As at 18th October 2020:





- There have been 2,566 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who have tested positive for COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak.

In the week ending 18th October 2020:

- There were 593 children and young people aged 2-17 years in Scotland who tested positive for COVID-19, among the 5,036 children and young people who were tested.
- The identified COVID-19 positive cases reflected a rate of 27.3 cases per 100,000 2-4 year olds, 45.3 cases per 100,000 5-11 year olds, 67.3 per 100,000 12-13 year olds, 98.7 per 100,000 14-15 year olds and 155.0 cases per 100,000 16-17 year olds. The rate of cases per 100,000 of the general population was 141.3.

On 27th October:

- Attendance in local authority schools was 92.7%, whilst the percentages of openings recorded as pupils not in school (non Covid-19 reasons) was 4.8%, and for not in school (Covid-19 related reasons) was 2.5%.
- 17,735 pupils were not in school either all or part of the day because of Covid-19 related reasons. Note that two local authorities had an in-service day on this day.
- 2,021 staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons, of which, 1,197 were teaching staff and 824 were other school-based staff.

- 77,617 children were attending a childcare setting and 1,840 had a Covid-19 related absence.
- 718 (3.8%) childcare staff were absent due to Covid-19 related reasons [based on a 50% response rate].
