

# Covid-19 Education Recovery Group - Infographic

As at 8th November 2020:

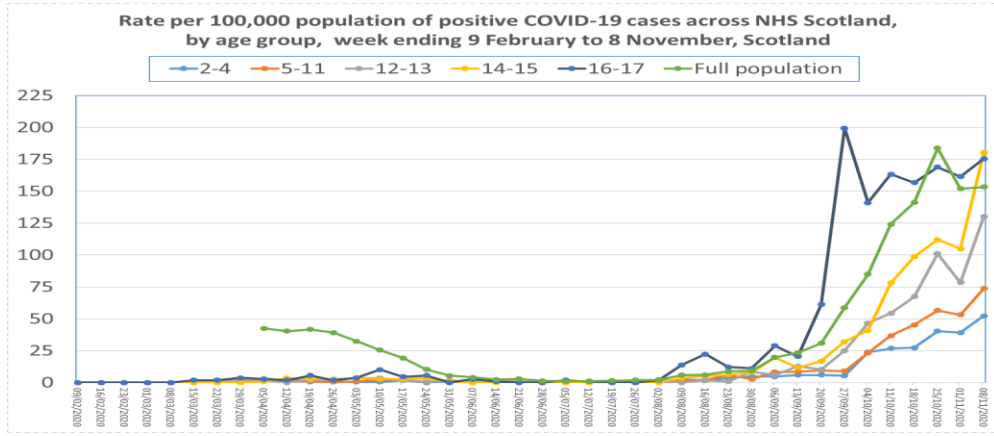
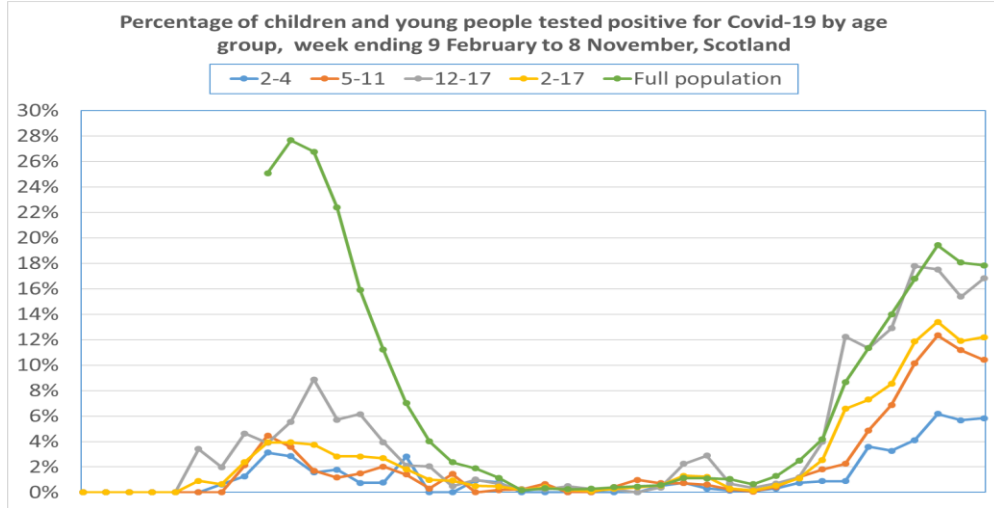
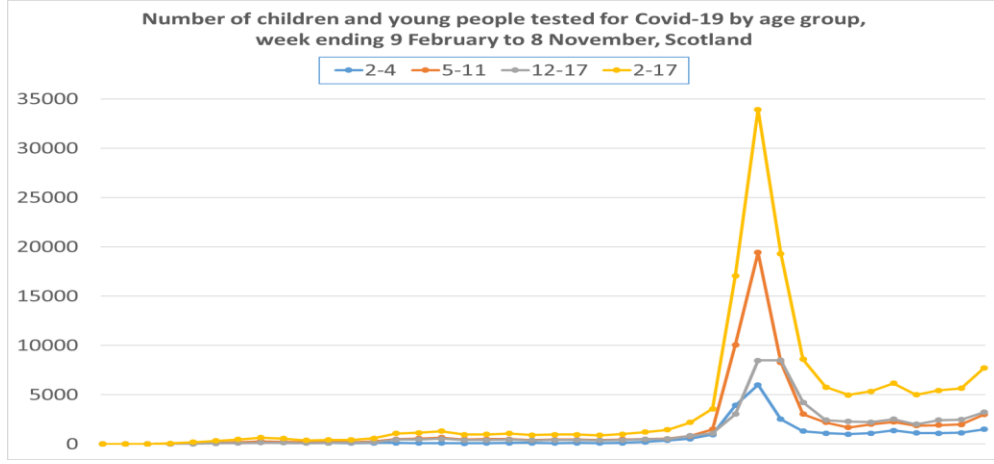
- There have been 4,917 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.

In the week ending 8th November 2020:

- There were 942 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who tested positive for COVID-19, among the 7,723 children and young people who were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 52.3 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 73.8 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds, 130.3 per 100,000 12-13 year olds, 180.4 per 100,000 14-15 year olds and 175.4 cases per 100,000 16-17 year olds. The rate of cases per 100,000 of the general population was 153.4.

On 17<sup>th</sup> November:

- Attendance in local authority schools was 89.2%, whilst the percentages of openings recorded as pupils not in school (non Covid-19 reasons) was 6.5%, and for not in school (Covid-19 related reasons) was 4.4%.
- 30,824 pupils were not in school either all or part of the day because of Covid-19 related reasons.
- 2,645 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 1,615 were teaching staff and 1,030 were other school-based staff.

- 78,338 children were attending a childcare setting and 2,459 had a Covid-19 related absence.
- 817 (3.9%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 54% response rate].
