additional 200 minority ethnic teachers into the workforce every year from August 2022 to August 2030 inclusive. These teachers would be in addition to the number of minority ethnic teachers currently being recruited annually⁴. The figures discussed in the opening section of this paper will need to be reviewed with the publication of the 2022 census.

At the conclusion of the Diversity in the Teaching Profession working group in March 2021, Professor Arshad published a report setting out the progress achieved to date and the actions still to be progressed⁵. In this report, Professor Arshad stressed the importance of gathering and sharing data relating to the diversity of the teaching profession in order to inform and evaluate future work. This new annual publication

aims to do just that, by bringing together available data relating to the diversity of the teaching profession in Scotland.

In this first iteration of the publication, two data sets are included. In section 4, a series of data tables are included relating to the ethnicity of entrants to, and qualifiers from, Initial Teacher Education (ITE) programmes in Scottish Universities. These tables have been drawn from the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA) student data.

In section 5, a series of data tables are included relating the ethnicity of teachers working in schools in Scottish local authorities which have been drawn from the annual Teacher Census⁶. The ethnicity of Scotland's population by local authority is also included in this section.

Future iterations of this report will include additional data sets relating to the ethnicity of the education workforce in Scotland. For example, stakeholders have suggested that it would be helpful to include data relating to the ethnicity of applicants to ITE programmes, supply teachers, teachers in temporary contracts and teachers who successfully complete their probation year.

2. Summary

2.1 Teacher Census

Minority ethnic teachers are significantly underrepresented in Scotland's schools. At the time of the publication of the Teaching in a Diverse Scotland report, the number of teachers from ethnic minority backgrounds across the whole profession was 672 or 1.4% of the workforce, where this information had been disclosed⁷. In 2018 the average percentage of teachers from ethnic minority backgrounds in the primary sector was 1.1% and in the secondary sector was 1.8%, whereas the number of teachers from ethnic minority backgrounds in the special sector was 35 or 1.9% of the workforce. Less than 1% of teachers who were employed in promoted posts were from an ethnic minority background.

By 2020, the number of teachers from ethnic minority backgrounds across the whole profession had increased to 907 or 1.7% of the workforce⁶. The proportion of teachers in the primary sector from ethnic minority backgrounds was 1.3% whereas the proportion for the secondary sector was 2.1%. The number of teachers from ethnic minority backgrounds working in the special sector was 34 in 2020, or 1.8% of the workforce. The percentage of teachers from ethnic minority backgrounds who were employed in promoted posts in 2020 remains under 1%.

2.2 Initial Teacher Education

This progress report also includes data relating to entrants to, and qualifiers from, Initial Teacher Education (ITE) programmes in Scotland. In 2017/18 the number of UK domiciled entrants from ethnic minority backgrounds, where this information was disclosed, was 110 or 3%. 85 teachers, or 3%, from ethnic minority backgrounds qualified from ITE programmes in Scotland in that same year.

In 2019/20 155 entrants onto ITE programmes in Scotland were from an ethnic minority background, which is 4% of the total entrants. In the same year 110 qualifiers from ITE programmes were from an ethnic minority background, which is 3% of the total qualifiers that year.

From 2016/17 to 2019/20, a higher proportion of entrants to ITE programmes in Scotland from an ethnic minority background were in the secondary sector when compared to primary. In 2019/20 5% of entrants to secondary ITE programmes were from an ethnic minority background whereas the equivalent figure for primary was 4%. This proportion by sector is also reflected in teachers from ethnic minority backgrounds qualifying from ITE programmes in each year from 2016/17 to 2019/20.

It is worth noting that for all of the data included in this report that there is a significant number of teachers who have not disclosed their ethnicity to their ITE provider or employer. The quality of the data included in this report would be greatly enhanced with an increased rate of ethnicity disclosure.

3. Next Steps

The Scottish Government is committed to continuing to support efforts to diversify Scotland's teaching profession as reflected in the most recent Programme for Government⁸ commitment. As part of this work, Scottish Government will address the under representation of minority ethnic teachers in Scotland by exploring supportive pathways into teaching for minority ethnic and other underrepresented groups. This commits Scottish Government to ensuring that the diversity of Scottish society is recognised and represented in the education workforce, at all levels, in line with the ambitions of the Race Equality Framework.

Increasing the diversity of the teaching profession has also been identified as one of the key workstreams of a new programme of Race Equality in Education work. Professor Arshad's report and associated working group have helped create the conditions for change and our commitment to the continuation of these ambitions, as part of the new programme, will result in increased numbers of minority ethnic teachers, at all levels in Scotland's schools.

The data contained in this report will be used to inform the actions taken to meet these commitments and future reports will be used to evaluate progress towards achieving change.

6. Data suppression

Data points which are less than five are suppressed in the data sets included in this report as personal data revealing racial or ethnic origin is categorised as a special category of data in General Data Protection Regulation.

The Scottish Government use appropriate statistical disclosure control methods to ensure any statistics produced does not reveal the identity of an individual or organisation, or any private information relating to them. In order to follow General Data Protection Regulation and Government Statistical Service guidance any cell less than 5 has been suppressed.

Different methodologies are used in the two data sets to address data points which are less than five. This is due to the data being based on secondary analysis of previously published data.

Percentage tables for the HESA HEI data were not able to be included due to the rounding methodology applied to calculating percentages which would result in the suppression of some institutions.
