

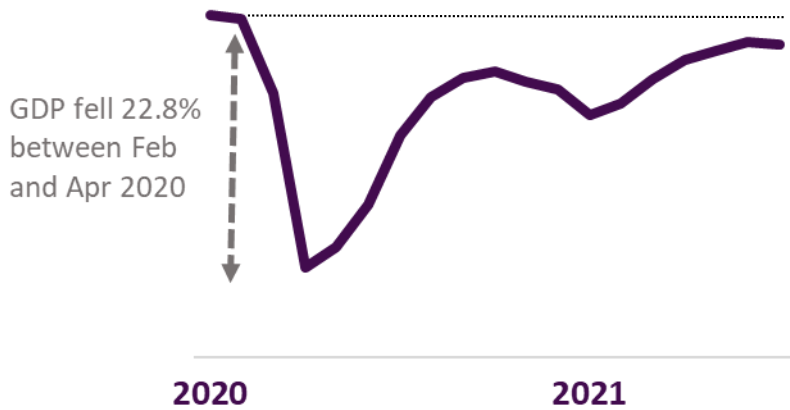
## Monthly GDP

In July, Scotland's onshore GDP fell by 0.2% in real terms, as continued growth in services output was offset by falls in manufacturing and utilities.

Output remains 2.4% below the pre-pandemic level in February 2020.

Note: Monthly GDP is experimental (not national) statistics

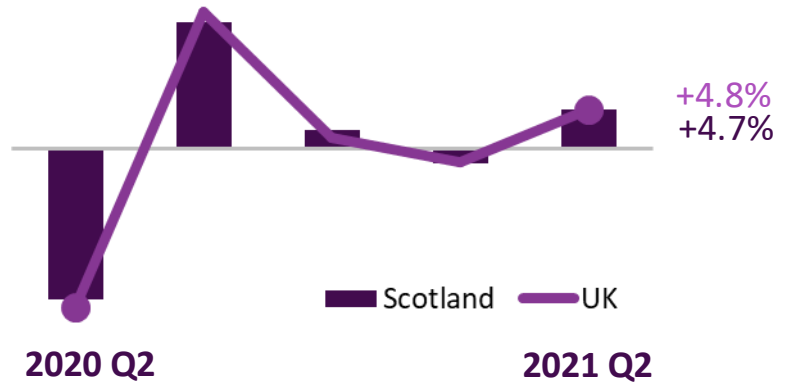
## Quarterly GDP

In 2021 Quarter 2 (Apr-Jun), Scotland's onshore GDP is estimated to have grown by 4.7% after lockdown restrictions were eased.

GDP for the UK as a whole grew by 4.8% during the same period.

Change in GDP compared to the previous quarter



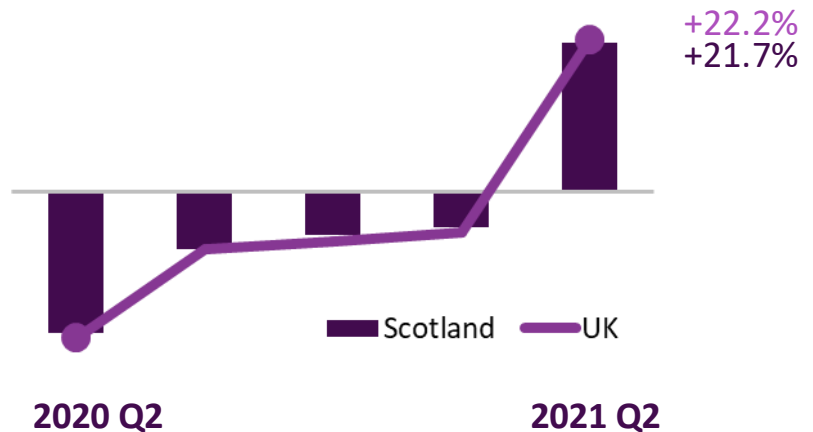
## GDP over the year

Compared to 2020 Q2, when output was at its lowest level during the COVID-19 pandemic, Scotland's onshore GDP has increased by 21.7%.

GDP for the UK as a whole increased by 22.2% over the year.

## Change in GDP compared to the previous year



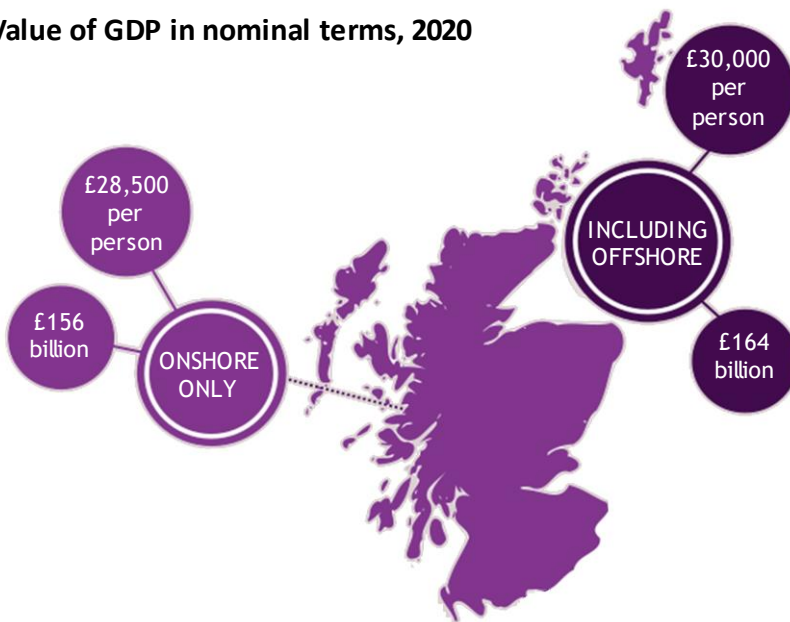
## Annual GDP Growth

In 2020, Scotland’s annual onshore GDP fell by 9.6% in real terms, as the economy was severely disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Annual GDP for the UK as a whole fell by 9.8%.

## Annual GDP Value

In 2020, Scotland’s onshore GDP is estimated at £156 billion in total, or around £28,500 per person. Including offshore oil and gas, Scottish GDP is estimated at £164 billion, or £30,000 per person.

In 2020, nominal GDP for the UK as a whole is estimated at £31,400 per person.
