## **Covid-19 Education Recovery Group - Infographic**

#### As at 21 March 2021:

 There have been 18,732 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.

In the week ending 21 March 2021:

- There were 813 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who tested positive for COVID-19, among the 6,026 children and young people who were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 96.3 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 100.4 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds, 59.5 per 100,000 12-13 year olds, 55.1 per 100,000 14-15 year olds and 90.0 cases per 100,000 16-17 year olds. The rate of cases per 100,000 of the general population was 72.8.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> March:

### **Primary Schools:**


- Attendance in Primary schools was 94.0%.
- Absences (authorised and unauthorised) because of non Covid-19 related reasons were reported at 4.0%.
- 7,779 pupils were not in school either all or part of the day because of Covid-19 related reasons.
- The percentage of school openings (i.e. half days) that showed pupils were not in school because of Covid-19 related reasons was 2.0%.


### **Secondary Schools:**


 The percentage of Secondary (S1-S6) pupils physically in school in the morning was 26.8%. In the afternoon this figure was 24.1%.


### **Special Schools:**


 In Special schools, the percentage of pupils physically in school was 72.7%.











# **Covid-19 Education Recovery Group - Infographic**

 From Monday 15 March all children in Primary school were to return to school, with all Secondary pupils returning parttime from this date.

### On 23rd March:

- 2,117 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 1,102 were teaching staff and 1,015 were other schoolbased staff.
- 73,350 children were attending a childcare setting and 1,735 had a Covid-19 related absence. Note that not all open settings completed the survey and that these figures are an underestimate of the actual number of open settings and children attending.
- This week, 900 (4.4%)
   childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 53% response rate].
