

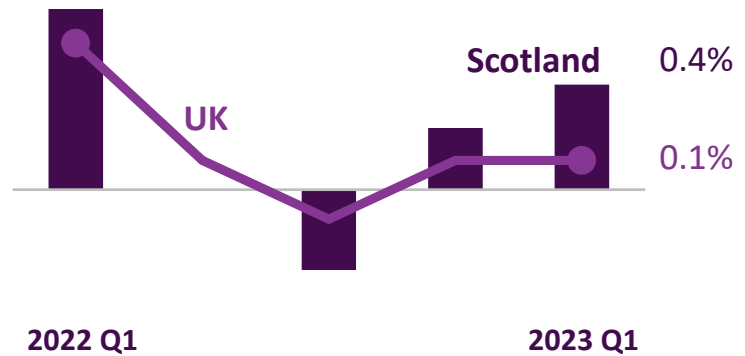


**GDP grew 0.4% in the first quarter of 2023**

Gross Domestic Product grew by 0.4% during January to March.

During this period UK GDP increased by 0.1%.

Change in GDP compared to last quarter

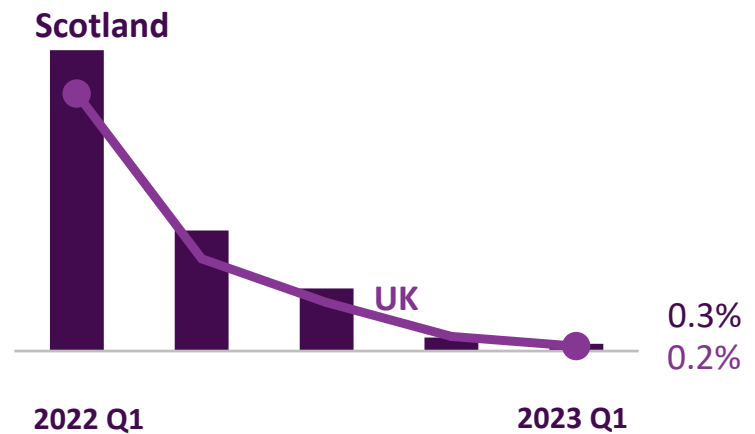


**Scottish GDP rose by 0.3% over the year**

Compared to the same time last year (2022 Q1), Scottish GDP has increased 0.3%.

Equivalent UK change over the year was 0.2%.

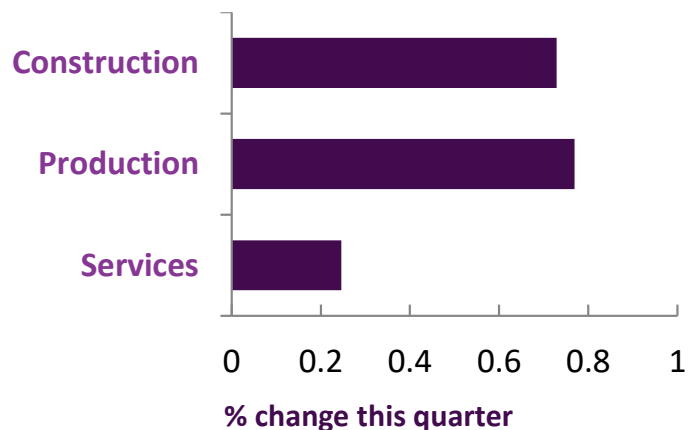
Change in GDP compared to the same quarter last year



**Weak quarter for Construction and Production**

In 2023 Q1, output in the Construction sector increased by 0.7%, output in the Production sector increased by 0.8% and Services sector output increased by 0.2%.

## GDP grew 4.9% in 2022

Between 2022 and 2023 (taking all four quarters of each year), Scottish GDP increased by 4.9%.

Equivalent UK change in 2022 was 4.1%.
