As at 1st November 2020:

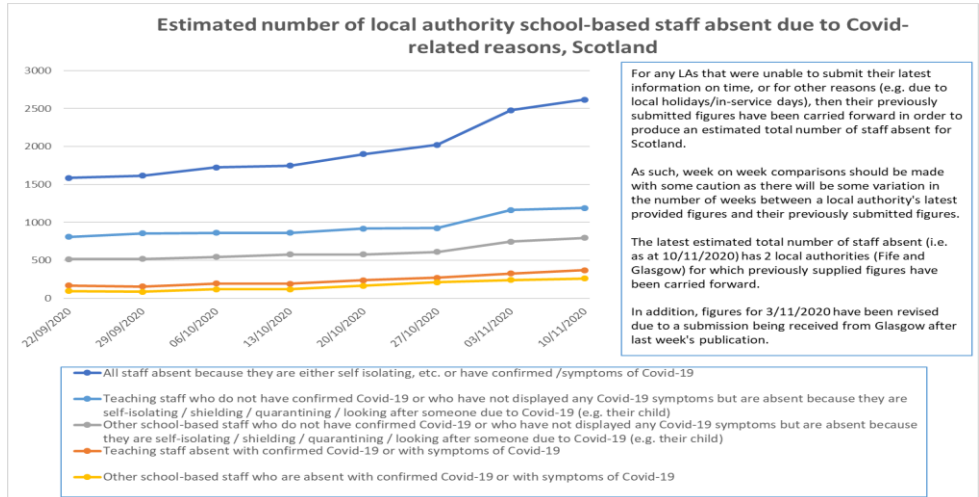
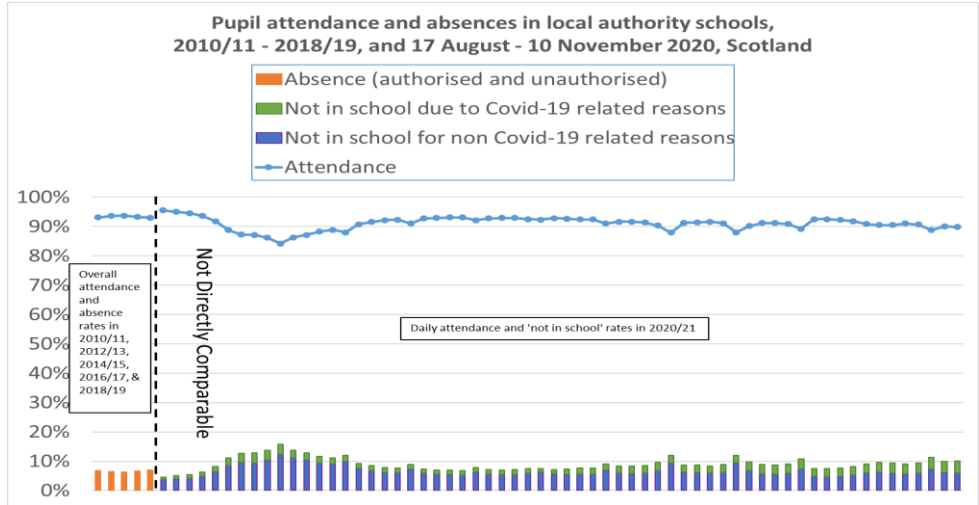
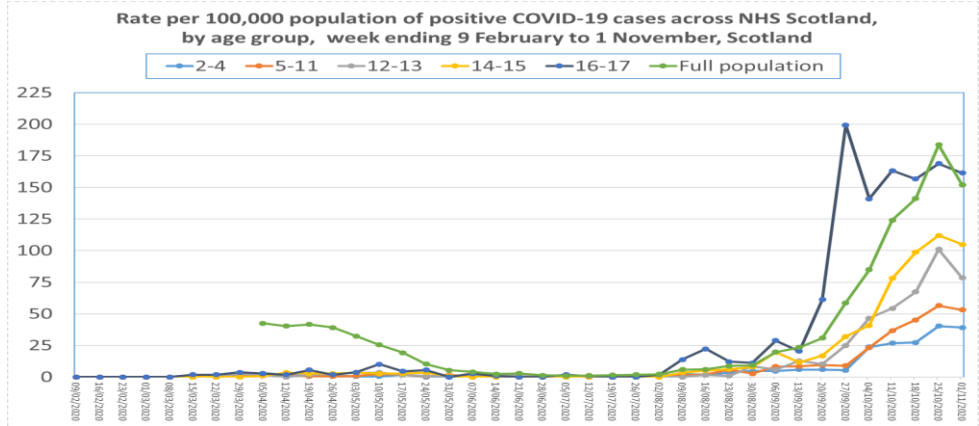
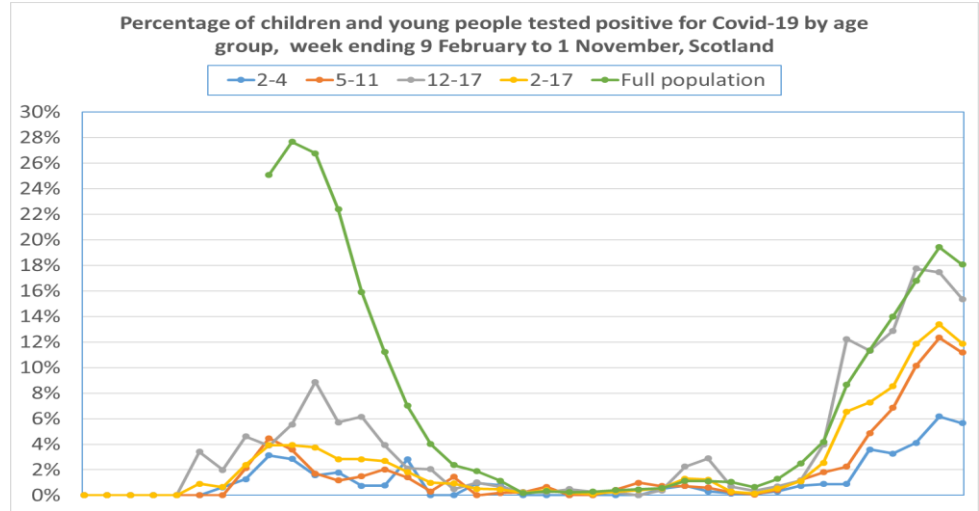
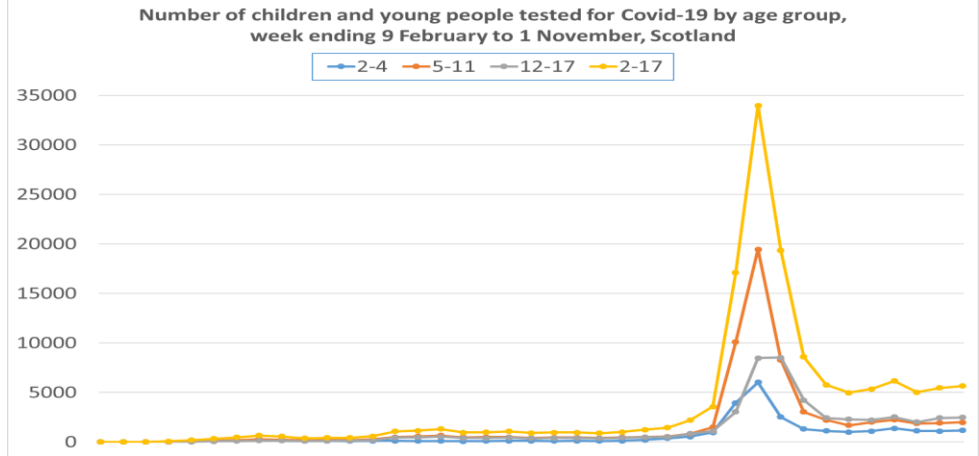
- There have been 3,975 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.

In the week ending 1st November 2020:

- There were 673 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who tested positive for COVID-19, among the 5,664 children and young people who were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 39.2 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 53.2 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds, 78.5 per 100,000 12-13 year olds, 104.9 per 100,000 14-15 year olds and 161.5 cases per 100,000 16-17 year olds. The rate of cases per 100,000 of the general population was 152.1.

On 10th November:

- Attendance in local authority schools was 89.8%, whilst the percentages of openings recorded as pupils not in school (non Covid-19 reasons) was 6.0%, and for not in school (Covid-19 related reasons) was 4.2%.
- 29,486 pupils were not in school either all or part of the day because of Covid-19 related reasons.
- 2,615 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 1,559 were teaching staff and 1,056 were other school-based staff.

- 60,044 children were attending a childcare setting and 2,162 had a Covid-19 related absence. Note the response rate was very low this week (32%).
- 704 (3.8%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 49% response rate].
