As at 15th November 2020:






- There have been 5,777 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.

In the week ending 15th November 2020:

- There were 860 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who tested positive for COVID-19, among the 8,361 children and young people who were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 32.7 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 69.1 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds, 137.2 per 100,000 12-13 year olds, 164.4 per 100,000 14-15 year olds and 157.8 cases per 100,000 16-17 year olds. The rate of cases per 100,000 of the general population was 143.7.

On 24th November:

- Attendance in local authority schools was 89.9%, whilst the percentages of openings recorded as pupils not in school (non Covid-19 reasons) was 6.3%, and for not in school (Covid-19 related reasons) was 3.8%.
- 26,940 pupils were not in school either all or part of the day because of Covid-19 related reasons.
- 2,527 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 1,502 were teaching staff and 1,025 were other school-based staff.

- 80,604 children were attending a childcare setting and 2,312 had a Covid-19 related absence.
- 765 (3.7%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 54% response rate].
